## Agency Mission

The Union regional Palmetto College campus is a branch campus of the University of South Carolina Columbia. Union has as its mission to provide higher education and intellectual leadership for its service area. At the heart of this mission is a teaching faculty of high quality dedicated to excellence in instruction, scholarship, public and professional service, and creative endeavor which enrich the classroom experience. The Union regional Palmetto College campus offers a varied curriculum grounded in the liberal arts and focused on preparing students to continue their education in the University of South Carolina System and throughout life. The Union regional Palmetto College campus recruits students prepared to succeed in completing a baccalaureate-level education. While the institution does not offer remedial instruction, it is nonetheless able to admit most students who apply due to the close working relationship between students and faculty. The Union regional Palmetto College campus was established to encourage higher education in the counties of Chester, Cherokee, Fairfield, Laurens, Union, and York. The original design of the institution incorporated a flexibility that has allowed changes in institutional capability with increasing educational demands of constituents. Through classroom and laboratory instruction delivered in a variety of face-to-face and distance learning formats and modalities, the institution awards the Associate in Arts and Associate in Science degrees and provides for the completion of selected bachelor's degrees on campus through cooperative agreements and delivery structures with other University of South Carolina System institutions. The Union regional Palmetto College campus also provides general education and upper division coursework applicable to baccalaureate degree programs offered through colleges and universities nationwide. In addition to academic coursework, the mission of the campus includes noncredit courses, seminars, and workshops made available to the community for cultural enrichment and professional development. The traditions of cultural diversity and freedom of thought are valued at the Union regional Palmetto College campus. In a learning environment that develops respect for racial, geographical, intellectual, and economic diversity and an awareness of individual, societal, and global responsibilities, Union promotes courses, activities, and attitudes which influence the life of the mind in men and women and instill in them a thirst to continue learning throughout life. The Union regional Palmetto College campus emphasizes the development of the whole person and especially seeks to foster in students the disciplines essential to an educated citizenry. Core competencies, including the ability to communicate through effective writing and articulate speech; computational and quantitative mastery; creative and critical thinking; and the duties of citizenship are strategically integrated within the curriculum. Classroom experiences, student activities, and physical education programs also provide opportunities for cultural enrichment, leadership development, intellectual growth and interpersonal relationships, all contributing to a sense of self-reliance and a joy of learning.

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## AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The University of South Carolina Union is dedicated to providing a high-quality, competitive higher education that will enable students to thrive in a global, diverse, and constantly changing environment. By providing a varied curriculum, grounded in the Liberal Arts, USC Union emphasizes a close working relationship among students, faculty, staff, and the community that promotes self-reliance, freedom of thought and expression, productive citizenship, and critical thinking. Students at USC Union can obtain an Associates of Arts and an Associates of Science, in addition to having access to the baccalaureate degrees available through Palmetto College and the newly established BSN in partnership with USC Aiken.

***Strategic Priority 1: Attract, inspire, challenge and enable our students to become innovative thinkers and transformative leaders.***

The first strategic priority in the University of South Carolina's strategic plan, For South Carolina: A Path to Excellence, is attracting, inspiring, challenging and enabling our students to become innovative thinkers and transformative leaders. This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Attract and retain a highly qualified, appropriately sized and diverse student body at all levels.
2. Provide the highest quality of rigorous instruction and student-centric educational experience to all students.
3. Create innovative, transformative and collaborative lifelong learners.

