AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The University of South Carolina Union publishes the approved mission statement at http://www.ipr.sc.edu/mission/union_ms.htm. In fall 2013, the campus created an abbreviated mission statement: The University of South Carolina Union is dedicated to providing a high-quality, competitive higher education that will enable students to thrive in a global, diverse, and constantly changing environment. By providing a varied curriculum, grounded in the Liberal Arts, USC Union emphasizes a close working relationship among students, faculty, staff, and the community that promotes self-reliance, freedom of thought and expression, productive citizenship, and critical thinking.

USC Union Goal 1: Increase Enrollment and Retention

Student enrollment, in terms of headcount, increased in 2017-2018 from 839 in fall 2016 to 903 in fall 2017. This represented the highest enrollment at USC Union up to that point in time, with further increases in enrollment projected for the upcoming 2018-2019 academic year, which has been facilitated by new academic offerings, new dual enrollment partnerships, and increased student life activities on campus, including expansion of athletic programs.

In having already established a partnership with USC Aiken for our Pacer Pathway program, we are embarking on a new partnership with that campus to provide students on the Union campus access to their BSN degree without having to leave Union. This is the primary new academic offering that has attracted significant new interest from prospective students here. New partnerships in dual enrollment have headcount for the campus. One of the biggest drivers of increases in new full-time, on campus students has been the expansion of our athletics program. This includes National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) baseball, softball, men's soccer, and women's soccer for the upcoming 2018-2019 academic year, as well as club level bass fishing and intercollegiate club esports as well. The recently implemented county scholarships from Union and Laurens counties has also contributed to increases in enrollment, making college free to students here if they have graduated with at least a 3.0 GPA from a Union high school or at least a 2.0 GPA from a Laurens high school. Finally, multiple developers have established student housing in the area surrounding campus, with two of those developments filling up for the fall 2018 semester, and the third development aiming to be ready for move-ins by spring 2019. This attractive, convenient housing has allowed for enrollment to benefit from many more students who are coming in from out of county and out of state to attend school here.

All of these efforts are contributing to continued anticipated increases in enrollment for the 2018-2019 academic year, as the preliminary headcount for fall 2018 is in the range of 1000-1100 students, which would be yet another record high for the campus.

Based on data from the NCES database, the retention rate for full-time degree-seeking freshmen from fall 2016 to fall 2017 was 38%, which is an increase over the prior year's retention rate of 26%. A number of factors likely contributed to that increase in retaining students into their sophomore year here. In addition to the efforts described already above, there has also been a concerted effort to increase the impact of the Academic Success Center on campus and other aspects of student life. The Academic Success Center recently expanded its physical footprint on campus due to the extensive student traffic that it sees each day. The number of student visits increased from 2585 visits during the 2016-2017 academic year, to 3649 visits for the 2017-2018 academic year, and there is an expectation for that number to continue to go up in the coming year as well.

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USC Union Goal 2: Expand Academic Offerings

For the upcoming 2018-2019 academic year, we have two new instructors added into the tenure track, including a new Assistant Professor of Biology who replaces a retiring full-time Instructor, and an Assistant Professor of Fine Arts. We also have added two new full-time Instructors of Spanish (one as a replacement for a retiring full-time Instructor), full-time Instructor of Business, and another full-time instructor of Biology/Chemistry to our faculty for the upcoming school year. In looking ahead, over the course of this upcoming academic year, we plan on executing searches for more full-time faculty, including in the disciplines of Speech/Communication (to replace an outgoing full-time Instructor), another Foreign Language (to supplement need for increasing Spanish demand and simultaneously offer additional language outside of Spanish), and Psychology. We also may need to add some additional natural science instructors in the near future to accommodate the start-up of the new BSN program in partnership with USC Aiken, starting with a Nursing Director for the program for our campus who we will search for during fall 2018 as well. We have also been able to further diversify the scope of courses being offered via the aforementioned full-time hires and hiring of new adjunct instructors in certain areas, such as courses in Painting, Printmaking, 3-D Design, Stage Makeup, Costume Design, CPR, Education, Public Health, and Business Law.

As detailed in the most recent campus Blueprint, USC Union faculty reported producing 4 books/chapters, 1 book review, 2 peer-reviewed academic journal articles, 2 international conference presentations, 3 national conference presentations, 7 regional conference presentations, 3 local/invited talks, and 4 grants during the FY 2017-2018. Support of their scholarly work will continue to be available from Palmetto College and from the Union campus. The Union campus in particular will continue to support faculty travel to present their work, and will continue attempts to re-establish funding for the USC Union Research and Productive Scholarship fund to locally support faculty scholarly activity over the summer months.

