AGENCY’S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The University of South Carolina Union provides a high-quality, competitive higher education that will enable students to thrive in a global, diverse, and constantly changing environment. By providing a varied curriculum, grounded in the Liberal Arts, USC Union emphasizes a close working relationship among students, faculty, staff, and the community that promotes self-reliance, freedom of thought and expression, productive citizenship, and critical thinking. Students at USC Union can obtain an Associate of Arts and an Associate of Science, in addition to having access to the baccalaureate degrees available through Palmetto College, the BSN program in partnership with USC Aiken, transfer pathways in early childhood, elementary, and middle-level education with USC Upstate, and transfer pathways in hospitality management, retailing with a concentration in fashion merchandising and digital innovation, retailing with a concentration in retail management, services management, tourism management, and sport and entertainment management with the USC Columbia.

Strategic Priority 1: Grow Enrollments and Advance Student Success. This strategic priority is linked to five distinct goals:

1. Drive enrollment growth.
2. Promote teaching excellence.
3. Foster staff development.
4. Drive student success.
5. Empower diverse students, staff, and faculty.

The USC Union campus has made significant strides in enhancing enrollment, retention, and student success. In Fall 2024, enrollment stood at 1,350, showing a slight decrease from 1,354 in the previous fall. However, Spring 2025 enrollment increased to 1,302, up from 1,244 in the previous spring semester. This growth can be attributed to a rise in traditional new freshmen and an increase in dual enrollment students, particularly at Gray Collegiate Academy and Clover High School. Our retention rate from Fall 2022 to Fall 2023 reached 67.3%, a significant increase from 56.6% in the previous year. This is the highest retention rate we've seen in the past decade, according to SCCHE, and the highest among the four PC campuses. Additionally, we are tied for 1st place with Trident Tech among the 16 SC technical schools and 4 PC campuses. In terms of success rate, for the Fall 2020 cohort, our success rate stands at 71.9%, which ranks us #2 among the PC campuses and #3 among the 16 technical colleges and 4 PC campuses. Our graduation rate for the Fall 2020 cohort is 37.5%, up from 30.6% in the previous cohort. This represents the highest graduation rate we've achieved in the past ten years, making us the top performer in PC and #3 among the 16 technical colleges and 4 PC campuses.

We expect increases in enrollment, retention, and student success rates to continue. Enrollment for Fall 2025 is projected to rise further due to several ongoing initiatives. These include the expansion of dual enrollment partnerships, enhanced retention strategies focused on increasing the number of returning students, and the addition of new sports programs, such as women’s soccer and cross country. Additionally, early college programs with Union County High School and Clinton High School, with their first incoming cohort slated for Summer 2025, will contribute to growth. The relocation of our Laurens location to Clinton, SC, is expected to further support these efforts.

Collaboration with other USC system institutions is also expected to play a key role in USC Union's continued growth. One notable initiative is our partnership with USC Aiken to offer the Bachelor of

Science in Nursing (BSN) degree on the Union campus. In this program, students complete their pre-nursing prerequisites at USC Union, positioning them to submit a strong application for the upper-division nursing program. By staying in Union, students can finish their final two years of coursework, complete their clinical rotations locally, and even pursue employment within our service area if they prefer (which most graduates do). Additionally, our newly established partnership with USC Upstate offers clear transfer pathways for undergraduates pursuing early childhood, elementary, or middle-level education. Students in this program can earn their associate degree at USC Union while fulfilling all necessary prerequisites to transfer directly to USC Upstate. They can then complete the remaining coursework for their bachelor's degree in one of these fields. This pathway is open to both dual-enrolled students, who can earn their associate degree upon high school graduation, and regularly enrolled USC Union students. Furthermore, this program aims to address teacher shortages in Union County by allowing USC Upstate education students to complete their student teaching in local schools. We've also finalized transfer pathways with the College of Hospitality, Retail, and Sport Management at USC Columbia. This partnership provides undergraduates interested in fields such as hospitality management, retail management (with a concentration in retail management, fashion merchandising, and digital innovation), services management, tourism management, or sport and entertainment management, a clear path to earn their associate degree at USC Union while fulfilling the prerequisites needed to transfer to USC Columbia. Upon earning their associate degree, students can seamlessly transfer to USC Columbia to complete their bachelor's degree in one of these six fields. By offering clear academic pathways, increasing local opportunities for clinical and student teaching placements, and expanding program offerings, we provide students with the support and resources they need to thrive academically and professionally.