On the USC Union campus, these goals are addressed by focusing specifically on increasing student enrollment and retention. Student enrollment, in terms of headcount, increased in 2020-2021 from 1,153 in fall 2019 to 1,162 in fall 2020. This represented the highest enrollment at USC Union up to that point in time, with enrollment for fall 2021 projected to hold steady. This growth has been facilitated by new academic offerings, new dual enrollment partnerships, an early college program partnership with Union County High School, support of study abroad opportunities, undergraduate research funding opportunities, and increased student life opportunities on campus, including the cultivation of NJCAA level athletics. In addition to the existing partnership with USC Aiken for our Pacer Pathway program there, our partnership with USC Aiken to offer the BSN degree to students on the Union campus just accepted its first upper division cohort with a start date in fall 2021. This partnership has led to a substantial number of new freshmen attending in order to pursue this degree here. Associated with this BSN, is the Science & Nursing Building on campus in Union, which features a state of the art virtual reality biology lab for students to enjoy. The Union campus also supports study abroad programs and will continue to financially support as many students as possible in study abroad and domestic study experiences as part of courses over spring and summer breaks once it is deemed safe to do so amidst the current COVID-19 pandemic. In early Spring 2020, this included support for six students to spend a week in Costa Rica, and previously in Summer 2019, this included support for five students to visit Ireland to learn more about the culture there as part of a Sociology course. While the campus was unable to support study abroad this year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we expect to resume the program in 2021-2022. To supplement this important global learning experience, the campus held a virtual Latin American film festival by means of a grant that was awarded to Dr. Steven Lownes, Assistant Professor of World Languages. New and growing partnerships with high schools in our service area have also helped facilitate increases in headcount for USC Union. One of the biggest sources of recruitment of new enrollment on campus, especially in attracting students from out of county/state, has been the

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growing athletics program at USC Union, which now includes NJCAA level men's soccer, baseball, and softball; in addition to club level bass fishing, e-sports, and a rifle team. Additionally, women's volleyball will enter NJCAA competition in fall 2021. Support from the county has been extremely helpful towards the growth of the student body as well, particularly in the form of the scholarships furnished by Union and Laurens counties, with Union covering the tuition/fees for any in-county high school graduate who finished with at least a 3.0 GPA, and Laurens having a parallel program for any in-county high school graduate who finished with at least a 2.0 GPA. Given the influx in out of county/state students who have been recruited to campus, the other critical component of the growth in Union has been the recent construction of student housing by private entities around campus. There are three separate developments that are exclusively for students, with more units/developments on the horizon as the campus continues to grow. With growing enrollments, USC Union has also worked to increase success in terms of retention of these students. Based on the most recent data available, the undergraduate retention rates for USC Union were 26% for fall 2015 to fall 2016; 37.8% for fall 2016 to fall 2017; 41.3% for fall 2017 to fall 2018; and 48.9% for fall 2018 to fall 2019. Based on unofficial reports from the UofSC COGNOS data warehouse, the percent of students retained to the second fall for the fall 2019 cohort was 50.35% and 48.06% for the fall 2020 cohort. This decline can most likely be attributed to the COVID-19 pandemic. The retention rates are expected to increase given that many of the services described above have been implemented or expanded in the past few years, and campus has returned to normal operations. In addition to the efforts described already above, there has also been a concerted effort to increase the impact of the Student Academic Success Center on campus and other aspects of student life. The Student Academic Success Center continues to connect with students and the community to put on events and assist students, with increased involvement of more faculty on campus. The Center aims to enhance students' educational experiences through increasing campus events sponsored by the Center, including workshops and career focused programming. There has also been an increase in student activities in general, particularly via the formation of multiple new student organizations on campus in recent years. Student organizations are a critical source of student life on campus, which includes the Student Government Association, African-American Alliance, Research Club, Rotaract, Sustainable Garden and Botany Club, Art Club, Bantam Gazette student newspaper, and a group of faculty organized around providing a campus film series.

