AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

At the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC), we have a people first approach to all that we do. This begins with the core function of our agency and its employees which is to serve as advocates for the people of South Carolina.

DHEC exists to improve the health and quality of life for every South Carolinian by:

- 1. helping the people of our state improve and maintain their health,
- 2. ensuring our residents have a safe, clean environment where they can live and thrive, and
- 3. supporting a robust economy that provides opportunities for all.

Supporting a People First Approach

We support a people first approach each day at DHEC. This includes:

- Enhancing access to great public health and healthcare services and a clean environment, with a focus on supporting our rural areas and communities that have been traditionally underserved.
- Helping provide our residents with the evidence-based **information** needed to make informed decisions about their health and the environment around them.
- Ensuring South Carolinians have the **resources** they need to act on that knowledge and make positive changes in their lives and their communities.
- Supporting and facilitating environmentally responsible economic growth which provides South
 Carolinian businesses the opportunity to succeed and create well-paying jobs that provide health
 benefits to the residents of our state.

Working Together to Create a Healthier South Carolina

DHEC recognizes that we cannot do this work alone. We rely on and work with numerous private and public partners across the state to meet these goals.

DHEC's role is to facilitate and collaborate, lead, and provide health and environmental services to eliminate gaps in services and equity. This work includes, but is not limited to, a major focus on social determinants of health, health equity, and environmental justice to ensure all South Carolinians' benefit.

Working together with our many partners, DHEC makes a positive difference in the lives of every South Carolinian.

Leading by Example

The examples shared throughout this report spotlight how deeply committed DHEC is to working with our partners to maximize resources and improve the quality of health and environmental services in South Carolina.

<u>DHEC BY THE NUMBERS</u>: Our team's talents and dedication to public service improve the lives of South Carolinians every day. The agency performs countless important functions impacting nearly every citizen of our state. This includes preparing for and responding to emergent public health events like COVID-19, while ensuring that our day-to-day operations remain intact. These day-to-day activities are extensive. Here's a snapshot of what "business as usual" looks like for DHEC:

- In FY 2021, we had **7,692,573 clinical client encounters** in our local health departments, including:
 - o 382,150 Women, Infant and Children (WIC) visits

- o 63,852 Preventive Health visits
- o 7,246,517 Immunization visits
- Our infectious disease experts investigated a total of 78 acute disease outbreaks in 2020. These
 investigations are separate from COVID-19 case investigations. During this time period, our staff also
 received and reviewed 543,206 reports of acute diseases (including laboratory and morbidity reports).
- In FY 2021, more than **3 million laboratory tests** were performed by our Public Health Laboratory (PHL), including the evaluation of **79 clinical isolates** for enhanced multi-drug antibiotic resistance. The lab has also been a leader in identifying COVID-19 variants in South Carolina.
- In addition, more than 7.9 million COVID-19 laboratory reports were received by PHL.
- In FY 2021, more than 115,013 requests for birth and death records were received.
- In 2020, our Environmental Affairs team conducted over **117,000 inspections**, covering programs as diverse as recreational waters, underground storage tanks and air quality.
- During this time, Environmental Affairs also managed more than 123,000 active environmental permits
 for asbestos projects, private wells, septic tanks, industrial storm water general permits, mines and
 more.
- In addition, our Bureau of Environmental Health Service team responded to and investigated 14,792 complaints, ranging from rabies exposures to open burning to emergency response spills and more.
- Further, over 25,000 submissions were received as part of the Lancaster-York Odor Reports and New Indy investigation.
- During FY 2021, our Healthcare Quality team conducted **7,162 inspections and investigations** of health facilities, providers and equipment. Other notable numbers for Healthcare Quality are:
 - o 2,447 new prescription monitoring program (PMP) users registered
 - o 43,127,011 PMP patient queries completed
 - 292 law enforcement officers (11,740 total to date) and 658 firefighters (2,755 total to date) trained to carry and administer naloxone to combat opioid overdoses
 - o 119 Certificate of Need (CON) decisions issued

RESPONDING TO THE PANDEMIC AND RECENT SURGE IN COVID-19 CASES

One of the greatest challenges before us today remains our fight against COVID-19. At DHEC, our number one priority has been and continues to be to save lives. This includes working with our partners across all levels to end the COVID-19 pandemic through providing:

- widely available, equitable access to safe, effective vaccines
- timely, accurate, and evidence-based information about the disease and prevention measures.

Thanks to this progress and increases in vaccine supply, over 4,554,466 million doses of COVID-19 vaccine have been given in South Carolina to date. This includes over 2,437,530 million, or 56.7 percent, of South Carolina residents 12 years and older who have received at least their first dose and more than 2,052,467 million who have completed their vaccination series. In addition to vaccinations, testing remains critical to preventing the spread of COVID-19. Since the virus was first identified in the Palmetto State, DHEC, Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC), South Carolina Hospital Association (SCHA) and many other organizations have screened and tested more than 9.5 million tests for COVID-19 have been completed.

