

#### **AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS**

- **I. The Department's Purpose:** The South Carolina Department of Veterans' Affairs exists to serve this state's Veterans, service members, and their families, and to promote the value Veterans bring to their communities and their fellow citizens.
- **II.** Scope of Report. In FY24-25, the Department focused its efforts in three primary areas: 1) execution of the FY24-25 Action Plan (objectives and outcomes are summarized in the chart below); 2) establishing effective oversight of the five contractor-operated Veteran homes; and 3) setting the conditions for the transfer of Stone Pavilion Veteran Home from the Office of Mental Health (previously Department of Mental Health) on 1 July, 2025.



**III. Agency Strategies, Goals, and Outcomes.** Our strategic plan includes four main lines of effort with five associated strategic objectives. For ease of navigation, Lines of Effort are depicted in dark blue text and Strategic Objectives are depicted in light blue text.

Line of Effort 1: **Assist** Veterans and their families in obtaining the services and benefits to which they are entitled.

- 1) <u>Strategic Objective 1</u>: Build and sustain administrative policies, procedures, and programs to assist Veterans and their families in effectively and efficiently obtaining their entitled services and benefits.
- a) <u>Claims and Appeals</u>. In FY24-26, the department and the 46 County Veterans' Affairs Offices provided assistance to 21,611 previously unserved Veterans and assisted in the filing of 9,626 federal claims.
  - Service officers assigned to the department filed a total of 1,172 Veteran claims.
  - County offices filed a total of 9,626 Veteran claims the department can verify, and an
    additional 2,808 Veteran claims the department cannot verify. [The department can verify
    only those claims submitted through the state-provided electronics claims management
    system. For those counties that do not use this system, we rely upon their self-reporting.]

While it is possible to report the total value of federal benefits paid to South Carolina Veterans down to the county level, it is not possible to determine what portion of those payments came as a result of claims failed with the assistance of county or state agents. The Geographic Distribution of Expenditures report of the US Department of Veterans' Affairs indicates that in federal fiscal year 2023 (FY23), the latest year data is available, South Carolina Veterans received \$3.89 billion in compensation and pension benefits. The federal report does not differentiate between benefits paid as the result of a claim filed with or without the assistance of a county, state, or other agent.

Of note, compensation and pension benefits make up only a portion of the total federal funds committed to Veterans in each county. As depicted in Table 2, Veterans also receive federal educational benefits that are used for education and vocational training as well as federally funded medical care. Additionally, the construction and operation of US Department of Veterans' Affairs facilities injects federal funds into each county.

Support to Veterans at US Department of Veterans' Affairs Medical Centers. In FY24-25, state service officers at the US Department of Veterans' Affairs medical centers in Columbia submitted over 1,000 actions on behalf of Veterans receiving healthcare from the facility. Similarly, state service officers at the US Department of Veterans' Affairs medical center in North Charleston submitted 947 actions.

Support to Transitioning Active-Duty Members Stationed in South Carolina. In FY24-25, the department provided claims assistance to more than 160 active-duty service members stationed in South Carolina, either separating or retiring from active duty. Our ability to provide this service was enhanced by office space provided by Joint Base – Charleston at the Naval Weapon Station-Goose Creek. Roughly 40% of the service members we assisted indicated an intention to remain in the state after their military service.

Veterans Experience Action Centers. In coordination with the US Department of Veterans' Affairs, the American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and other partners, we participated in three major community outreach events in FY24-25. These events provided services and information to a total of 1,973 South Carolina Veterans.

Veteran Hearings and Appeals. During FY24-25, the Department assisted Veterans and their families with 238 appeals to the US Department of Veterans' Affairs Board of Veteran Appeals and 113 Pre-Determination Hearings, which enable swifter decisions for Veterans seeking redress on earlier US Department of Veterans' Affairs decisions.

