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AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The Public Service Commission of South Carolina (Commission or PSC) regulates the rates and services of investor-owned public utilities in the State of South Carolina. With over 100 years of service to the state of South Carolina, the PSC establishes just and reasonable standards for their rates and services.

The mission of the Public Service Commission of South Carolina is to serve the public by providing open and effective regulation and adjudication of the state's public utilities, through consistent administration of the law and regulatory process. The State Regulation of Public Utilities Review Committee serves as the joint legislative committee that oversees the operations of the Commission as a result of Act 175 of 2004 and is chaired by Senator Thomas Alexander.

In order for the Public Service Commission of South Carolina to carry out its mission, the Commission must be alert to and anticipate emerging issues in the industries it regulates, including federal regulatory developments. Maintaining effective communications with its stakeholders aided the Commission in achieving this goal.

Executive Summary of Achievements

Strategic Goal I: Optimize the Effectiveness of Commission Processes and Systems

- Phase IV of the Docket Management System Enhancement Project was completed, and Phase V implementation began.
- Regulation 103-811 was promulgated, allowing the Commission to employ, through contract or otherwise, third-party consultants or experts, ensuring an open and transparent process.
- The Commission continued to review its regulations pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. Section 1-23-120(J).

Strategic Goal II: Promote Operational Excellence & Transparency

- The Commission's social media accounts gained over 4,000 followers during the year, tripling the Agency's impressions.
- The PSC modified its website to comply with Act 214 of 2022 to clearly communicate pending transportation applications and maximum rates for Class E motor carriers.
- The Commission revised its public notices of filings and hearings to improve readability based on stakeholder input.

Strategic Goal III: Embrace Risk Management

- A risk assessment was conducted via a survey to employees. Opportunities for improvement were recognized regarding entry code best practices, confidential documents, and emergency plans.
- Emergency preparedness training and quizzes were conducted in the SCEIS Learning Management System.

Strategic Goal IV: Maintain Commitment to an Engaged Adjudicatory Process

- The PSC hosted several in-house educational sessions during the year, including: Avoided Cost Basics, Santee Cooper and Act 90, among other topics.
- Commissioners and Staff participated in over 500 hours of professional education.
- Annual Ethics Training was conducted in accordance with S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-3-30 (C).

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The Commission continued to improve its hearing procedures so as to provide the public with accessible, transparent, and effective regulation of public utilities and provide the public with clear information about the regulatory process and its decisions. In an effort to increase transparency and engagement with public utility consumers, the Commission continued the implementation of a more robust communications platform, including its SC Utility Consumer website, social media accounts, and advertisement campaign. Across all its social media accounts, the Commission has 8,971 followers, tripling the Agency’s impressions and almost doubling follower counts. The increase in followers is attributable to an ad campaign conducted throughout the year. The Commission has also continued to effectively utilize its livestreaming service for stakeholders to engage in the Commission’s hearings and meetings.

An ongoing goal of the Commission is to improve its operations through technological advances. As opportunities are identified, the Commission will investigate both costs and benefits before taking the appropriate actions.

The nation’s electric and gas industries are subject to a broad range of regulatory models across the country, and regulators have taken a number of measures to increase competition and investment. With growing pressure for the generation of energy using alternative energy sources, the Commission must effectively regulate these industries, safeguarding the ratepayers without unduly burdening the industries or stifling competition.

The public relies on the Commission’s online systems to access information related to its operations. The Commission must budget funds to support maintenance and development of the systems.

The Commission’s primary duty is to adjudicate cases involving the state’s investor-owned utilities. This past fiscal year, the Commission opened 452 new dockets, including non-docketed items, held 62 hearings, issued 366 orders, and 423 directive orders. In 2020-2021, the PSC issued 390 orders and 424 directive orders. A total of 6,867 matters was posted on the Commission’s Docket Management System (DMS). The Commission also held 53 Commission Business Meetings during the year.