While progress continues, we recognize we can't defeat COVID-19 alone. We must continue to work with partners at all levels to make sure that safe and effective vaccines are available in all corners of our state to all people. This includes removing barriers to access, opening doors to help acknowledge and address hesitancy, and reducing vaccine resistance.

Due to the rise of the Delta variant and lagging vaccination rates, we have seen a recent uptick in cases. To date, more than 740,634 South Carolinians have tested positive for COVID-19 and 10,684 have lost their lives to this

deadly disease. These numbers, especially the deaths, are very concerning. South Carolinians can be reassured of our state's ongoing commitment to increasing vaccination rates and ending the pandemic. An example of this is the Community Vaccination Clinic (CVC) at Columbia Place Mall. The FEMA-supported site ran from April 14 through June 9 and administered more than 21,000 vaccinations. Other examples of our COVID-19 vaccination efforts include the Shot with a Chaser campaign, our homebound vaccination program, and our upcoming mobile vaccination units.

The pandemic also has placed an important spotlight on existing inequities within our communities. These inequities have resulted in disproportionate access to and quality of service for many who live, work, and play in the Palmetto State.

ADDRESSING ENVIRONMENTAL, HEALTHCARE QUALITY AND PUBLIC HEALTH CHALLENGES

While we continue the work needed to stop COVID-19 and ultimately end the pandemic, DHEC recognizes there is much more work ahead to achieve our vision of **healthy people living in healthy communities.** In addition to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, DHEC:

- Coordinated, through the agency's Office of Rural Water, with local and national partners in supporting long-term solutions to aging systems and providing technical assistance to small rural water systems;
- Developed the EJ Strong Disaster Risk Reduction training program to help underserved communities build resilience to be better prepared for, respond to, and bounce back from disasters like hurricanes, flooding, chemical releases and pandemics;
- Continued our robust compliance and enforcement activities in Environmental Affairs throughout the state; and
- Provided communities and stakeholders with opportunities to engage in over 40 virtual and hybrid public meetings, public hearings and workgroup discussions for proposed permitting decisions, regulatory considerations and current issues for programs and bureaus across Environmental Affairs.
- Continued its work with the S.C. Department of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Services (DAODAS) and State Fire Academy to train law enforcement officers and firefighters to identify and treat opioid overdoses by administering life-saving naloxone. As of July 31, 2021, over 11,448 law enforcement officers and 2,097 firefighters have been trained and 2,952 doses of naloxone have been administered.
- Performed newborn laboratory screening for the majority of disorders on HHS's Recommended Uniform
 Screening Panel at its PHL. PHL began performing screening for Pompe disease and Hurler syndrome in
 February 2021 and are in the process of adding screening for Krabbe disease and Spinal Muscular
 Atrophy.

We also are currently in the process of enhancing our technological infrastructure to better serve our residents. This includes implementing a new:

- licensing software solution to replace our more than 30-year-old legacy systems across five bureaus in Healthcare Quality, and
- Electronic Health Record system in our clinical areas which will allow us to deliver quality, comprehensive care to clients in less time with easier access to their health records and documentation.
- online platform for environmental permitting, licensing, registration, reporting, monitoring, inspections, complaints, compliance, and enforcement called ePermitting. Currently, 12 environmental programs are using ePermitting, three of which were implemented in FY21, while five are in the process of migrating to the platform.

Further, DHEC remains committed to promoting a culture of continuous improvement. This includes:

• achieving national public health accreditation status from the Public Health Accreditation Board, and

• being one of only 15 agencies recognized by FEMA as "RadResponder Ready" (out of 1,738 agencies eligible) for meeting national best practices for responding to radiological events.

To continue to build a brighter tomorrow, DHEC recognizes that we must evaluate our current structure and services to ensure we are able to maximize our resources, enhance services when and where needed, and best serve all South Carolinians. This includes a renewed focus on building and sustaining our talented team, reinvesting in our infrastructure, and strengthening our partnerships across the state.

INVESTING IN OUR PEOPLE

To address the challenges of today and tomorrow, we must first invest in our employees, to ensure that our agency and the state continue to have the capacity and expertise needed to deliver high-quality environmental protection, healthcare quality, and public health services across South Carolina.

