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AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Since 1801, the University of South Carolina Columbia has shared the goals, triumphs, and hardships of its state. Within the very name of our university rests its most solemn obligation: the obligation to the people of South Carolina. That includes not just admitting more South Carolinians but ensuring that they are academically prepared for higher education, that they can enter the University of South Carolina system at a place and time that is most convenient and affordable for them, that they can move within our system without barriers or challenges and that their academic training aligns with available job opportunities within our state and in an increasingly competitive global marketplace.

In 2020, the University launched a new strategic plan. This new strategic plan, *A Path to Excellence*, is the product of months of hard work and thoughtful deliberation and dedication by great leaders, committed students, talented faculty members, innovative researchers, committed staff members along with corporate and community partners. The ideals of respect, empathy, humility and integrity spoken in the Carolinian Creed form the moral foundation for this undertaking as we work to ensure that the university remains an innovative, welcoming destination for tomorrow's students, researchers, entrepreneurs, game-changers and leaders. By serving the people of the great state of South Carolina, we acknowledge our responsibility to educate the citizens and concurrently aspire to greater recognition as one of the nation's finest comprehensive institutions of higher education.

As our world changes constantly — sometimes seemingly overnight — an agile university committed to properly serving its students, community and state well into the future must periodically reevaluate its priorities, opportunities and goals. It is in this light that a new strategic plan has been created to propel the University of South Carolina to future successes.

LEADING THROUGH NEW TIMES

If there is one constant for colleges and universities, it is that the higher education landscape is always changing. The primary responsibility of any university is serving its students. In a world that is ever-changing, the University of South Carolina Columbia must continue to focus on the strategic horizon and be diligent both today and as the institution plans for the future.

To be the best flagship university in the nation, the institution must serve the people of this state by evaluating this shifting landscape and making the necessary adjustments that produce leaders of character to meet the educational, professional, economic and corporate needs of this great state.

In March 2020, as the global pandemic forced the University of South Carolina Columbia to completely shift its academic activity to online learning, it became clear that the institution needed to complete this strategic plan. With the goal of ensuring that the University had a “true north” for the vision and mission, this plan has helped ensure that the changes the institution made, and the budgetary cuts implemented have not crippled our most important goals and objectives. Additionally, our new strategic plan serves as the roadmap to quickly get the University back on track as the nation recovers from the impacts of the coronavirus.

The University has demonstrated how to pivot the entirety of our institution in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of our campus and community. Students are adaptable to change and willing to push forward despite challenges. The University academic activity can continue to thrive, even if only virtually, while our world-class professors and instructors teach and coach their students at a distance. The University’s leading-edge research not only continues, but it is also a guiding effort in combating COVID-19 and bringing health and stability to our communities. Most of all, the 219-year history of the University did not end in 2020: it truly grows stronger as the university continues to fulfill its flagship mission by simultaneously overcoming the challenges of the pandemic while also serving the needs of our students and community.

There are challenges ahead for higher education all over the country. But in its history, the University of South Carolina Columbia has perhaps never been so well-prepared to tackle the future and succeed: South Carolina has never been so highly regarded, highly accomplished or highly sought-after as a destination for those seeking a top-notch degree. To continue to be a leading public research university, the institution must constantly improve its technology, facilities and programs and identify areas of strength and opportunities to assess the current social, political and economic landscapes, deal with funding issues and find new resources. The University of South Carolina Columbia is known for having an indomitable spirit; with proper foresight, planning and execution, that spirit will lead the institution through today’s — and tomorrow’s — challenges.

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The Best Students

The University of South Carolina Columbia welcomed almost 7,800 new students to the Columbia campus in Fall 2020. The freshman class was more diverse and had more in-state students than any previous class. All combined, of the new students who were freshman, transfers and participants in the residential bridge program more than 4,700 were from South Carolina. African American freshman enrollment grew by 28 percent over last year and has grown by 84 percent since 2016. Underrepresented minorities make up 25 percent of the new student, with their number growing 9 percent in the Fall 2020 freshman class compared with 2019. Hispanic freshman enrollment is up 55 percent since 2016. Nearly 18 percent of the 2020 freshman class were first-generation college students. About 580 freshmen were enrolled in the South Carolina Honors College and an estimated 1459 freshmen participated in the Capstone Scholars program. Including graduate students, overall enrollment at the Columbia campus for Fall 2020 was at a record 35,500. Graduate school enrollment increased significantly from 6,917 in Fall 2019 to 7,481 in Fall 2020.

