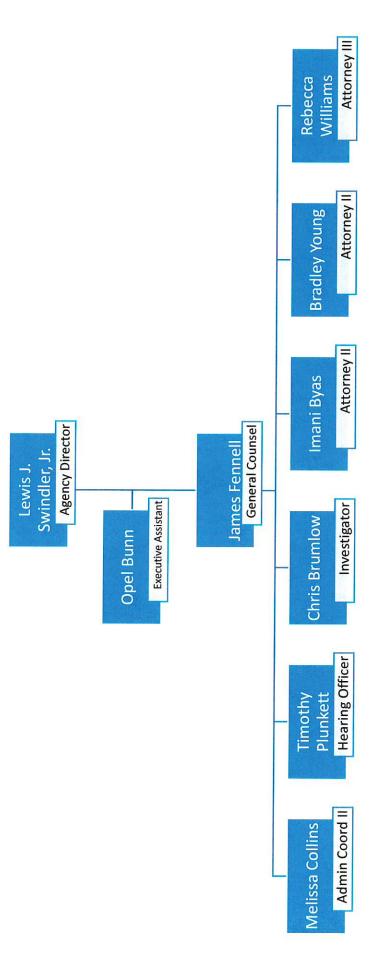

Budget Summary

Priority 1 – Criminal Justice Instructor Step Increase \$70,825.08

This request is for recurring general fund dollars to fund step increases for eligible law enforcement officers employed at SCCJA. During the prior fiscal year a step plan for law enforcement officers was established. This request is the cost to provide the salary increases outlined in that step plan to those who are eligible in fiscal year 2024.

Salary: \$50,953.29 + Fringe (39%) \$19,781.78 = \$70,825.08

Priority 2 – Recurring Other Funds Increase \$735,695.89

This request is for a recurring increase in other fund budget to match agency other fund cash. This increase will cover the statewide pay plan increase for our other funded employees (\$224,472.36), a pay increase for our facilities department (\$63,103.93), yearly maintenance for priority 3 (\$1,500), and increased cost of goods and services and preventative maintenance needs (\$400,000).

Priority 3 – Security Camera System Installation \$620,519.34

This is a non-recurring general fund request to pay for the installation of a modern camera system. SCCJA's current camera system covers less than 40% of our campus, has no encryption, and no ability to monitor or alert in real time. The new system will have modern encryption, high resolution, and night vision capability as well as real time monitoring and alerts for movement in restricted areas or during restricted times. The ongoing maintenance contract is \$1,500 and is covered under our priority two ask.

Proviso Request – 64.new Academy Store Revenue

The SCCJA requests a new proviso to permit us to retain and carryforward profits earned in our store. The store sells agency branded items and supplies for students. We currently sell at cost but sales volume has increased enough to justify making a small profit. Revenues will be used to fund agency operations and are not expected to exceed \$200-\$400 a week.

The Problem:

High numbers of law enforcement officers have left the profession and few new members are joining creating a highly competitive hiring environment. Recruiting and retaining high quality instructors to train the next generation of officers is becoming increasingly difficult.

The Solution:

The SCCJA has established a step plan based on what was included in the FY2023-24 Law Enforcement Pay Plan. This request is to fund step increases for the instructors who are eligible for the next step in the plan in FY2024-25.

Salary: \$50,953.29 + Fringe (39%) \$19,781.78 = \$70,825.08

Impact if not funded:

SCCJA will become increasingly uncompetitive an will have a harder time retaining and recruiting experienced Criminal Justice Instructors reducing the quality of training we can provide.

Statewide Pay Plan Increase: \$224,472.36 for the statewide pay plan for our other funded employees. This includes \$166,275.82 in salary and \$58,196.50 in fringe.

Facilities Pay Increase: \$63,103.93 to increase facilities personnel salary to state average for employees with 3 or more years, halfway to the state average for employees with 2-3 years of service, and 2% for those with less than two years of service. \$46,743.65 for the salary increase and \$16,360.28 for fringe.

Increased cost of goods and services and preventative maintenance: \$400,000 The SCCJA has seen an average of a 10% increase in the cost of many of the goods and services we routinely purchase and need to increase our other funds budget to match. We also have a large number of small preventative maintenance projects to be performed and need an increase in authorization to cover these expenses.

Camera Maintenance: \$1,500 yearly cost to maintain new security camera system.