USC Union Goal 3: Enhance Educational Experience

Full-time faculty at USC Union carry a normal teaching load of 12 contact hours per semester, with the opportunity for a course reduction to pursue scholarship over the academic year. In both domains, teaching and scholarship, faculty receive significant support from the campus and Palmetto College. A variety of teaching workshops, webinars, and trainings are made available to faculty throughout the year, in large part by the Center for Teaching Excellence in Columbia. Multiple grants are made available through Palmetto College for online course development and training. Faculty scholarship is supported by a healthy travel budget provided by the Union campus, allowing faculty to present their work at conferences all over the country. In supporting faculty in these ways, it helps to enhance the students' experiences in the classroom and creates more opportunities for faculty to involve students in original research in a collaborative way as well. Students have benefited from this collaborative approach over the past few years, including six students traveling with faculty to a regional Psychology conference (Southeastern Psychological Association) in Charleston, with three of those students presenting their findings from original research that they conducted with under faculty supervision. In the coming year, the same conference will be held in Jacksonville, Florida, where students will again have the opportunity to present their findings.

USC Union also supports USC's Graduation with Leadership Distinction (GLD) pathways, which are housed in the USC Connect office as part of USC Columbia's QEP. We have had seven students earn this distinction over the past four years (1 in spring 2015, 1 in spring 2016, 3 in spring 2017, and 2 in spring 2018), and continue to work with more students on pursuing that goal at both the Associates level and the Bachelors level via Palmetto College. GLD helps enhance students' education experience by getting them to connect what they are learning in the classroom with meaningful experiences they are having outside of the classroom. In completing the requirements for the GLD, students have made presentations on their experiences and created e-portfolios that

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they can direct future potential employers to as a testament to everything that they gained from their time at USC.

Finally, we also look to enhance students' educational experiences through increasing campus events sponsored by the Academic Success Center, including workshops and career focused programming. Student organizations are another critical source of student life on campus, which includes the Student Government Association and African-American Association, as well as more recently formed clubs like the Research Club, Rotaract, and a Latino-focused student group. The Union campus will also continue to financially support as many students as possible in study abroad and domestic study experiences as part of courses over the summers. In Summer 2017, this included financial support for six students to visit London, Paris, and Amsterdam, and in Summer 2018, we provided support for another six students to spend a week in Paris for a Chemistry course where they learned about the chemistry of fragrance and food.

USC Union Goal 4: Strengthen Infrastructure and Campus Resources

In 2017-2018, projects started/completed included:

- Construction of Patrons Park (started 17/18 projected completion date September 2018);
- Central Building window replacements (completed);
- Central Building Roof Replacement (completed);

In 2018-2019, projects to be started/continued include:

- Central Building HVAC upgrades and retrofits (projected completion date unknown);
- Main Building Landscaping (projected completion date unknown);
- Science & Nursing Building Renovations (project completion date unknown);
- Central Building & Main Building Bathroom Renovations (projected completion June 2019);
- Parking lot resurfacing at Science & Nursing and Maintenance Buildings
- ALERTUS emergency notification system installed (projected completion June 2019);
- Concrete repairs campus-wide (projected completion December 2018);
- Maintenance Building Renovation (projected completion date unknown).

USC Union Goal 5: Strengthen Community Ties

The campus hosts a wide variety of community events and activities each year. This includes annual events like the Upcountry Literary Festival, the National Chemistry Day activities, Miss USC Union pageant, and walk for Alzheimers awareness. Moving forward, we will continue to be accessible to the community, including participating in events like the Uniquely Union Festival, youth sports, and art showcases.

We are also connected to the community through internships that our students take on as part of work-study assignments or as part of internships in fulfillment of degree requirements.


As our sports teams become more established they will also find new ways to engage with the community, as they play their home games at venues in town and occupy much of the privately run student housing options around campus.

USC Union Goal 6: Planning

USC Union, in cooperation with Palmetto College, will continue to engage in an all-units and functions planning effort to assess what is working and what needs strengthening. This review of USC Union's role within Palmetto College, and the structure and function of all of Palmetto College, positions USC Union to optimally encourage higher education in the counties of Chester, Cherokee, Fairfield, Laurens, Union, and York, including for

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individuals who are geographically within their home county and are not able to regularly commute to a physical campus.