- b) M.J. "Dolly" Cooper State Veterans' Cemetery.
  - During this year, the Cemetery interred 479 remains (341 Veterans and 138 dependents), including:
    - 317 below-ground burials
    - o 157 columbarium niche placements
    - o 5 scatterings
  - We denied 3 ineligible requests for interment.
  - We processed 319 requests for pre-certification (advance arrangement for future burial). Of these:
    - we approved 301;
    - o we denied 18 as ineligible; and
    - three were withdrawn by the Veteran or family member (interred elsewhere or moved out of state).
- c) <u>South Carolina Free Tuition for Certain War Veterans' Children Program (SC Code 59-111-20)</u>. In FY24-25, we received 2,074 applications for this program. We approved 1,510, denying 564 applications as ineligible. Primary reasons for denial remain the residency requirement for the student and Veteran, and the Veteran not having served during one of the specified periods of wartime service.
- d) War Records (SC Code 25-11-90). In the past fiscal year, we made no progress in scanning hardcopy Form DD-214s into the electronic War Record. We currently have 104,846 records scanned, representing 29.12% of the total number of paper records in the Department's possession. The Department continues to seek an automated process to address the backlog of digitizing paper copy records.
- e) <u>Veteran Service Organization Honor Guard Reimbursement Program (SC Code 25-11-85)</u>. In FY24-25, we disbursed \$54,000 to eleven Veteran Service Organizations Honor Guard organizations that provided military honors at Veteran funerals across the state.
  - f) Veteran Homes. A summary is provided in Table 4.
    - In FY24-25, the department oversaw five Veteran homes, transferred from the Department of Mental Health on 1 July, 2024.
      - Four homes were operational at the time of transfer and continued to function under the contracted operator.
      - Patriots Village in Sumter, was not operational at the time of transfer.
        - The facility opened to the public on 1 March, 2025.
        - The facility passed its recognition survey conducted by the US Department of Veterans' Affairs on 17 July, 2025 (after FY24-25) and is now authorized to operate at its full capacity of 104 residents.
    - Throughout FY24-25, the department worked with the Office of Mental Health (previously the Department of Mental Health) and the Department of Administration to prepare for the transfer of Stone Pavilion Veteran Home in Columbia on 1 Jul 25.
      - On 1 Jul 25, the department assumed responsibility for Stone Pavilion Veteran Home.
      - Simultaneously, the facility transitioned from state-run long-term care facility to a contractor-operated facility with state oversight.

Line of Effort 2: **Integrate** the effects of all entities in the State that provide a service to Veterans or their families.

- 2) <u>Strategic Objective 2</u>: Build and sustain a coalition network of service providers to meet the physical, emotional, and mental health needs of the Veteran community.
- a) <u>South Carolina Veteran Coalition</u>. Our web-based electronic platform for connecting Veterans to services continued to grow in membership and usage. In FY24-25, we added 33 new service-providers, bringing the Coalition total to 139. The Coalition made 4,300 connections between Veterans and service providers this year (a growth of 308% year-on-year).

#### b) Reducing Veteran Suicide.

- In FY24-25, the Department introduced the *Lock It South Carolina* Lethal Means Safety campaign to encourage Veterans and their families to practice the safe storage of firearms, the safe disposal of medication, and regular safety planning, as well as to make Veterans aware of resources available during a time of crisis. In its first year, we believe this campaign reached about 1,000 Veteran families.
- In partnership with the US Department of Veterans Affairs, the department provided gun locks to all County Veterans Affairs Offices for free distribution to Veteran families, integrated gun lock education into our Palmetto Pathfinder training, and distributed gun locks at every outreach event in which the department participated.

- The two-year data lag in Veteran suicide data means the effect of these efforts will not be reflected in the near term.
- 3) <u>Strategic Objective 3</u>: Build and sustain a coalition network of service providers to meet the non-medical physical wellness needs of the Veteran community.
- a) Reducing Veteran Unemployment. As of 30 June, 2025, Veteran unemployment was at 3.5%, well below the general population rate of 4.2%. Given this long-established and enduring trend, in FY24-25 we began setting the conditions for an internal reorganization allowing us to provide a focused effort on enhancing the value of Veterans to the South Carolina economy in the years ahead. This effort will include recruiting Veterans into the South Carolina workforce, assisting Veterans in obtaining training and education to make them more effective, and aiding those Veterans interested in pursuing the state entrepreneurial opportunities.
- b) <u>Improving the Availability of Housing</u>. In FY24-25, we provided \$2,345,064 in grant funding to 13 recipient organizations nonprofits and public agencies offering essential services such as housing assistance, food security, emergency utility support, and substance abuse recovery programs.
- 4) <u>Strategic Objective 4</u>: Build and sustain a coalition network of service providers to meet the social networking needs of the Veteran community.
- a) <u>Palmetto Pathfinder Program</u>. In FY24-25, we trained 75 new peer-mentor Pathfinders and connected 136 Veterans with a trained Pathfinder to provide peer support and assist in obtaining services. Fifty of the Veterans connected to a Pathfinder were service members transitioning from military service, the optimal target audience for this program.
- b) <u>Veteran Treatment Courts</u>. We continued our use of a federal Bureau of Justice grant to implement Veteran Treatment Courts in the following circuits: Second Judicial Circuit (Aiken County), Fourth Judicial Circuit (Chesterfield and Darlington Counties), and Twelfth Judicial Circuit (Florence County). We used funds from the same grant to enhance Veteran Treatment Courts services in the Eighth Judicial Circuit (Greenwood County) and Ninth Judicial Circuit (Charleston County). Across the state, 19 Veterans participated in Veteran Treatment Courts funded with subawards from the Department. We have received an additional federal grant allowing us to maintain these Veteran Treatment Courts through 2028.

