Representative **WHITMIRE** proposes the following amendment:

Amend

1A.24 (SDE-EIA: Students at Risk of School Failure) For the current fiscal year, EIA funds appropriated for students at academic risk of school failure, must be allocated to school districts based on the number of weighted pupil units in the district. two factors: (1) poverty as determined for the poverty add on weight in Proviso 1.3; and (2) the number of weighted pupil units identified in the prior fiscal year as in need of academic assistance. At least eighty-five percent of the funds allocated for students classified as at academic risk must be spent on instruction and instructional support for these students at academic risk who generated the funds. Instructional support may include family literacy and parenting programs to students at-risk for school failure and their families, and five percent of the funds must be spent on formative assessments for students in kindergarten through grade 9. Students at academic risk are defined as students who score not met are not meeting grade level standards in English language arts/reading and mathematics as evidenced by summative state assessments in on grades three through eight in reading and mathematics state assessments or students who on are not track to meeting or exceeding English language arts/reading or mathematics standards by the end of third grade. Public charter schools, the Palmetto Unified School District, and the Department of Juvenile Justice must also receive a proportionate per pupil allocation based on the number of students at academic risk of school failure served.
