S 0326 General Bill, By Cork and Waldrep

Summary: Impersonation of another person unlawful; criminal penalties when use identifying information to commit crime, offense

A BILL TO AMEND CHAPTER 14, TITLE 16, CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976, BY ADDING SECTION 16-14-65 TO PROVIDE CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR A PERSON WHO WILLFULLY OBTAINS THE PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION OF ANOTHER PERSON AND USES THAT PERSON'S PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION TO OBTAIN, OR ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN, CREDIT, GOODS, OR SERVICES IN THE NAME OF THE OTHER PERSON WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THAT PERSON; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR WILLFULLY OBTAINING AND USING PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION; TO PROVIDE FURTHER CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR A PERSON WHO WILLFULLY OBTAINS PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION OF ANOTHER PERSON AND USES THAT PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION TO COMMIT A CRIME; AND TO PROVIDE THAT COURT RECORDS WILL BE REQUIRED TO REFLECT THAT THE PERSON WHOSE IDENTITY WAS FALSELY USED DID NOT COMMIT THE CRIME.
