**H\*3182 (Rat #0467, Act #0419 of 1996) General Bill, By L.S. Whipper, Breeland, J. Brown, Davenport, Harvin, Inabinett, Kirsh, Lloyd and Vaughn**

### **Similar (H 3334)**

A Bill to amend the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, by adding Section 44-43-720 so as to require informed consent for certain autopsies and post mortem examinations and to limit the use of removed body parts for the determination of the cause of death unless informed consent is obtained and to provide for the manner and form of informed consent; to amend Section 17-5-260, relating to notification to the medical examiner on certain deaths and findings of the medical examiner, so as to require notice to next-of-kin that body parts may be removed and retained as part of the investigation of the death and to limit the use of removed body parts to the investigation unless informed consent is obtained and to provide for the manner and form of informed consent.-amended title
