Given that a substantial portion of my practice involves civil litigation, I have appeared before the Master and Circuit Court on a regular basis since being admitted to practice in 1999. Prior to the current Covid-19 pandemic, I would generally expect to appear before the Master or Circuit Court in some capacity monthly. The following is a brief description of the issues involved in some of the more recent matters I handled before the Master-in-Equity:

- An action seeking declaratory relief related to an easement for ingress and egress across property. The primary issues were related to ambiguities in the public records as to the respective property owner's rights.
- (2) Multiple Supplemental Proceedings related to judgments obtained by or against my clients.
- (3) An action involving the interpretation and enforcement of a conservation easement and potential damages arising from the alleged violation of said conservation easement.
- (4) An action seeking a declaratory judgment, equitable lien, constructive trust, accounting, and foreclosure arising from allegations that defendants erroneously received funds from plaintiff and failed to return said funds.
- (5) Multiple hearing related to approval of wrongful death settlements.

- 15. List five of the most significant litigated matters you have personally handled in either trial or appellate court, or before a state or federal agency. Give citations if the cases were reported and describe why these matters were significant.
  - (a) I represented an elderly woman in a breach of contract action involving a loan she made to the son of one of her friends. The case was tried in the Anderson County Circuit Court. The jury returned a verdict in favor of my client. While many might see this a relatively minor matter, it will always be significant to me because I fondly remember how grateful my client was to have had her day in court and it was my first jury trial before the Circuit Court.
  - (b) I represented a landlord in a dispute with a tenant over a space that had been utilized as a restaurant. My client commenced an ejectment proceeding in the Spartanburg County Magistrate's Court. On or about the same day, the tenant filed an action the Spartanburg County Court of Common Pleas alleging breach of contract and constructive eviction. Subsequently, the tenant agreed that it had vacated the premises while reserving the pending claims for constructive eviction and breach of contract. After unsuccessful settlement attempts, the case when to trial before the Circuit Court on the parties' competing claims. The jury returned a verdict in favor of my client and entered judgment against the defendant. A subsequent action was brought against the guarantors following the entry of the judgment against the tenant and a supplemental proceeding before the Master-in-Equity was required to enforce the judgment against one of the guarantors. In the initial case against the tenant, I felt that I was able to connect with the jury and assess how best to present my client's case.

- (c) The next matter is one that I won at the trial but ultimately lost on appeal. My client was an engineering firm that had provided services to an entity that was looking to develop a relatively small subdivision in Spartanburg County. The case had originally been filed by another attorney and I inherited the file when he left our firm. When I took over the case, some discovery had been conducted and an Amended Complaint, asserting equitable claims, had been served. In response to the Amended Complaint, the Defendant asserted a counterclaim for breach of contract against my client. The parties filed cross summary judgment motions. The trial court granted partial summary judgment to my client and the denial of the Defendant's motion for summary judgment. The Defendant appealed the trial court's ruling on the summary judgment motions. The Court of Appeals affirmed the trial court's order. See The Nutt Corporation, d/b/a TNC Engineering, v. Howell Road, LLC, Op. No. 2008-UP-195 (S.C. Ct.App. filed March 20, 2008). A subsequent bench trial resulted in an order awarding an equitable lien in favor of my client. After post-trial motions, the Defendant filed its notice of appeal. The appeal resulted in the reversal of the trial court's decision. See Nutt Corp. v. Howell Rd., LLC, 396 S.C. 323, 721 S.E.2d 447 (Ct.App. 2011). This case provided me with my first opportunity to represent a party on appeal and to argue twice before the Court of Appeals. It is further significant in that it resulted in a published opinion related to the issues related to contractual claims and equitable remedies.
- (d) I handled an appeal related to claims against the Charleston County Delinquent Tax Collector. The action, which was initially filed and handled by another attorney in my firm, alleged violations of South Carolina Code sections 12-51-40 and 12-51-120 (2014), and sought reimbursement of the interest it was required to pay to redeem property sold at a tax sale. I became involved after the Circuit Court granted summary judgment against my client. I was actively involved in finalizing our brief and appeared for the oral argument. The Court of Appeals ruled in favor of my client and reversed the Circuit Court's order. See Hallenbeck Sisters, LLC v. Hall, Op. No. 2015-UP-454 (S.C. Ct.App. filed September 9, 2015). This matter was significant in that it resulted in a favorable outcome for my client, offered me another opportunity to appear before the Court of Appeals, and helped me gain a better understanding of the statutes related to tax sales.
- (e) Shortly after I joined Johnson Smith, I assisted with a medical malpractice case filed in York County. Following an unsuccessful mediation, the case went to trial. The jury returned a verdict against our client. This was the first medical malpractice case I was involved with on the plaintiff's side and it highlighted the significance of a good expert witness.
