  It is not appropriate, no. It may happen but is never helpful if it does.

  I would have to evaluate it on the situation I perceive.
- 11. What is your philosophy on recusal, especially in situations in which lawyer-legislators, former associates, or law clerks are to appear before you?
  I do not consider the lawyer's position as a legislator a factor for a recusal. When I was subject to election, so was any other judge who would have heard the matter. I would have recused myself if a former associate were representing a party on motion of either side. I have never had clerks.
- 12. What is your philosophy regarding ex parte communications? Are there circumstances under which you could envision ex parte communications being tolerated?

  They definitely should be discouraged. Aside from communication about scheduling, etc. only in an emergency and then limited to material necessary needed to deal with the emergency.
- 13. If you disclosed something that had the appearance of bias, but you believed it would not actually prejudice your impartiality, what deference would you give a party that requested your recusal? Would you grant such a motion?

  Depending on the facts, likely.
- 14. What standards have you set for yourself regarding the acceptance of gifts or social hospitality?
  I have never been offered or accepted gifts. I have on occasion had lunch with attorneys provided they were not involved in any contest before me at the time.