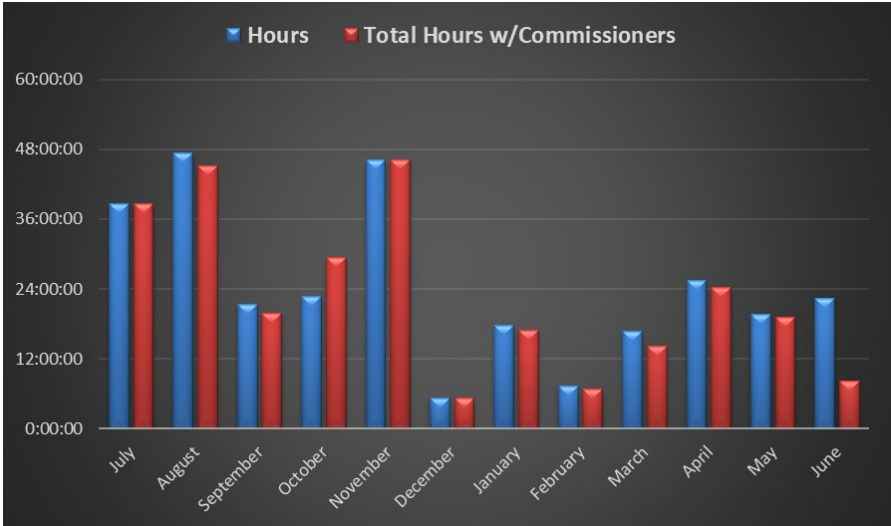

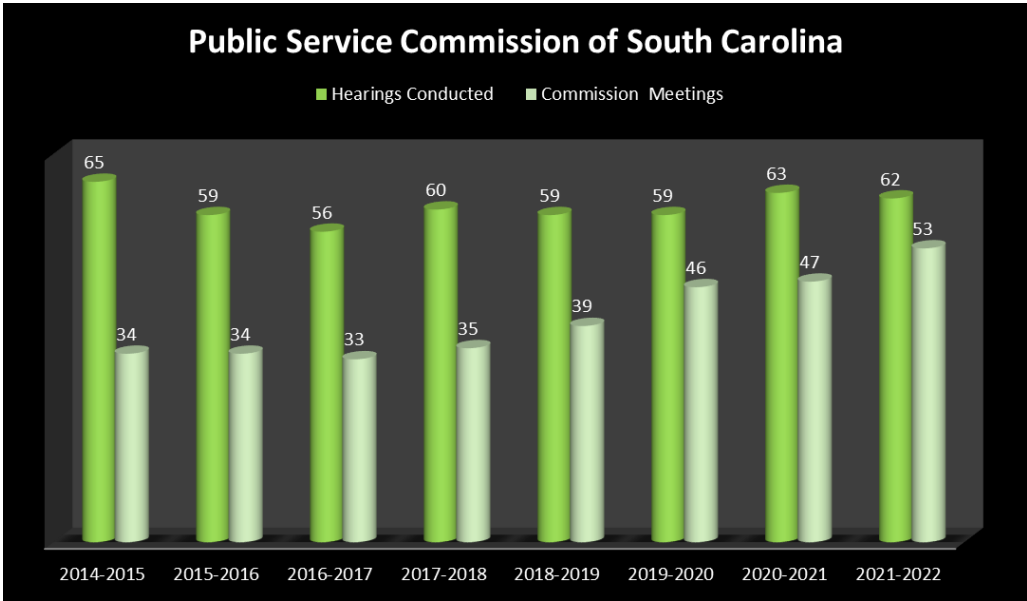

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The Commission began tracking the time spent in meetings and hearings during the fiscal year. Over 290 hours were spent in meetings, hearings, and workshops throughout the year. The figures below are broken down into two categories: total time and time with Commissioners presiding.