The Union campus also encourages and supports students in pursuit of Graduation with Leadership Distinction. USC Union supports USC's Graduation with Leadership Distinction (GLD) pathways, which are housed in the USC Center for Integrative and Experiential Learning (formerly USC Connect Office) as part of USC Columbia's QEP. This current academic year, three USC Union students applied and were awarded GLD, two at the Associate's level and one at the Bachelor's level. GLD helps enhance students' education experience by getting them to connect what they are learning in the classroom with meaningful experiences they are having outside of the classroom. In completing the requirements for the GLD, students have made presentations on their experiences and created e-portfolios that they can direct future potential employers to as a testament to everything that they gained from their time at USC. The campus also created two new committees to assist in retention efforts. The first is the Academic Intervention Committee, which aims to provide early intervention across campus units to support students in poor academic standing to ensure that they have access to the resources necessary to succeed academically. The second committee, the Student Care and Outreach Team (Care Team), is comprised of various faculty and staff members who provide individual attention and resources to students of concern such as those who are exhibiting self-injurious or erratic behaviors. Due to these efforts, for the latest cohort (2016 entering FT/FT students, captured three years after entering, i.e., "150% of time"), the success rate for this campus is 81.6%. USC Union currently ranks #1 in the

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state for the second year in a row among two-year institutions in success rate, up from 80.2% last year. We also saw an increase in graduation rate, moving up from 19.8% to 25.5% and from #9 to #3 in the state among all four Palmetto College campuses and 16 technical schools in South Carolina.

***Strategic Priority 2: Assemble and cultivate a world-class faculty and staff***

This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Recruit and develop diverse faculty members who are excellent instructors and recognized scholars with a breadth of experience.
2. Actively attract, recruit, hire and retain a diverse and highly talented staff.
3. Produce and instill a shared culture of excellence.

On the Union campus, these goals are addressed by focusing on efforts to expand the faculty and the academic offerings available to our students. During the 2020-2021 academic year, we began three separate searches for a full-time faculty: a full-time instructor of business, a full-time instructor of Spanish, and a full-time assistant professor of African-American studies. While we had to cancel the business search due to lack of qualified applicants, we have currently completed and filled the Spanish instructor position and anticipate resuming the African-American Studies search in Fall 2021. We also hired new part-time faculty in biology and English, and have recruited new part-time faculty in statistics, accounting, and theatre to begin in Fall 2021. In looking ahead, with the growth of enrollment, we will seek to secure additional full-time faculty in the areas of sciences and humanities.

Full-time faculty at USC Union carry a normal teaching load of 12 contact hours per semester, with the opportunity for a course reduction to pursue scholarship over the academic year. In both domains, teaching and scholarship, faculty receive significant support from the campus and Palmetto College. Faculty scholarship is supported by a healthy travel budget provided by the Union campus, allowing faculty to present their work at conferences all over the country, and even internationally. In supporting faculty in these ways, it helps to enhance the students' experiences in the classroom and creates more opportunities for faculty to involve students in original research in a collaborative way as well. Students have benefited from this collaborative approach over the past few years. This past year, five students were awarded undergraduate research funds that supported their research endeavors during the summer months, under the guidance of a faculty mentor. These students have collaborated with faculty on projects such as verification of a Tsantsa and research investigating adverse childhood experiences and mental health in college students on two-year campuses. The Research Club on campus in Union aims to facilitate these collaborations even further.

Additionally, faculty have access to a variety of teaching workshops, webinars, and trainings that are made available to them throughout the year, in large part by the Center for Teaching Excellence in Columbia, as well as locally on the USC Union campus. Multiple grants are made available through Palmetto College for online course development and training. For example, during this time period, faculty engaged in two one-credit hour professional development courses. An independent study course for all faculty and staff was offered during the Spring 2021 semester to provide employees with important information on how to better serve our students across campus units. This 1-credit, 100% asynchronous, self-paced course covered the following topics: academic advisor training and development, students with disabilities and campus services, scholarships and financial aid, hiring best practices concerning building an inclusive and accessible workplace, financial literacy in the classroom, and mental health first aid. In Fall 2020, another

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independent study course for all faculty and staff was offered to provide employees with important information on how to maintain a safe and healthy work environment during the COVID-19 pandemic.

***Strategic Priority 3: Create new pathways to research excellence in order to become Association of American universities eligible.***

This strategic priority is linked to two distinct goals:

1. Promote research excellence and innovation through enhancement of Phase I indicators.
2. Promote research excellence and innovation through enhancement of Phase II indicators.