World-class Faculty and Staff

Under the leadership of the Office of the Provost, the University of South Carolina Columbia is committed to recruiting and retaining faculty who can transform the lives of our students and transform the world with their research and scholarship. The University is working to pair faculty with a diverse, dedicated staff who together with our faculty will produce and instill a shared culture of excellence for the University. With just over 5,700 first-time, full-time freshmen enrolling in fall 2020, a world class faculty is an essential component to quality education. USC Columbia strives to maintain a low student to faculty ratio of 17:1, ensuring students receive quality, personalized attention and support. USC supports its faculty selection and retention efforts with a campaign to assess and improve faculty salaries to better align with national standards; the dedication of resources to attracting and retaining internationally recognized faculty; and the improvement of faculty mentoring opportunities and professional development.

Outstanding Research

In fiscal year 2020, faculty garnered \$203 million in research and sponsored awards funding. The University is launching a new grant writing program called Propel that will focus on intensive mentoring and workshops. This new initiative will be geared toward early-career faculty researchers with small grants who are ready to go for large NIH or NSF grants. Participants will receive nine months of intensive support through workshops, mentorship, peer feedback and editing assistance. Another new initiative called the STAR program will target senior faculty researchers and provide insight into identifying, applying for and successfully managing major federal center grants.

Increase Diversity

In 2020, the university hired its first Vice President of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion and committing additional resources to support diversity efforts. Over the past year the Council of Academic Diversity Officers (CADO) has implemented search committee training (primarily for search committee chairs and affirmative action advocates). Four training sessions were provided in the fall in partnership with the Offices for International Scholars, Talent Acquisition, and Equal Opportunity Programs. Every academic unit was represented at the training sessions.

The Office of Diversity and Inclusion provided over \$200,000 in internal research for funding to faculty

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through the racial justice and equity research fund. Diversity and Inclusive Excellence mini-grants have been a successful initiative. Up to \$2,000 is provided for creative program, events and academic multicultural initiatives that foster collaborative partnership and encourage diversity, equity and inclusion across all dimensions of identity. Mini-grants are open to students, registered student clubs and organizations, faculty and staff.

In June 2021, the University successfully implemented a system by which students, faculty, and staff can self-select their preferred name, pronoun, and gender identity. Now that phase one of the project is complete, the University will begin work on phase two of the project to connect self-selected data to other parts of the University's enterprise system.

The University of South Carolina Columbia serves a diverse population of students with widely varying backgrounds, career goals, and levels of aspiration. Eighteen percent of the new Fall 2020 freshman class was first-generation college students. Of the 7,750 estimated new freshmen, transfers and participants in the residential bridge program, more than 4,700 were from South Carolina. In addition to in-state residents, the new freshman class had students from forty-four (44) other states and the District of Columbia.

The university offers over 320 degrees at the bachelor's, master's, doctoral, and professional program levels, affording students the most comprehensive array of educational programs in the state. Opportunities for personal and career development are provided to the citizens of South Carolina through outreach and continuing education activities. The university provides additional opportunities for associate degrees through Fort Jackson and through the oversight of regional Palmetto College campuses (Lancaster, Salkehatchie, Sumter, and Union).

Community Partnerships

The University is a major economic driver for the Palmetto State. The University of South Carolina Columbia offers Columbia a major competitive asset that has the potential to significantly boost growth throughout the next decade and beyond – namely, the presence of a high-skilled workforce. This implies that the University's total economic impact in the Midlands has the potential to increase substantially in the coming decade. The total annual economic impact of the University on the Columbia metropolitan region is approximately \$3.7 billion. This figure reflects the dollar volume of all economic activity that can be attributed to – directly or indirectly – the University of South Carolina Columbia. This includes increases in alumni wages that are earned and spent in the local community, ongoing business activities resulting from non-state funded expenditures, and all activities associated with university athletics.

The University of South Carolina Columbia contributes \$1.7 billion towards personal income and supports approximately 43,876 jobs in the Midlands community, 13,705 of which represent employees working directly

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at the institution. These estimates imply that the University supports approximately 1 in every 9 jobs in the Columbia metropolitan region.

