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
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AGENCY’S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles (SCDMV) is a model State Agency delivering exceptional customer service and promoting efficient business practices, professional employees, innovative technology and strategic partnerships. The SCDMV administers South Carolina’s motor vehicle laws in an efficient, effective, and professional manner in order to deliver accuracy and security in all transaction documents and to provide the highest levels of customer service to the citizens of South Carolina.

The Agency’s statement of values is “Your SCDMV -- Each a Role Model – Competent, Committed, Courteous!” The Agency Director, through branch office visits, ceremonies, training sessions, weekly staff meetings and agency leadership involvement and input has continued to promote the agency’s vision, encouraged open communication, and generated dialogue with the Agency’s employees seeking input on ideas, best practices, standardization, and compliance to address their concerns.

The development and education of the SCDMV’s values has fostered a sense of comradery, teamwork and unity. As an agency, we developed a recognizable and memorable agency motto and seal that unites all agency staff under a common mission and direction. Most importantly, the agency has a very robust awards and recognition program aimed at great public servants who demonstrate the core values and vision of our agency.

The SCDMV operates 66 permanent customer service centers and three mobile units across the state. The majority of these customer service centers offer full service transactions with expanded capabilities in some offices:

- 21 offices serve international customers
- 9 offices, in strategic statewide locations, offer skills tests for commercial drivers; the CDL knowledge test is offered in all 66 branch offices
- 7 offices offer Dealer Services, all offices accept dealer work
- 8 offices process International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA) / International Registration Plan (IRP) transactions
- 1 Community Area Response and Emergency Services Vehicle (CARES) which provides statewide emergency response services as its primary function and community outreach as its secondary function. Functionally, this is a trailer outfitted with permanent fixtures, five work stations, and a generator that can serve as a contained office
- 2 Self-Contained Hazardous Area Response Kits (SHARKs) which provide statewide emergency response services as their primary function and community outreach as their secondary function. These units each include two work stations, printers, a camera, and storage containers that double as tables for the equipment when set up. These units are often used when indoor or covered space is provided for us to set up.

The SCDMV continues to partner with other agencies and municipalities to share information and identify laws to synchronize, verify, and ease our collective ability to service the citizens of South Carolina. Working with Clemson University, the South Carolina Trucking Association, the South Carolina

Elections Commission, SLED, the South Carolina Trial Lawyers Association, the legislature and executive branch were instrumental in moving forward a number of key pieces of legislation and initiatives. The General Assembly passed six bills in 2019 that directly impacted the SCDMV, including a comprehensive licensing and ID card bill that allowed the DMV to extend the issuance periods for the cards to the maximum allowed under federal law. The agency also made significant strides towards implementing REAL ID, the SC Infrastructure Act, the re-instated vision screening, and the traceable temporary license plate legislation from last year’s legislative session.

As mentioned above, in addition to our 66 statewide customer service centers, the SCDMV utilizes two mobile rapid response capabilities with our Community Area Response and Emergency Services Vehicle (CARES) and Self-Contained Hazard Area Response Kits (SHARKs). The CARES and SHARK capabilities stand ready to deploy to areas impacted by natural disasters, though no such deployments were needed in FY19, and were used at several community outreach deployments to state agencies, the legislature, and public hubs (like airports) in FY19. When used for the primary function of disaster response, these capabilities provide the agency an ability to sustain its core mission for administering the State’s motor vehicle licensing and titling laws, while maintaining strict controls in the delivery of secure and valid identification, licenses, and property records during a natural disaster such as a hurricane, earthquake, flood or tornado. Valid credentials are critical in providing FEMA and the State Emergency Management Division immediate verification of a citizen’s status and reduces the opportunity for fraud and/or exploitation of identity theft. When used for the secondary purpose of community outreach, these capabilities allowed the SCDMV to provide customer convenience and responsiveness in new settings and reach out to vulnerable populations, like the youth served by the Department of Juvenile Justice programs. The legislature reauthorized a proviso allowing the SCDMV to waive the fee associated with the issuance of identification cards to minors when working with another state or federal agency, which was put to good use during the SHARK deployments. While the mobile capabilities were not needed in FY19 to support disaster relief, our contact center was activated as part of the state Public Information Phone System (PIPS) on September 11, 2018. The agency supported the phone system for seven days, taking a total of 1,182 calls concerning evacuation orders and routes, shelters road/bridge conditions and closures, and evacuation assistance.