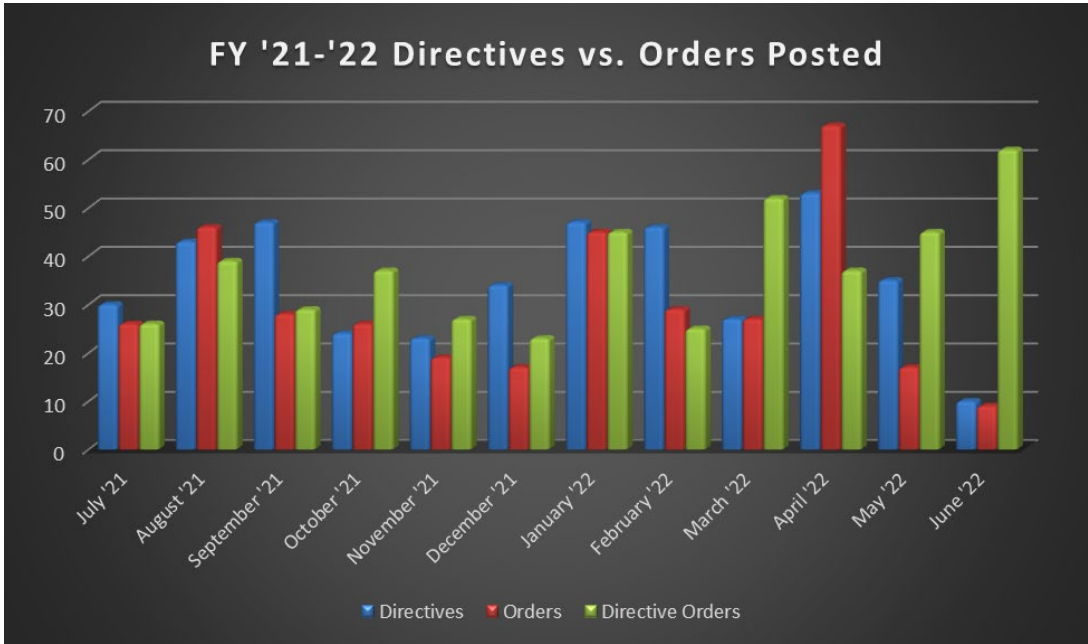
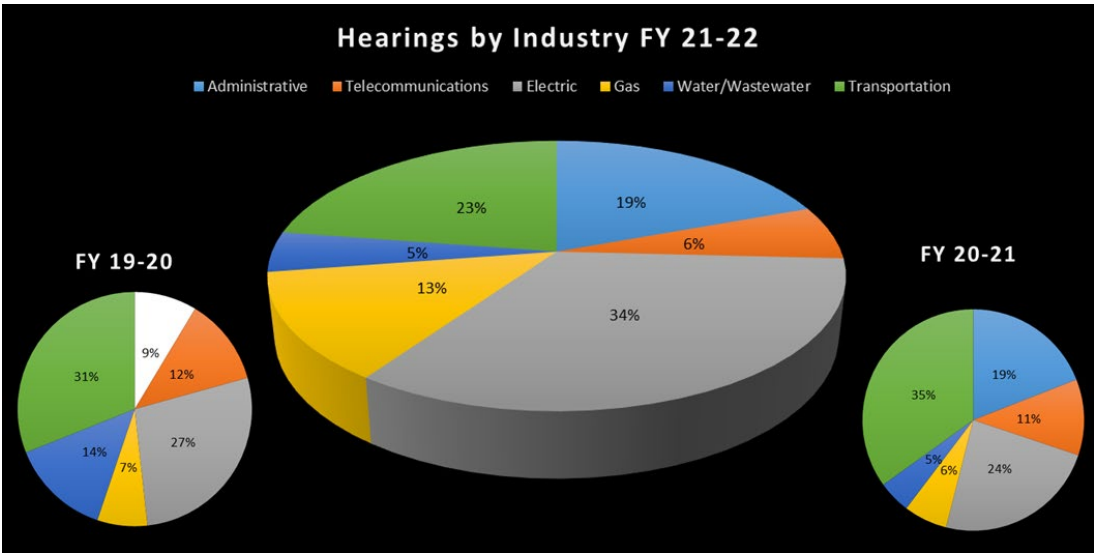
Total time equaled 290 hours and 52 minutes. Commissioners presided for 273 hours and 56 minutes of this total time.