The university's uniquely large contribution to Columbia's economy puts it in a position to take a leadership role in developing a strategy that Columbia can implement in the coming years in order to boost its rate of long-run economic growth. Such a strategy will be critical as the region recovers from the COVID-19 pandemic, especially considering that over the past decade Columbia's growth rate has lagged almost all other metropolitan regions of comparable size in the Southeast.

Excellent Infrastructure

The University is committed to state-of-the-art technology and infrastructure. The Hyperion cluster is the flagship High Performance Computing resource at the University. The cluster was expanded from 7,316 compute cores to 15,524. The expansion also included an additional 88 graphic processing unit (GPU) accelerators, giving the cluster 106 GPUs total. This new capability provides an incredible resource to computational research at the University of South Carolina Columbia. The GPU technology also addresses the explosion of Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning research being conducted across disciplines.

Thousands of students and instructors rely on the Blackboard learning management system to keep them connected each day. In an effort to enhance the student digital experience, Blackboard was updated to Ultra Base Navigation. Ultra Base Navigation is reliable, accessible and extensible with a sleek, modern look and feel. It has simpler workflows and easier access to relevant information, meaning students and faculty will save time navigating pages. Ultra Base Navigation has maximum availability, which greatly reduced downtime and outages.

Ring Central was purchased to provide basic call center functionalities for several groups on campus working remotely. This helped employees stay on track by giving them the ability to answer phone calls and complete their work from home. The Division of Information Technology (DoIT) also increased the VPN throughput capacity from 1 GB to 20 GB, resulting the daily utilization to increase from 250 to 1,500.

The University's secondary firewall and 100 gigabyte network core was moved to the Segra Data Center in the spring of 2020. This move was part of the Network Core and Firewall Upgrade project. Moving the firewall required the physical relocation of the redundant core through a group effort with vendors. The move has expanded the firewall's throughput capabilities, which helps moves data around campus to collaborators quickly.

Win with Character

Not just on the playing field, but in the classroom, developing strength of character is reflected in our Carolinian Creed. In 1990, the initial Carolinian Creed was established for students. The Creed approached these issues in a unique way; instead of limiting student's rights, it empowered students to set an example for all to follow. The community of scholars at the University of South Carolina is dedicated to personal and academic excellence. Choosing to join the community obligates each member to the Carolinian Creed. Academic dialogue and civil discourse are the cornerstone of the educational system and crucial to individual growth. Students are encouraged to practice personal and academic integrity, respect the rights and dignity of

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all persons, respect the rights and property of others, discourage bigotry, while striving to learn from differences in people, ideas, and opinions, and demonstrate concern for others, their feelings, and their need for conditions which support their work and development. To infuse the Creed into campus culture, there are a number of events that take place throughout the year. In 2013, the University adopted similar language for the Faculty Manual. In 2020, as a part of the development of the Employee Standards for Ethical Conduct, the Carolinian Creed is identified as the University's foundational values statement for the entire campus.

The women's basketball team and soccer teams, under the leadership of Coach Dawn Staley and Coach Shelley Smith, won regular season and tournament SEC championships. The women's basketball team finished the season ranked number one in both national polls for the first time in program history. The women spent 10 weeks on top of the AP poll – the most of any team during the season. The Spring 2020 semester brought a 3.7 cumulative GPA for student-athletes, the highest in school history and the 27th straight semester of a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. We have led the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the last five years.

Discussion

The University of South Carolina Columbia's reach across and impact within South Carolina is significant, and the University is proud of the students, faculty, and alumni who live and work here. Through its strategic planning process, the University has articulated a variety of valuable and measurable objectives that will help the University continue to remain a rich source of education, research, and service to the state and nation. Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies

The University has implemented a comprehensive Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) program which incorporates the fundamentals of risk identification, risk assessment, risk treatment, risk monitoring and review. The University has established this process using the guidance of International Standards Organization (ISO) 3100-2018 "Risk Management - Principles and Guidelines". ISO provides the principles, framework and process for managing any form of risk in a systematic, transparent and credible manner. The ERM program operates within an established University ERM committee structure to provide a detailed picture of high priority risk areas as identified by upper management. Identified high priority risk areas include: governance, legislative relations, economic decline, emergency planning, disaster recovery, business continuity, laboratory safety, student safety, crime prevention, title IX compliance, data security and privacy, institutional data reporting, capital project management/deferred maintenance, enrollment management, personnel recruiting and retention/succession planning, research compliance, and IT system implementation.

