While the answer originally given, "No", was correct at that time, subsequent events require me to revise the response as follows:

At the invitation of the South Carolina Association for Justice I, along with my spouse, attended their Annual Convention at Hilton Head August 5-7, 2021. SCAJ provided a hotel room for which it paid \$625.05, including tax. The value of my complementary convention registration was \$160.00. These amounts were documented by letter form SCAJ dated August 30, 2021.

A few days before the motion to dismiss was to be heard, the plaintiff filed a dismissal of the case, which ended the matter.

(b) One of the few drawbacks to serving as a judge is that on occasion a disgruntled litigant decides to lash out at those he feels are aligned against him. I experienced that for the first time a couple of months ago when a pro se defendant in a foreclosure case which had been referred to me for disposition filed an action naming me and the foreclosure plaintiff's attorney as defendants. The gist of his allegations against me is that since I failed to rule as he desired in the foreclosure matter I became civilly liable to him. Through Anderson County I obtained representation by James Jolly of Logan & Jolly who has filed a motion to dismiss based on failure to state a cause of action and judicial immunity. That motion has not yet been heard. The case is Civil Action No. 2021 CP 04 00815. Update: A few days before the motion to dismiss was to be heard, the plaintiff filed a dismissal of the case, which ended the matter.