While this strategic priority does not directly relate to our campus since USC Union is an Associate degree-granting, two-year regional campus within the larger USC-system, as mentioned above, our faculty contribute to research excellence by remaining consistently productive in their scholarly pursuits, despite significant teaching and service loads. Specifically, USC Union faculty produced 3 books/chapters, 4 book reviews, 7 peer-reviewed academic journal articles, 8 international/national conference presentations, 9 regional conference presentations, 13 local/invited talks, 10 pieces of creative writing or visual arts work, 9 scholarly journal reviews, 7 funded grants, and a substantial number of internal grant and article reviews during AY 2020-2021. Support of their scholarly work, which informs their teaching and opens up opportunities for scholarly involvement of students outside the classroom, will continue to be available from Palmetto College and from the Union campus. The Union campus in particular will continue to support faculty travel to present their work, and will continue attempts to re-establish funding for a USC Union Research and Productive Scholarship fund to locally support faculty scholarly activity over the summer months

***Strategic Priority 4: Cultivate a more diverse, equitable and inclusive campus culture where every individual, regardless of background, has the full opportunity to flourish and thrive.***

This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Improve the relative racial/ethnic and gender representation of our student body, staff and faculty.
2. Ensure that there is equity for all students and staff and faculty members across key measures of success.
3. Create, promote, support and assess a campus culture/climate that embodies our Carolinian Creed and makes every member of our university community feel that they are valued and affirmed.

On the Union campus, these goals are addressed by focusing on finding ways to improve campus climate and inclusion. Purchase of a license for TAO Self-Help/Self-Enroll online mental health resources, through the end of the 2020-2021 academic year, has provided all students, faculty, and staff with free, unlimited, and anonymous use of its full suite of online mental health modules. This includes resources that can help with issues of anxiety, depression, civility, mindfulness, etc. Note that this is not diagnostic, nor do these self-help resources constitute therapy, but instead are intended to provide self-guided resources to help USC Union students and personnel to learn more about these topics and gain tools for helping themselves to improve in these areas on their own. We also revived the Care Team, which is charged with implementing policies that address student activities/behaviors that are disruptive to the mission of the campus, as well as connecting students that exhibit suicidal, self-injurious, erratic, or other concerning behaviors with the resources they may need.

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During the current academic year, we have also developed a new Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion committee, which performs the following functions: 1.) commits to the advocacy of a campus environment that addresses issues of diversity and include that will promote and maintain a supportive learning environment for all; 2.) creates a campus community that focuses on initiatives, curriculum, events, and activities that promote policies and values that are in accordance with the Carolinian Creed “discourage(s) bigotry, while striving to learn from differences in people, ideas and opinions”; 3.) recommends institutional policies that stand for positive action in affirming the rights of all persons, regardless of category, and aim to dismantle institutionalized racism and discrimination wherever it is found. One of the first strategies implemented by this committee, is the requirement for all potential faculty hires to submit a diversity and inclusion statement with their application materials to ensure that these potential hires are committed to cultivating an inclusive and diverse campus environment.

Some of the ways that the campus has worked to make this campus a more efficient and enjoyable place to work includes offering important professional development opportunities for faculty and staff. For example, during the current academic year, faculty and staff were presented with several development professional opportunities focusing on climate and inclusion during the current academic year, of which several participated. For example, during the Fall 2020 semester, several of our faculty and staff participated in Safe Zone training, sponsored by the UofSC Office of Multicultural Student Affairs, which provided participants with the opportunity to learn about LGBTQ+ identities, gender and sexuality, and examine factors related prejudice and discrimination. Several faculty members also participated in the Carolina Intercultural Training webinar, sponsored by the UofSC International Student Services Office, which aimed to help participants understand the services of International Student Services, examine models of understanding cultural differences, identify aspects of cultural values, beliefs, or attitudes, including their own, apply various methods of communication to better navigate cross-cultural misunderstandings with diverse populations on campus, and describe personal action steps to creating a more inclusive environment for international populations at UofSC. The USC Union Associate Dean has also participated in several trainings related to inclusion such as a team dynamics, creating positive group norms, and building cohesive teams workshops, as part of the UofSC Division of Human Resources course called “Managing High Performing Teams.”