Line of Effort 3: Advocate for Veterans, military Installations, service members, and families.

- 5) <u>Strategic Objective 5</u>: Sustain and expand the military presence in South Carolina and secure South Carolina's role in national security.
- a. The eight major military installations in South Carolina, plus Fort Gordon in Augusta, Georgia, provide a \$34.3 billion economic impact on the state of South Carolina. These installations cover every branch of service except the Space Force, and provide vital training, combat, and support service resources for national defense.
- b. In FY24-25, the department assisted these installations and their associated military communities on issues related to both the operational readiness of the installation and the quality of life of our active-duty service members and families. A summary of the past year includes:

#### • Operational Readiness

- Provided a Military Enhancement Fund grant for a Shipboard Firefighting Training Facility in Charleston County. This facility will be used to train area firefighters to handle a shipboard fire in the Port of Charleston or along the coast. This facility can also be used to bring other states to South Carolina for shipboard firefighting training.
- Provided a Military Enhancement Fund grant for computer equipment to outfit the Regional Support Operations Center and the Sensitive Compartmented Information Facility at the University of South Carolina-Aiken Cyber Integration Center.

#### Quality of Life

- Provided a Military Enhancement Fund grant for a new pump station at the Laurel Bay Wastewater Treatment Plant which services military installations and the military community in Beaufort County.
- Provided a Military Enhancement Fund grant for new disinfectant equipment at the Port Royal Wastewater Reclamation Facility, which serves military installations and the military community in Beaufort County.
- Provided a Military Enhancement Fund grant for the completion of the design, surveying, property easement, and permitting costs of the Wastewater project at the Short Stay Recreation Area for Joint Base Charleston service members and their families.
- Worked with Fort Jackson and the South Carolina Department of Education to plan and
  execute the Military Honor Cord Ceremony for high school graduates across the state who
  are entering the military. The event was held at Fort Jackson and had record attendance.
- Assisted Beaufort Naval Hospital in a partnership with Winn Army Medical Center at Fort Stewart, Georgia, to provide Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners when there are none available in Beaufort.
- Worked with the South Carolina Department of Education to increase the number of Purple Star Designated School Districts and Charter Schools that aid military families and students as they transition schools during their assignment in South Carolina.
- Worked with the South Carolina Department of Social Services to increase the number of childcare facilities in the Military Child Care in Your Neighborhood Plus Pilot Program in South Carolina, making it easier for service members to find childcare and providing fee assistance for the service.

c. In this fiscal year, the Military Enhancement Fund awarded five grants (detailed above) with a total value of \$9,504,325.

Line of Effort 4: **Inform** and educate the public, State and local leaders, and Veterans on all matters pertaining to Veterans.

In the last fiscal year, our information efforts focused on expanding awareness of the support and resources available to Veterans and their families. Highlights include:


A 24-page printed benefits guide for Veterans on services and resources offered from
Department coalition partners, Veteran Service Organizations and several state agencies. The
guide was provided to Veterans, state legislators, State House staff, County Veterans Affairs
Officers and Veteran service organizations. Nearly 15,000 copies were distributed this fiscal year
alone.

- Our website (scdva.sc.gov) continues to see a steady traffic of visitors with strategic marketing content driving our audience to the site (130,000+ visitors in FY24-25).
- Our monthly newsletter and bulletin service grew by nearly 4,000 subscribers in FY24-25 (currently 45,000+)
- The Department social media outreach continues to expand with nearly 800+ YouTube subscribers, 520+ Twitter(X) followers, 3100+ Facebook followers, and 3500+ LinkedIn connections.
- The Department continues to reach hundreds of thousands of viewers through television broadcast using strategic marketing material developed by media vendors or produced internally.

#### 6) The Road Ahead: Strategic Reorientation.

- a. FY24-25 saw the effective accomplishment of three of the department's original five strategic objectives. All three reflected the need to develop a robust network allowing for the rapid connection of Veterans to needed resources across the social determinants of health. That network is now in existence and functioning.
- b. As a consequence, in the second half of the year the department developed the first significant change to its enduring campaign plan. That change became effective on 1 July, 2025, and is captured in the graphic below.
- c. Under the modified campaign plan, Line of Effort 2 is redefined as "Enhance the value of Veterans to South Carolina." For our purposes, enhance means to increase or improve in value, quality, desirability, or attractiveness.
- d. Line of Effort 2 is focused on Strategic Objective 2: "Maximize and leverage the economic, academic, and cultural contributions of Veterans in South Carolina." We expect this strategic objective to be a core function of the department for the foreseeable future.

**IV. Risk Assessment**. Table 5 depicts our assessment of the risk of mission failure along each of our Lines of Effort at the beginning of FY25-26.