While these initiatives have driven enrollment growth, our next priority is to sustain this progress by ensuring that students not only enroll but also thrive academically. To achieve this, we have implemented a range of targeted strategies aimed at enhancing retention, improving graduation rates, and fostering overall student success. These include study abroad opportunities, global learning initiatives, support through the Student Academic Success Center, mental health services, food assistance, tuition assistance, promotion of Graduation with Leadership Distinction, funding for undergraduate research, enrichment of student life through campus activities and NJCAA athletics, and targeted interventions.

Students from USC Union have studied in countries such as Costa Rica, Ireland, France, Spain, Guatemala, and England. In Summer 2025, a group of students will travel to Italy and Greece to take a business writing class. This course offers students the unique opportunity to study the classical roots of formal writing and oration in the very environment where these practices began. Through this experience, students will explore, investigate, and immerse themselves in the historical context that shaped professional communication. To further enrich global learning, USC Union hosted the annual Latin American Film Festival, which showcased films and provided an interdisciplinary perspective. This initiative engaged students, faculty, and staff in screenings and discussions about the cultural themes and issues presented in the films. USC Union also participated in the Fulbright Community College Residency Program, hosting a Humphrey Fellow from India. The fellow, a lawyer and advocate with expertise in child trauma, racial discrimination, and the protection of marginalized communities, shared valuable cultural and professional insights with the USC Union community. In the classroom, faculty employ innovative methods like the TalkAbroad Program to immerse students in language

learning through real conversations with native speakers, enhancing both language skills and cultural awareness.

There has been a focused effort to enhance the impact of the Student Academic Success Center on campus. The Center remains dedicated to fostering strong connections with students, faculty, staff, and the community by offering tutoring services and organizing events that support both academic and professional development. Its goal is to enrich students' educational experiences through a variety of campus initiatives, including academic workshops and career-oriented programs. This year, the Center hosted eleven workshops covering a range of topics, including goal setting, resume writing, time management, and study skills, attracting 82 attendees. Led by faculty and staff, these workshops aim to foster greater engagement between students, faculty, and staff outside the classroom. In addition, the Center organized several events throughout the academic year, such as Blood Connection drives, Fresh Check Day, Mid-Point Fall Frenzy, the Thanksgiving Luncheon, Halloween Pumpkin Decorating Contest, Gingerbread Decorating Contest, March Madness, a career fair, Spring Fling, and more. Additionally, the campus applied for the Student Support Services Program (TRIO) through the U.S. Department of Education, which will provide further academic support and assist students in completing their degrees. These initiatives collectively strive to enhance the overall educational experience for students at USC Union.

