**DATE:** 15 January 2026

**RE:** Proviso 117.161

The Commission on Indigent Defense provided an initial report on 29 July 2025 outlining the information required in accordance with Proviso 117.161 of the FY 25-26 General Appropriations Act (H 4025).

The proviso further requires that “after the initial report is submitted, the Commission on Prosecution Coordination and the Commission on Indigent Defense shall provide semiannual progress updates” on current number of warrants pending.

The warrants pending as of January 1, 2026, are as follows:

1. Warrants pending/disposed as of 7/1/2024, 7/1/2025 and as of 1/1/2026 by Circuit/ County Public Defender Offices. (Exhibit 1)
2. Steps taken to retain employees. Attached Exhibit 2 reflects the substantial increases received by public defenders due to increased funding. Pay increases have been critical in hiring and retaining public defenders. (Exhibit 2)
3. Statewide recruitment and retention data reflecting Public Defender office hires and other personnel data. (Exhibit 3)
4. Exhibit 4 reflects the continued progress by public defenders in reducing the number of pending warrants from a Pandemic high of 123,124 to 99,267 and warrants over a year old from 64,983 to 44,482 (Exhibit 4).