***Strategic Priority 5: Harness the Power, attributes and institutional diversity of an integrated and interoperative university system that enhances access, success and affordability for every eligible S.C. student.***

This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Develop an internal university system governance structure that establishes high-impact autonomy, service excellence and consistent policies while optimizing performance.
2. Establish an integrated online program management enterprise that maximizes access and affordability for both traditional and nontraditional students in S.C. and beyond.
3. Leverage the university system to provide accelerated, lower-cost multidegree options for students.

USC Union is committed to providing students within our service area and beyond with high-quality, affordable education. USC Union tuition rate is \$3,579 (resident status, less than 75 hours accrued) per semester, which is the same tuition rate as the other 3 Palmetto College Campuses (Lancaster, Salkehatchie, and Sumter). This tuition for the 4-year degree programs offered through Palmetto College



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is \$5,199 (resident status) per semester, which is lower than the closest senior campus (Upstate – \$5,604, resident status) and the main campus in Columbia (\$6,144 resident status). The four Palmetto College Campuses work together with PC Central and University officials to maintain this lower cost. It should be noted that a lower tuition is but one factor in assuring affordability as students enrolled in our programs remain in their respective locales, therefore achieving the efficiencies of not having to “uproot” to pursue a baccalaureate degree.

***Strategic Priority 6: Spur innovation and economic development through impactful community partnerships.***

This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Create future opportunities in research, education and scholarship through state, federal and industry partnerships.
2. Be an engine for business development in the state of South Carolina.
3. Expand community partnerships to create business opportunities, develop new relationships and increase experiential learning.

On the Union campus, these goals are addressed by focusing on finding ways to enhance the educational experience through meaningful partnerships with community organizations and institutions. We are connected to the community through internships that our students take on as part of work-study assignments or as part of internships in fulfillment of degree requirements for BOL/BLS via Palmetto College. As our sports teams become more established they will also find new ways to engage with the community, as they play their home games in Union and in Jonesville, and occupy much of the privately run student housing options around campus.

***Strategic Priority 7: Provide a sustainable campus infrastructure – physical, virtual, fundraising and administrative – that supports academic excellence and preeminent student life.***

This strategic priority is link to five distinct goals:

1. Provide a physical campus that supports the academic and student life needs of the modern and future university while ensuring the safety of the university community.
2. Provide state-of-the-art virtual infrastructure that supports delivery of academic content and facilitates highly competitive research.
3. Grow fundraising and external funding activities to significantly impact and improve the university’s capital, scholarship and academic programs.
4. Ensure administrative activity is focused on innovation, preparedness and increasing transparency.
5. Promote a framework for national leadership in institutional sustainability.

The Union campus continues to make improvements to the infrastructure and campus resources to increase access for students in our degree programs locally and throughout Palmetto College. All three distance education delivery rooms recently received newly updated technology, both in Union and in Laurens, enhancing the two-way broadcasting experience for faculty and students in that format across locations. All other classrooms on campus in Union were upfitted with new Promethean Boards to replace the aging projector classroom technology. Additionally, the catalog of online course offerings continues to expand to accommodate students who cannot attend classes in person, particularly during the current COVID-19 pandemic, due to a variety of reasons such as geography, work schedules, or

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other limiting factors. For students who are on campus, improvements to existing facilities continue to make for a more enjoyable experience and one that makes it easier to focus on their learning inside and outside of the classroom.

