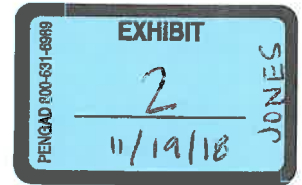

Amendment to Personal Data Questionnaire

Question 47: Have you ever been sued by a client? Have you ever been a named party (personally or professionally) in or had a pecuniary interest in any civil or criminal proceedings? If so, give details, including, but not limited to, dates, and resolutions.

I am supplementing my prior answer to Question 47 with the following:

(b) Yes. I was a named party in a Federal civil lawsuit in US District Court for the District of South Carolina. The lawsuit was filed by William V. Jamison on May 24, 2011. I was never served with Mr. Jamison's lawsuit and was not aware of it until it was listed on my SLED report.

(c) The suit was dismissed by Judge Margaret Seymour on July 15, 2011, due to the Plaintiff's failure to prosecute.

(d) Mr. Jamison's complaint stemmed from his incarceration that occurred when he failed to purge a 90 day sentence by paying a specific amount toward his child support arrearage by a certain date. I issued the contempt order, giving him the ability to purge a 90-day sentence. When he had a hearing in family court on the bench warrant which issued due to his failure to purge by compliance with the order I issued, he was seen by a different judge who issued a stiffer sentence and purge amount than I had set in the original contempt order. Mr. Jamison was complaining that I had not vacated the second judge's order regarding his sentencing and purge amount. I do not have authority to change the terms of another judge's court order.