One of our primary goals is to find innovative ways to support the mental well-being of our students, faculty, and staff. To that end, we offer the Student Assistance Program (SAP), which is available to all students, including both regular and dual enrollment students, regardless of their location—whether on campus, online, or at off-site high schools where we offer dual enrollment programs. SAP provides confidential, short-term counseling and personal consultations, free of charge, to address both personal and professional concerns. The program also offers work-life resources, including legal and financial consultations, online learning support, and various other services. In addition, we have contracted with Uwill, a platform that provides immediate access to teletherapy, crisis intervention, and wellness programs through a secure online platform. Students can schedule sessions based on their preferences for therapist availability, specialty, gender, language, and ethnicity. In collaboration with the USC Psychological Services Center, USC Union also offers telehealth therapy, in-person therapy, and psychological assessments on campus. These services are provided at no cost to students, faculty, or staff, ensuring that mental health support is readily accessible and affordable for everyone on campus. To further promote mental well-being, the campus organizes an annual event called Fresh Check Day, held every September. Fresh Check Day serves as a positive initiative to promote mental health awareness and suicide prevention. The event fosters a warm and welcoming environment where students feel encouraged to openly discuss mental health topics and connects them with various mental health resources available on campus, within the community, and at the national level. This year, students were also strongly encouraged to complete a series of online community education modules. These modules encompass four topics: alcohol/drug awareness, sexual assault and prevention, mental health, and belonging. In addition to mental health support, USC Union also provides for students in need of food and personal cleaning products. The Food Pantry on campus provides shelf-stable food and hygiene products for students free of charge. Dozens of students take advantage of this service each week of the academic year. The Food Pantry is funded by local charities, food donations, and internal campus funds, and is generally stocked by bookstore employees and student assistants. Also, a Fresh Food Pantry on campus provides free fresh food for students from a nearby farmer's market through a co-authored grant with RobinHood under the auspices of the South Carolina Physicians Care Charity, assuring 24 students

every two weeks with free bags of fresh food, totaling approximately \$10,000 for the academic year 24-25. Alongside mental health and food support, USC Union recognizes the financial challenges that students may face in completing their education. To help alleviate these burdens, we offer a range of financial aid and scholarship programs designed to make higher education more accessible and affordable. The tuition rate at USC Union for resident students is \$3,579 per semester, a rate consistent across all four Palmetto College campuses (Lancaster, Salkehatchie, Sumter, and Union). For students enrolled in four-year programs, the tuition rate increases to \$5,199 per semester for resident students. This rate is lower than that of the nearest senior campus, USC Upstate (\$5,604 per semester for residents), and the main campus in Columbia (\$6,144 per semester for residents). Additionally, Union County and Laurens County residents have access to local scholarship opportunities provided through their respective counties. Union County offers scholarships that cover tuition and fees for in-county high school graduates who have achieved a minimum GPA of 3.0. Similarly, Laurens County has a parallel program that provides a scholarship for in-county high school graduates with a minimum GPA of 2.0. These scholarship programs not only foster educational opportunities for local students but also contribute to the overall growth and diversity of our student population.

USC Union actively supports students working towards achieving Graduation with Leadership Distinction (GLD), enriching their educational experiences by connecting classroom learning with real-world applications. By fulfilling GLD requirements, students integrate academic knowledge with practical skills, deepening their understanding and appreciation of their education. Presentations and e-portfolios are key components of the GLD program, enabling students to showcase their achievements and reflections to potential employers. This academic year, two students earned this distinction in research, with ongoing efforts to increase program awareness through targeted marketing strategies. These learning opportunities are also available to students who are not pursuing GLD. Faculty enhance the educational experience by incorporating hands-on learning activities into their courses. For example, pre-nursing students engage in practical exercises in nursing skills labs, while UNIV 101 students participate in community fundraising events for important causes. Through our partnership with the South Carolina Afterschool Alliance, students contribute directly to local afterschool programs, fostering valuable skills while making a positive impact on the community. These hands-on experiences provide students with essential practical skills and the chance to create meaningful change in the local community.

USC Union is committed to fostering undergraduate research opportunities and provides annual summer research funding to deserving students and faculty members. This year, six students were awarded Palmetto Undergraduate Research Experience (PURE) grants, enabling them to explore diverse research areas and present their research at Discover USC, the University of South Carolina undergraduate research showcase. By offering students the opportunity to engage in undergraduate research, USC Union contributes to the advancement of knowledge in various fields.

USC Union is fully committed to enhancing student life and strengthening our athletics program while providing unwavering support to all students. The campus boasts a strong Student Government Association and offers a variety of student clubs and organizations, such as the Research Club and the African American Alliance. Throughout the year, USC Union hosts numerous events designed to enrich student life, including First-Generation College Celebration Day, Donuts with the Deans, the Easter Egg Hunt, Fresh Check Day, Welcome Back Week, Finals Fest, and more.

