<u>Proviso 33.1 – Recoupment/Restricted Fund:</u> The Department of Health and Human Services shall recoup all refunds and identified program overpayments and all such overpayments shall be recouped in accordance with established collection policy. Further, the Department of Health and Human Services is authorized to maintain a restricted fund, on deposit with the State Treasurer, to be used to pay for liabilities and improvements related to enhancing accountability for future audits. The restricted fund will derive from prior year program refunds. The restricted fund shall not exceed one percent of the total appropriation authorization for the current year. Amounts in excess of one percent will be remitted to the general fund.

2. Please describe in detail why the agency needs to carry forward a balance greater than one-twelfth of the funds identified as disbursements (other than it is required by law).

This account is used to accumulate the state portion of prior year refunds for use in satisfying audit liabilities resulting from deferrals, disallowances, and uncollected accounts receivables due to the federal government within 365 days (such as nursing home receivables resulting from audits). Due to the potential size of our disallowances, this balance is necessary to prevent requests to the General Assembly to fund disallowances. Funding in this account is not generated at a consistent rate and the carry forward provision allows for the accumulation of balances sufficient to handle our sizable disallowances and receivables not collected within 365 days.

3. Please describe the key expenditures of this fund.

Expenditures for the current year would be for payment of liabilities due to disallowances, deferrals, or uncollected accounts receivables due to the federal government. These amounts do not post as an expenditure but as a reduction of revenue when posted to the federal account.

SC Code of Laws Section 44-6-155: (A) There is created the Medicaid Expansion Fund into which must be deposited funds: (1) collected pursuant to Section 44-6-146 and (2) collected pursuant to Section 12-23-810.