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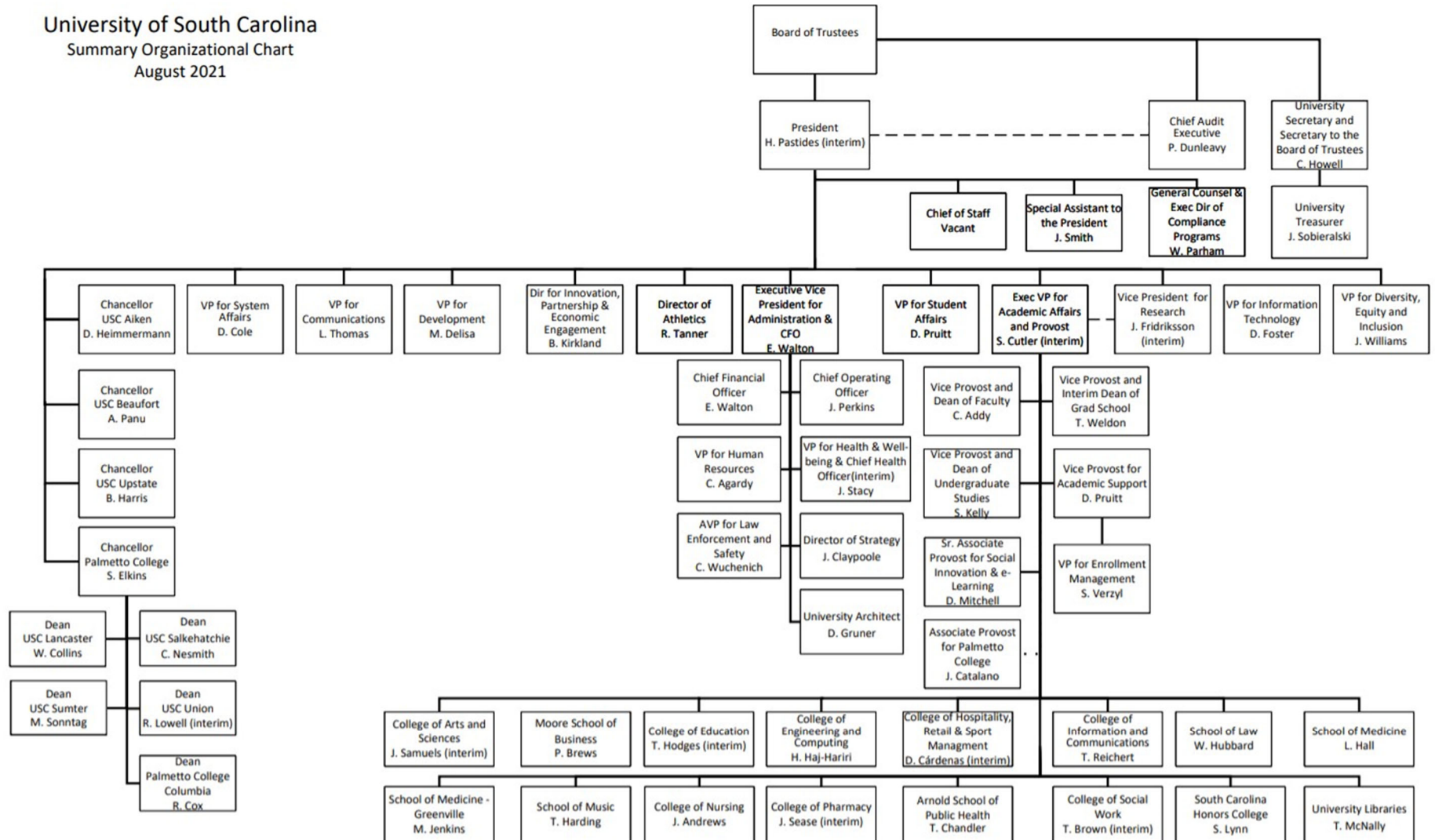
As necessary, the University monitors and tracks these high priority risk areas and implements actions plans to effectively control these risks.