The Commission’s hearings encompass the electric, gas, telecommunications, transportation, water, and wastewater industries. There continues to be a steady number of hearings within the electric industry due to the impact of new issues which must be addressed from a regulatory standpoint, including the SC Energy Freedom Act of 2019. Some of these issues include solar and energy efficiency programs, avoided cost methodologies and calculations, net energy metering programs and the value of customer generation, demand side management programs, and integrated resource plans. Commission Staff continued its review of Chapter 103 of S.C. Code of Regulations pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. Section 1-23-120(J). This

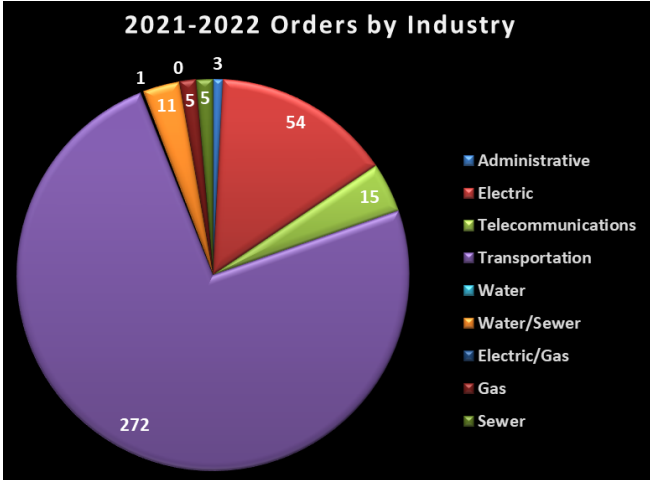
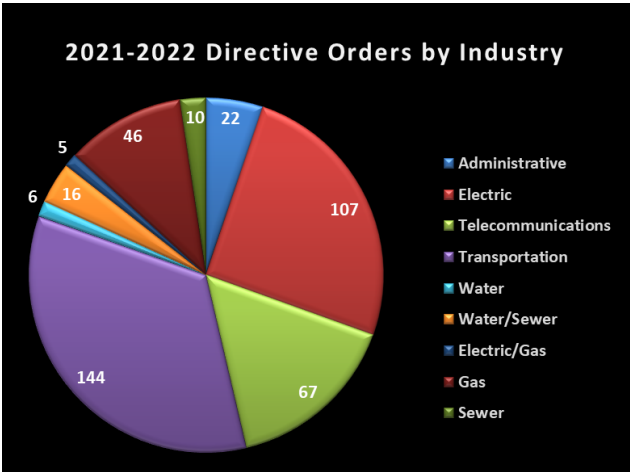
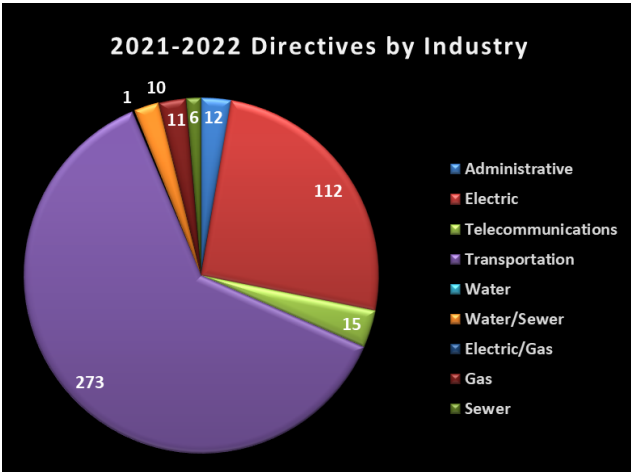
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ongoing review accounts for the continued increase in Administrative matters. **Appendix A** provides a breakdown of the types of hearings the Commission held throughout the year.



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The Commission issued 440 Directives, 423 Directive Orders, and 366 Orders throughout the fiscal year. The charts below breakdown this work product by industry.



The Commission remained active in national organizations, providing opportunities for involvement in emerging utility issues. The benefits from attendance at national and regional regulatory conferences (NARUC, SEARUC, NRRI, etc.) and involvement in associated committees and related organizations are numerous, and this provides an important means of staying abreast of key issues in the regulated arena.