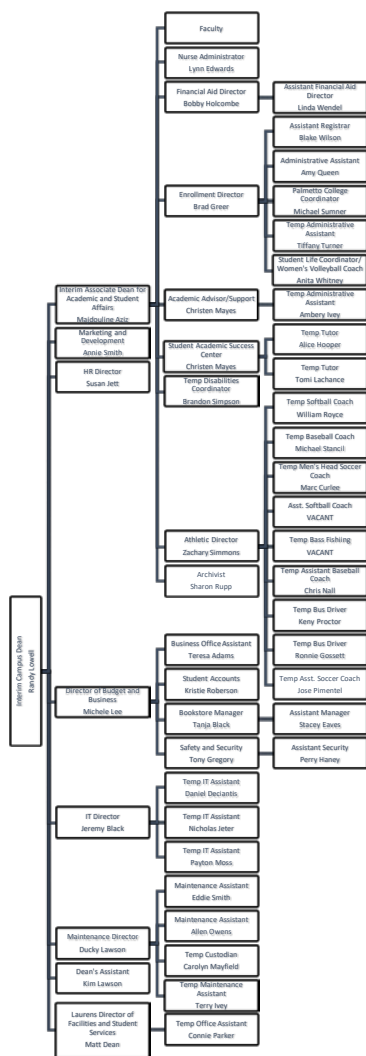
For the Union campus, in its recent 2020 rankings of Best Community Colleges in South Carolina, Niche.com ranked USC Union at #3. The faculty and staff work hard to elevate the student experience, which is reflected by these recent rankings. Through prudent financial management, USC Union has been able to address deferred maintenance needs, improve the campus environment, and enhance its educational programs, while maintaining a stable financial position. In turn, these expenditures for improvements have aided in the recruitment and retention of students, as demonstrated by the trending enrollment increases for the past 3 years. For FY20, the campus achieved a general operating carryforward fund balance of \$1,402,169. For Fiscal Year 2021, the campus achieved a general operating carryforward fund balance of \$1,459,718.33. The goal is to maintain a 3 month operating reserve in the event there is a crucial and immediate need or severe reduction in funding. USC Union continually strives to provide exceptional student services, innovative and engaging educational experiences, and a safe, secure and aesthetically pleasing environment. The campus is able to accomplish this through conservative and strategic budget planning.

***Strategic Priority 8: Build teams that win with excellence and character***

This strategic priority is linked with three distinct goals:

1. NCAA Teams will compete at the upper level of their potential at all times.
2. UofSC will ensure holistic development of student-athletes, measured by graduation, academic achievement and student-athlete wellness.
3. Create and foster a campus environment that drives a winning attitude while instilling character and integrity in competition and in life.

USC Union is a member of junior college athletics (NJCAA) for baseball, softball, and men's/women's soccer, along with intercollegiate marksmanship, club bass fishing and e-gaming. During this time period, we also had e-gaming and volleyball club sports. However, in the coming year, women's volleyball will be elevated to its newly formed NJCAA division. As a campus, we place a high emphasis on developing well-rounded individuals in all areas and are committed to high-level achievement in our student-athletes' academic and athletic endeavors. As such, we have set and oblige by student-athlete academic eligibility standards and ensure that our student-athletes comply with policies governed by the NJCAA. In order to maintain these standards, we have developed several practices that guide our work with student-athletes. Academically, athletes are supported in various ways including mandatory study halls for all athletes to ensure they remain on the path towards academic success. Typically, these study halls are held in the Student Academic Success Center on campus where students have access to computer and peer-to-peer and professional tutoring services. However, due to COVID-19 restrictions, we were unable to host study halls in the Center for this time period but plan on resuming these study halls next semester. Student-athletes are also advised by advisors within the athletic department who understand the unique experience of college athletes and can not only assist them in developing a plan of study to help them reach their academic goals, but also consider the challenges that these students experience in terms of the academic-athletic balance. Aside from NJCAA policies and eligibility criteria, all coaches have set rules and expectations for student-athletes to ensure that they grow and develop as the year progresses. Coaches also conduct end of the year evaluations to inform players on how they performed during that year and what they can do to improve.
