**H\*3573 (Rat #0518, Act #0466 of 1988) General Bill, By House Labor, Commerce and Industry**

A Bill to enact The Long Term Care Insurance Act, provide definitions, provide requirements for the issuance of long term care insurance policies, require the Insurance Commissioner to submit regulations to the General Assembly for approval which carry out the purposes of this Act, and provide that any insurer violating any provision of this Act is subject to penalties provided for in Sections 38-5-120 and 38-5-130, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976.-amended title