During the year, the PSC continued the implementation of its Docket Management System (DMS) eService Enhancement Project. The Project was initially planned to be implemented in four phases; however, over time additional DMS improvements have been identified, and milestones have been added to the Project. Phase IV testing was completed during the fiscal year. Phase V of the project began during the fiscal year and included a modified Notice of Electronic Filing (NEF) to include a hyperlink to the docket and documents filed, reduction of NEF emails by creating a daily NEF report for public comments/protests, the ability to file Excel spreadsheets, and the requirement to file searchable PDF documents. The enhancements are live, but the PSC’s Information Technology staff is working to troubleshoot some post-production issues. The Project will continue with identified improvements in fiscal year 2022-2023, with the completion of Phase V and the creation of milestones for Phase VI.

The Commission continued to execute its robust digital communications program during the year to increase the transparency of the Agency’s operations. This program included the use of mobile-text alerts, digital newsletters, livestreaming of Commission hearings and meetings, use of social media, and an increased public communications plan through the Commission’s SC Utility Consumer website and blog. The Commission uses the SC Utility Consumer website as a tool to increase public awareness and knowledge about the PSC’s role in the community and how it serves the citizens of South Carolina. The user-friendly site educates the public on the Commission’s role, services, and processes in an easily digestible format. The website’s blog hosts informative articles with money and energy saving tips for South Carolina’s ratepayers and showcases consumer-relevant Commission activities – from hearings and other Commission events to customer public hearings. During the fiscal year, thirty-seven blog posts were made on the PSC’s website and SC Utility Consumer site. Visitors read posts about upcoming public hearings, allowable ex parte briefings, revisions to transportation applications, and avoided cost FAQs, among other topics. In compliance with Act 214 of 2022, the Commission modified its website to clearly communicate pending transportation applications and maximum rates for household goods movers and

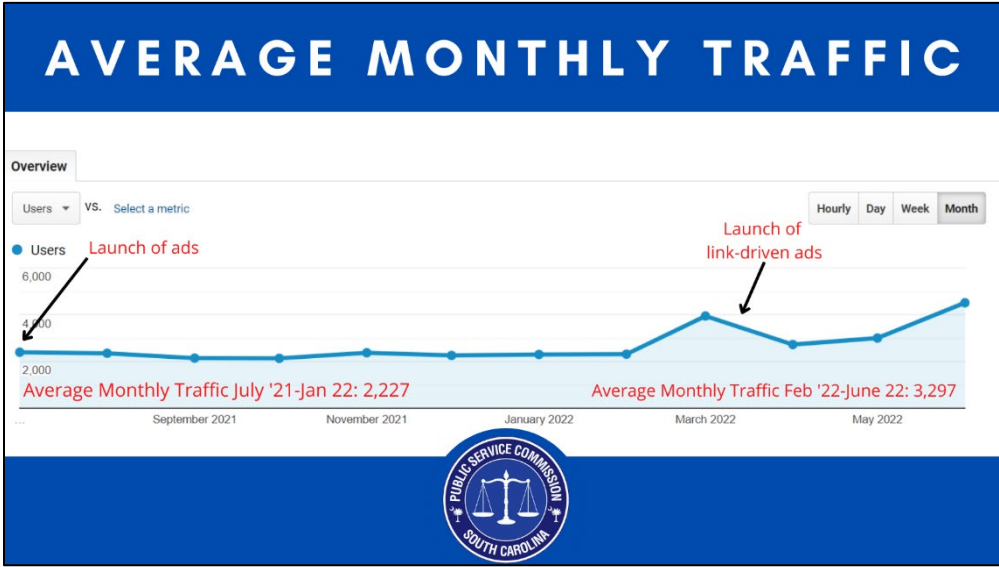
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hazardous waste for disposal carriers. All of these efforts improved the transparency of the Commission’s operations.

The PSC continued its coordinated ad campaign to drive traffic to its websites and its social media content. The campaign resulted in enormous growth for the PSC Facebook page, where a significant amount of public outreach is conducted. Across all its social media accounts, the Commission has 8,971 followers, tripling the Agency’s impressions and almost doubling follower counts. The following table depicts the increase in the PSC’s social media followers over time.

