

PART III

TO AMEND ACT 1377 OF 1968, AS AMENDED, RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF STATE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS, SO AS TO AUTHORIZE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS AND CONFORM THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL INDEBTEDNESS AMOUNT TO THE ADDITIONAL AMOUNTS AUTHORIZED HEREBY, AND TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 2-7-105 OF THE 1976 CODE DO NOT APPLY TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS PART.

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B. Section 4 of Act 1377 of 1968, as last amended by Act 1 of 2001, is further amended to read:

“Section 4. The aggregate principal indebtedness on account of bonds issued pursuant to this act may not exceed \$2,583,904,475 \$3,081,062,775. The limitation imposed by the provisions of the section does not apply to bonds issued on behalf of the Mental Health Commission as provided in Acts 1276 and 1272 of 1970 or to bonds issued on behalf of the Commission on Mental Retardation as provided in Act 1087 of 1970 or to bonds issued on behalf of the South Carolina Fire Academy. The limitation

1 imposed by the provisions of this section is not considered to be an obligation of the contract made between the State and holders of
2 bonds issued pursuant to this act, and the limitation imposed by the provisions of this section may be enlarged by acts amending it
3 or reduced by the application of the Capital Reserve Fund or by amendments of this act. Within these limitations state capital
4 improvement bonds may be issued under the conditions prescribed by this act.”

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6 C. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the provisions of Section 2-7-105 of the 1976 Code do not apply to the provisions
7 of this part.

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9 D. No funds for the projects authorized in Subsection (A) shall be released until January 1, 2016.

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END PART III

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All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with any of the provisions of Part IA, Part IB, or Part III of this act are suspended for Fiscal Year 2015-16.

All Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent with any of the provisions of Part II of this Act are hereby repealed.

If any part, section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this act is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such holding shall not affect the constitutionality or validity of the remaining portions of this act, the General Assembly hereby declaring that it would have passed this act, and each and every part, section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, and word thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more other parts, sections, subsections, paragraphs, subparagraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, or words hereof may be declared to be unconstitutional, invalid, or otherwise ineffective.

Except as otherwise specifically provided, this act takes effect July 1, 2015.

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