Police Radios: \$64,619.60 to purchase radios for SCCJA employees to use when working in the field assisting other law enforcement agencies.

The Problem:

Our current surveillance system covers less than 40% of our campus and does not allow for real time monitoring and alerts. The SCCJA campus does not allow for full fencing and repeated security breaches have posed a substantial risk to the security and safety of our students and staff. We have a contract with a private nighttime security company however, they cannot be everywhere at once.

The Solution:

JUSTIFICATION OF REQUEST

We propose the installation of an enhanced surveillance system with strong encryption, higher image resolutions, license plate recognition, person recognition, image enhancements, zoom capabilities, and night vision capability. This new system will have remote monitoring and alerts for movement in areas that should be empty at certain times, for example at night.

Impact if not funded:

The SCCJA will continue to contract with private night security and will do our best to self fund an expansion of our existing system that will hopefully allow us to identify trespassers/vandals after the fact if we can get high enough resolution on the cameras. However, without this security camera upgrade we will not be able to have the alert function which allows for real time response to security and safety issues.

The South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy operates a store that sells agency branded clothing and promotional items and a small number of items for use in the field. The SCCJA has always sold items at cost. Store sales are increasing in volume and are at a tipping point where to continue to meet the needs of our customers we will need to charge more than cost to justify the time and resource investment. Revenue will be used to back fill lost fines and fees revenue to fund agency operations.

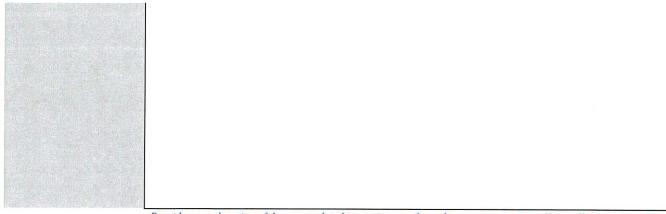
At the SCCJA we are committed to being good stewards of tax payer dollars and do our best to spend the funding we have been entrusted with responsibly. It is our policy that, where possible, state and military surplus are our first stops for any supply needs. The SCCJA stared a new training course on investigating child fatalities and instead of purchasing expensive forensics dolls and new furnishings we purchased items from surplus that perform the job just as well at a fraction of the cost. In FY2023 SCCJA staff moved several paper heavy processes to a single access submission platform, which eliminated the use of paper and reduced the number of computer programs the SCCJA must license.

Accountability Report Summary

The South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy (SCCJA) provides mandated and advanced training with continuous certifications for all state and local law enforcement officers. During fiscal year 2023 the SCCJA has worked to overcome COVID-19 induced backlogs and delays, fully implement the PACT ACT, and to further establish the SCCJA as a source of support and knowledge to the greater law enforcement community.

The SCCJA continued to follow established COVID-19 protocols and successfully returned to full in-person training over the past year. Providing quality training while maintaining the safety and security of the campus, staff, and students remains the highest priority.

To enforce the provisions of H. 3050 (the PACT ACT), the SCCJA created a compliance unit consisting of two evaluators. These evaluators will visit each non-accredited agency to ensure they have the minimum nine polices as required by H.3050 and are following these policies. These nine polices are: use of force; vehicle pursuits; duty to intervene; hiring and termination practices; post academy field training; body worn cameras; no knock warrants; internal affairs; and an early warning system. The evaluators were hired in January 2023 and as of August 1, 2023, they have evaluated 130 agencies and brought them into compliance. Additionally, because of H.3050 and the compliance unit, thirty agencies have signed an MOU to begin the process of national or state accreditation.

The SCCJA is continually recognized nationally by the awarding of another Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) reaccreditation in November 2022. CALEA recognizes agencies that can maintain and demonstrate professional operational standards throughout the year.

The SCCJA implemented several new functions to create a better learning environment while also improving housing and living standards. We have established new partnerships and reinvested in old ones to assist with safety, security, and overall function for benefits to the campus, staff, and students.

In 2024 the SCCJA will continue to search for ways to provide high quality instruction to law enforcement in the State of South Carolina.

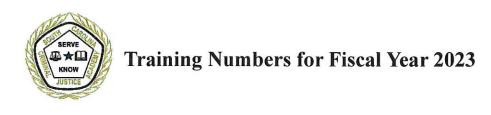
Carryforward