The PSC also tracks the success of these campaigns by monitoring website visitors. The 2021-2022 advertisement campaign shifted the Commission’s approach from a follower campaign to a conversion campaign. This means that once the Commission reached its targeted follower count, the campaign began linking to PSC websites. As a result of the campaign, average monthly traffic on the PSC website went from 2,277 (July ’21-January ’22) to 3,297. The following graph illustrates the difference in traffic to the PSC website based on the two campaign approaches.



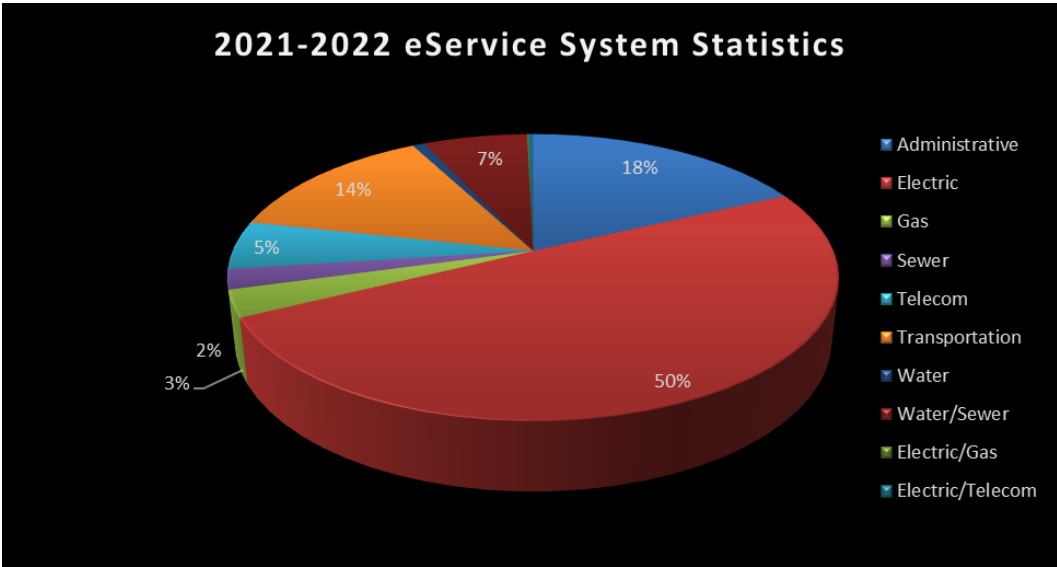
During the fiscal year, the Commission continued livestreaming its Commission Business Meetings, hearings, and training sessions. Statistics for the livestream service are provided below. Livestream viewers watched 9,227 events (live and on-demand) during the year. The decrease in traffic may be a factor of the pandemic, with more parties involved in dockets watching and participating virtually in the previous fiscal year, or it may be related to less media attention to PSC dockets during the

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fiscal year, resulting in less public awareness. The livestream traffic will continue to be tracked to further analyze its trends over time.

During the 2021-2022 fiscal year, the Commission continued to use its eService System to serve matters and orders to parties of record in a docket. The system continues to be an effective and efficient resource for delivering matters and orders in a timely manner. The following chart and table provide a breakdown of the items served via the system by industry. The electric industry continues to be the most active. Electric matters stemming from the SC Energy Freedom Act, including avoided cost methodologies and calculations and community solar programs, and fuel cases are the reasons for the dominance of electric related matters and orders served via the system during the year. The Commission continued to conduct a review of its regulations in accordance with S.C. Code Ann. § 1-23-120(J), accounting for the increase in Administrative matters served during the fiscal year.