The SCDMV’s executive leadership sustained the agency’s objectives through the translation of the Governor’s priorities, the linkage between Fiscal Budget Authority and the agency’s core functions, direction from legislators, and the expressed needs and requirements from both constituents and agency employees into a simplified set of four executable, supportable and sustainable agency goals. These include:

- Deliver an excellent customer service experience while upholding the existing laws that govern agency operations
- Modernize customer service delivery methods
- Minimize the risk of fraud and breaches
- Invest in employees through development and recognition opportunities

The Department of Motor Vehicles measured and sustained its accomplishments by establishing cyclic events to assess the Department’s mission, efficiencies, progress, and results. The agency measured and compared its effort against its accomplishments through systematic reviews of business processes, trend

analysis of business transactions, and department products and processes to help tailor training packages focused on gaps and inefficiencies. The agency also senior leader strategic off-site meetings to provide a forum for candid and professional assessment of Department systems, procedures and policies to validate if the Department’s accomplishments are meeting the needs of South Carolina citizens and those of the Governor’s office, and weekly strategy sessions with only director-level Department leadership to strategize priorities for current and future Department focus.

The agency continues to provide executive staff representation at various state and national forums to ensure the agency is staying abreast of all current government initiatives that could affect our citizens and/or state. Additionally, the Executive Director and senior SCDMV management met with key stakeholders to lay out the SCDMV’s legislative priorities. Agency leadership continued to participate in the promotion of community relationships aimed at improving the lives of employees as well as the citizenry of this state. Being a part of community partnerships is essential in meeting this goal. Over the past year, the SCDMV’s Executive Director has continued to participate in 40+ committees aimed at improving the lives of our state employees and the citizens of South Carolina.

Because the agency is focused on providing superior customer service, the agency delivered its products and services through multiple service channels, including face-to-face service in our customer service centers, mail-in and web services, call center operations, constituent services and through our legislative liaisons. To that end, the agency provided more than 440 different products and services to the general public and to business and governmental entities such as insurance companies, financial institutions, county tax offices, law enforcement, vehicle dealers, the legislature, judges and court administrators, federal and state agencies, as well as to other states and counties. Through a series of initiatives (several noted on the Performance Measures Template), the agency continues to maintain average customer wait times around or below 8 minutes. The agency considers minimal customer wait times and responsive support through remote accessibility to agency services as a positive measure of the agency’s ability to swiftly and accurately serve the public. The agency has continued focus on data and information security as evident in our commitment of resources necessary to avoid information compromise or interdiction.

The agency has continued focus on data and information security as evident in our commitment of resources necessary to avoid information compromise or interdiction. During this rating period, the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) provided initial security awareness training to 348 new employees, temporary employees, Vets for Success, interns, volunteers, and contractors. With oversight from the Executive Director, the CISO planned, compiled, and conducted continuing security awareness training for over 100 additional employees. The CISO planned, compiled, and conducted advanced security awareness training for 22 managers and branch supervisors. Additionally, 1,350 employees received the State provided “SANS *Securing the Human*” security awareness training. The Executive Director, along with the CISO, continues to routinely visit all 66 branch offices to help raise security awareness and to help ensure security compliance. In light of the ever-increasing threat to our citizen’s data, the SCDMV’s primary goal is to maintain data integrity and the security of that data. Additionally, the agency implemented multifactor authentication for access to our system for all SCDMV employees.

The CISO, in concert with the CIO, continue to employ an Information Security Incident Response Team and processes to quickly respond to, identify the cause of, isolate, and remedy security related incidents. SCDMV’s CISO will continue to work with the Department of Administration, Division of Information Security, Homeland Security, the FBI, and other Cabinet Agencies to mitigate threats to the data network.

Decreasing customer wait times and ensuring customer satisfaction were keys to the agency’s success. Optimizing resources to provide focused training to all Branch Managers, Assistant Managers and key customer service providers, the agency continues to refine the use of a customer queuing system (known as Q-FLOW) and posting of wait times on the web to provide the swiftest and most accurate support to its customers.

In FY19, the agency successfully processed a total of **15,744,086** transactions (including web, county, title, and registration services). Of these transactions, **6,558,400** were processed throughout the state in our 66 customer service centers and **4,507,569** were processed in our Headquarters location. In addition to these numbers, the SCDMV Headquarters’ processed **27,021** licenses surrendered from out of state, **1,093,510** tickets/violations, and **14,769** financial responsibility suspensions.

