




- 1. Board of Trustee members were engaged throughout the year in the direction and development of the seven-year strategic plan's first-year framework.
- 2. Developed and codified the process for hiring and deployment of full-time and part-time employees (faculty and staff).
- 3. Recruited Lander University's first Vice President for Student Experience and Quality Assurance.
- 4. Restructured and reorganized the administrative units that support students.
- 5. Increased the Fall 2022 first-time freshman retention rate by 3%, exceeding a goal of 2%.
- 6. Recruited a new Vice President for University Advancement.
- 7. Developed and approved four new high-demand, market-driven programs:
 - Bachelor of Science (BS), Digital Media Production
 - Bachelor of Science (BS), Medical Biology
 - Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT), Multi-Categorical Special Education
 - Master of Science (MS), Exercise Science (Emphases in Sport Performance and Rehabilitation, Clinical Exercise Physiology, and Health and Wellness)
- 8. Increased the number of available parking spaces for students by 6%.

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AGENCY ORGANIZATIONAL CHART