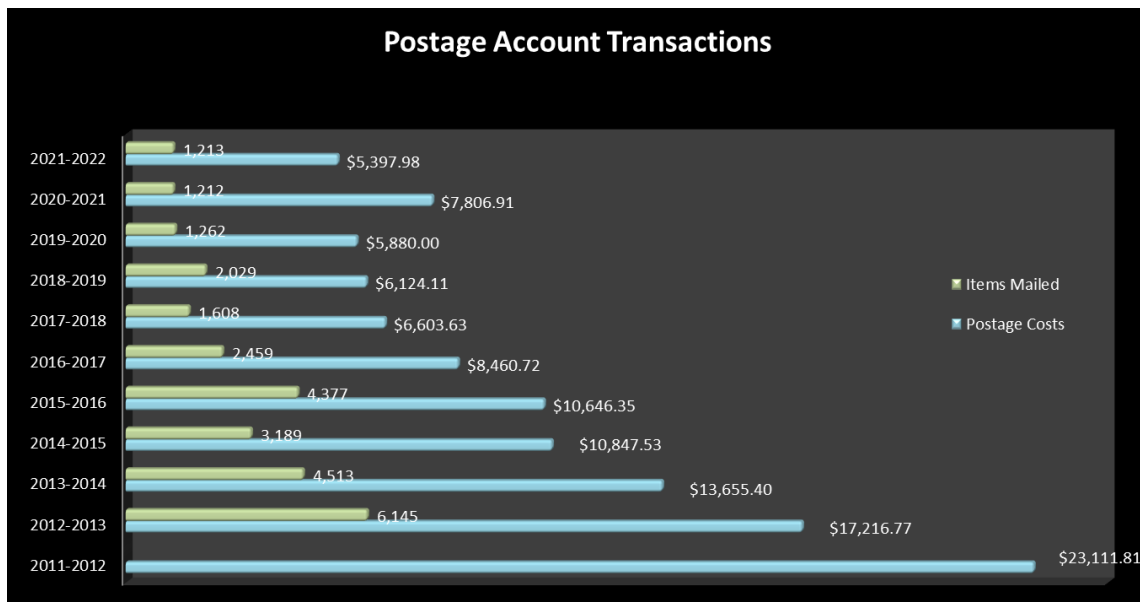

Since the introduction of the eService System, the Commission has seen a significant reduction in postage costs. The following Postage Account Transactions chart shows the reduction of over \$17,700 in postage transactions over the past eleven years and includes the number of items mailed throughout these years. Over time, the chart illustrates a meaningful decline in costs. This significant cost reduction is attributable to the Commission’s eService System and highlights the benefit of its use.



The Public Service Commission performs an annual exercise of developing performance measures in the areas that are critical to the successful operation of the Agency. The Agency’s Strategic Plan will serve as guidance in the performance measurement development process.

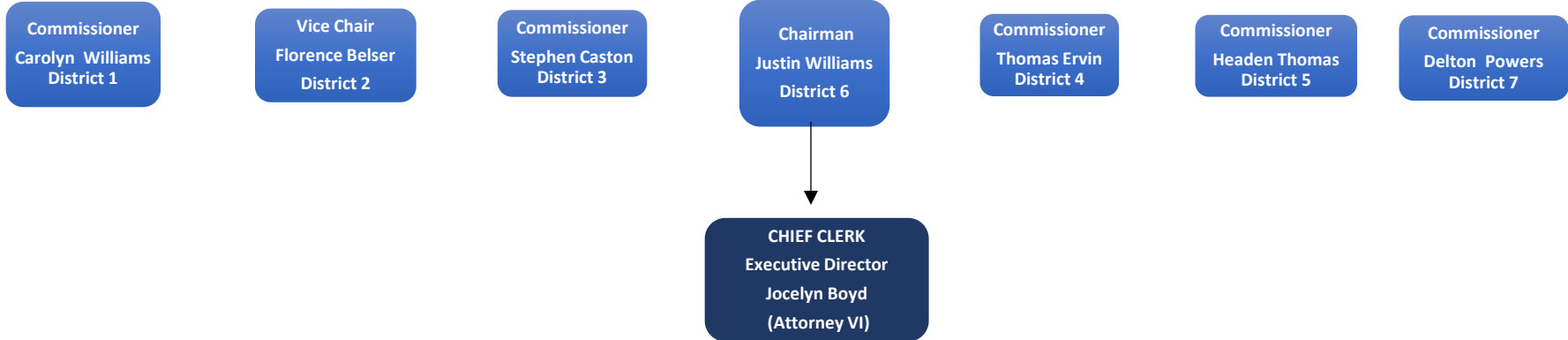