The SCDMV is proud of its partnership with the Donate Life organization. In January 2014, South Carolina had 1,122,446 registered donors compared to 2,121,948 registered donors through June 20, – an increase of 999,502 donors. Additionally, monetary donations collected at our branch offices during FY19 reached \$228,691.13, increasing from \$182,189 in FY18.

The agency continued to seek ways to improve its business practices. By visiting other state agencies and other state’s Motor Vehicle agencies, the SCDMV assessed, planned, resourced, executed and reassessed continuously in an effort to achieve optimal results. This circular cycle aided the attainment of the agency’s goals to reduce waste, eliminate redundancy, improve customer service, decrease wait times, and seek out best business practices. Through use of accountability reporting, senior leaders monitored and responded to trends indicating systemic rather than individual performance problems. Senior leaders also used internal and external performance reviews, along with employee feedback, to improve our services to the public as part of our continuous improvement process.

The analysis generated from daily transaction data provides the SCDMV the means for “right-sizing” our branch offices, taking into account the services the agency provides in varied areas (Commercial Driver Licensing, Dealer Central Offices, Motorcycle licensing, etc). Daily, the agency analyzed transaction reports, monitored customer wait times and reviewed employee availability reports. The reports provided upper management the ability to redistribute resources necessary to meet customer demands. During the past year, the agency’s focus on improving and enhancing internal operations provided the agency the means to streamline business practices, to provide faster and more accurate service to the citizens of South Carolina, and to implement numerous cost saving initiatives.

The agency’s survival is based on its ability to sustain and secure operations. From the administration of the State’s motor vehicle licensing and titling laws, to maintaining strict controls in order to deliver secure and valid identification, licenses, and property records, all while accurately accounting for the

receipt and timely distribution of revenue collected, the agency’s main focus is, and always will be, directed on how the SCDMV can best serve the citizens of South Carolina.

Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies

A failure of the SCDMV’s internal transaction database and/or the possible breach of customer information remain the two most potential negative impacts to the citizens of South Carolina. Our ability to communicate and secure the information from our database is our greatest priority. Our principal information application, Phoenix, was implemented in August 2002. The SCDMV will have applied approximately 11,000 modifications to the Phoenix system since 2004. Within the next several years, the SCDMV will have very limited staff with experience to maintain and support our existing IT architecture. Any system with over 9,000 modifications and twenty years of age will become unmaintainable without modernization. The SCDMV secured funding during the last budget cycle and is implementing a system modernization proof of concept over the next fiscal year, which when successful will provide the impetus to secure the necessary funding to conduct a full system modernization and reduce the risks associated with operating on a more than 15-year-old platform.

In order to mitigate the risk of external breach of customer information, the SCDMV needs continued support for Information Technology and Information Security initiatives in our budget submission as well as support for delayed implementation timelines in legislation that will require programming efforts from the SCDMV’s technology team. The agency also needs support to implement projects previously delayed by legislative mandates that require those same IT resources. The agency possesses limited IT capability, which is continually stretched through growing legislative, system, and federal requirements resulting in delayed timelines for projects critical to agency operations and modernization. As noted in our recent Social Security Administration Audit, the SCDMV requires a Business Continuity Plan that includes a robust Disaster Recovery plan to ensure security and continued operations in the event of a catastrophic loss of our system. As stated, over the next few years it will be imperative to modernize our transactional database (Phoenix) system. The Department requires funding for this modernization effort either incrementally, over several years, or through a one-time non-recurring appropriation to complete full system modernization.

An additional risk is the implementation of Real ID across the state and the issuance of federally approved credentials to upwards of 4.4 million South Carolinians. To mitigate the risks associated with this initiative, the agency has maintained close working ties with the Department of Homeland Security and developed a strategy, secured funding, purchased the necessary equipment and hired additional temporary workforce to alleviate anticipated increases in customer load associated with issuing a large volume of credentials over a compressed time period. The SCDMV worked with Homeland Security to grandfather approximately one million South Carolina residents who had previously provided the necessary documentation as eligible to order Real ID compliant credentials via the web rather than in person at an SCDMV Branch Office, and have established a program where SC residents can bring their required documents in early so they too can order a compliant credential online. These measures will further reduce the negative impact of servicing multiple millions of citizens in a compressed 2+ year period.