Thanks to the support of the state legislature, DHEC received \$2.7 million of its requested approximately \$5 million in state funding during the past legislative session. This is a significant increase and will help us continue to retain and recruit great people on our team. At the same time, agency leadership recognizes that more must be done to address salary inequities and improve retentions. Efforts are currently under way to further review and support future recruitment and retention efforts. As part of this agency priority, we are aggressively working to implement several succession planning, recruiting and retention initiatives designed to make DHEC the premier employer in South Carolina. This includes:

- Working with the S.C. Department of Administration (DOA) to obtain increased hiring salary ranges for key positions to compete with the private sector
- Implementing a comprehensive, electronic talent management system that includes modules for succession planning, onboarding and performance review
- Piloting a position-based succession plan that will focus on critical roles that are occupied by retirement eligible employees and other critical positions that could impact business operations
- Developing the agency's Leadership Excellence Achievement Program (LEAP), an employee training program designed to identify and develop future agency leaders, as well as supporting other internal and external development programs like:
 - LinkedIn Learning, new employee orientations, 360 evaluations, a new internal mentorship program, and the Certified Public Manager Course and Associate Public Manager Course.

Other recruitment efforts currently underway by the agency include:

- Leading DHEC Career Workshops at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HCBUs), colleges, and universities on a quarterly basis
- Increasing the talent pool by cultivating customized internships and job shadowing experiences
- Conducting onsite tours and hosting virtual career fairs, including with the SC National Guard
- Partnering with HBCUs, LGBTQIA agencies, SC Able, and veteran entities to promote a diverse talent pool
- Utilizing SC Works and workforce development programs to source paid interns and veterans, at no cost to DHEC
- Expanding DHEC's presence in external job boards and social media platforms
- Tracking job fair attendance, applicants who applied following, and measuring success
- Utilizing neogov's talent sourcing tool to strategically recruit top talent
- Partnering with Midlands Technical College to create customized interview trainings and best practices for hiring managers
- Educating staff on the cost of turnover and how to properly screen applicants prior to an interview

- Conducting neogov trainings in partnership with the DOA regarding posting protocol, formatting, and best practices
- Shortening the length of hiring time

EVALUATING OUR SERVICES TO BUILD A BETTER TOMORROW

In addition to investing in our people, we must also provide time to thoughtfully reflect on who we are as an agency and where we need to be to best serve all South Carolinians. This requires us to conduct a thorough evaluation of our structure, mission, responsibilities, and services. To support this effort, DHEC established the Task Force to Strengthen the Health and Promote the Environment of South Carolina (SHaPE SC).

Comprised of a diverse group of over 50 stakeholders, SHaPE SC is charged with making recommendations about how to best improve the quality of life for all South Carolinians by protecting and promoting the health of the public and the environment. Specifically, the task force was tasked with two primary goals:

- 1. Evaluate the state of South Carolina's current organizational framework and responsibilities related to the provision of health and environmental protection services.
- 2. Make recommendations to the Board, General Assembly, and Governor about how to best maximize state resources to improve the quality of life for all South Carolinians by protecting and promoting the health of the public and the environment.

Over the course of the next two months, SHaPE SC will continue to evaluate how health and environmental services are currently being delivered in South Carolina, both within and outside of DHEC. SHaPE SC will then draft recommendations which will be reviewed by the Board before being sent to the General Assembly and Governor. The task force plans to submit its recommendations to the Board for review no later than November. The recommendations will also be used by DHEC to determine areas of improvement that can be acted on immediately.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

I. Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies:

DHEC continues the process of implementing agency-wide risk assessment tactics and developing appropriate mitigation strategies. If DHEC does not accomplish its goals and objectives, risks categorized at the highest level could have a substantial impact on public health and the environment in South Carolina. Examples include: disease outbreak; environmental contamination; increased mortality; decreased or delayed medical care and diagnosis; increased medical costs; decreased oversight; and the inability to respond to a public health or environmental disaster.

Strategies to address the above impacts include partnering with other agencies and private entities whose missions and visions align with the examples outlined above. State partnership examples include: hospitals and physicians; medical associations; Rural Infrastructure Authority for water and sewer; Clemson Extension Service for food safety; S.C. Department of Health and Human Services for public health; S.C. Department of Natural Resources for environmental affairs; S.C. Emergency Management Division for emergency preparedness and response; and state colleges/universities for laboratories. Additional state health and environmental agencies and laboratories are available as needed. Federal assistance could potentially be provided through U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Federal Emergency Management Agency, National Regulatory Commission, U.S. Health and Human Services and U.S. Department of Agriculture.

In addition, DHEC's Office of Internal Audits (OIA) develops an annual audit plan using a risk-based approach. The annual risk assessment process is conducted by OIA to facilitate the development of a five-year audit plan. The plan is prepared annually each fiscal year based on a risk assessment and input received from the Executive Leadership Team and agency needs. The objective of the risk assessment is to identify divisions, programs areas, offices or processes that pose the greatest risk to the agency and then to align internal audit resources, where appropriate to best help the Agency achieve its objectives. The audit plan is reviewed by the Executive Leadership Team and the Board, with input and final approval from the Agency Director.



Narrative FY 2020-2021 8


