I was named as a party in a civil proceeding for injunctive relief brought by residents of the Town of Atlantic Beach related the 2008 mayoral election for the Town of Atlantic Beach. I was named as a party in my capacity as the attorney for the Town of Atlantic Beach Election Commission.

The petition for injunctive relief was filed in the original jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of South Carolina, captioned <u>Patricia Bellamy and Nicole Kenion</u>, <u>Petitioners v. Charlene Taylor</u>, <u>Charles Williams</u>, <u>Irene Armstrong</u>, <u>Attorney Amanda A. Bailey</u>, <u>Sandy Martin</u>, <u>Horry County Election Commission</u>, <u>Gary Baum</u>, <u>South Carolina Election Commission</u>, <u>Respondents</u>, 2008-110386 (S.C. Sup. Ct. Dec. 12, 2008).

The case was resolved when the Supreme Court issued an order dated December 15, 2008 ordering only candidates Irene Armstrong and Retha Pierce appear on the ballot for the next Town of Atlantic Beach mayoral election.