Our athletics program offers a wide range of sports, including men's soccer, baseball, softball, golf, and women's volleyball, all competing at the NJCAA level. In addition, we have club-level teams in bass fishing, e-sports, and rifle. Starting next year, we will expand our range to include women's soccer and cross country as club sports. USC Union places significant emphasis on fostering excellence both on and off the field. This year, our student-athletes have demonstrated remarkable dedication to academic success, as reflected in their team GPAs: men's soccer (3.238), baseball (3.481), softball (3.736), golf (3.413), women's volleyball (3.537), bass fishing (3.588), and rifle (2.46). The overall athletic department GPA for the year was 3.48. Fifteen athletes were named NJCAA All-Academic First Team Players (4.00 GPA on a 4.0 scale), eighteen athletes were named NJCAA All-Academic First Team Players (3.80 to 3.99 GPA on a 4.0 scale), and fourteen athletes were named NJCAA All-American Third Team Players (3.60 to 3.79 GPA on a 4.0 scale). These impressive team GPAs highlight our campus's commitment to promoting academic excellence and ensuring the success of our student-athletes in their educational pursuits. Our student athletes have also earned well-deserved recognition for their athletic achievements. The softball team finished second in the Region 10 conference tournament, with three players named to the NJCAA Region 10 All-Tournament Team, three players receiving First Team All-Region awards, and four players earning Second Team All-Region honors. The baseball team finished third in the Region 10 conference tournament. Carson Williams from the golf team was named Region 10 Player of the Year, and Mila Mzamane from the soccer team earned Region 10 Player of the Year honors. In bass fishing, the team finished 5th out of the top 12 teams in the nation. Two bass fishing anglers, Caleb Hudson and Tanner Hadden, outperformed 1,500 anglers nationwide to qualify for an exclusive 8-man event. Tanner finished 7th, and Caleb advanced to the semifinals, ultimately finishing 4th. These achievements underscore the exceptional talent and dedication of our student-athletes and their significant contributions to our athletic program's success. Beyond the field, our student athletes are actively engaged in community service. They serve as buddies for the Miracle League, providing support and companionship to individuals with disabilities. They also participate in the Union County Christmas Parade and volunteer as coaches and referees at the YMCA, helping to nurture the development of young athletes. Through their involvement in these community initiatives, our student-athletes demonstrate their commitment to serving others and set a positive example as role models in the community. To foster holistic development in both academics and athletics, we uphold stringent student-athlete eligibility standards in compliance with NJCAA regulations. This includes mandatory study hall sessions and participation in a weeklong workshop series each November. The workshops cover a range of important topics such as civil rights/Title IX, sexual harassment, suicide prevention, drug and alcohol abuse awareness, and mental health.

To ensure academic success, USC Union has two committees dedicated to retention and success efforts. The first committee is the Academic Intervention Committee, which aims to provide early intervention across campus units to support students who are facing academic challenges. This proactive approach ensures that students in poor academic standing have access to the necessary resources to succeed academically. The second committee, known as the Student Care and Outreach Team (CARE), consists of faculty and staff members who offer individual attention and resources to students of concern, including those exhibiting self-injurious or erratic behaviors. These committees play a vital role in fostering a supportive environment and promoting the retention and success of our students.

At Union, our ongoing efforts to expand faculty and academic offerings are essential to achieving our institutional goals. This year, we have launched several faculty searches and successfully hired four new full-time faculty members for the 2024-2025 academic year. These new hires include an Instructor of

Mathematics, an Instructor of Fine Arts, an Assistant Professor of English, and an Assistant Professor of Sociology. In addition, we've welcomed ten new adjunct instructors across various disciplines. These new faculty and adjunct members bring valuable expertise, enhancing the breadth and depth of academic opportunities for our students. In terms of staffing, we have strategically expanded our team to support the growing needs of our campus. Six new permanent staff positions have been added, including an Admissions Counselor, Financial Aid Counselor, Education Coordinator, Men's Head Soccer Coach, IT Quality Assurance Specialist, and Student Activities Coordinator. Additionally, we've hired eleven temporary staff members to fill essential roles, including two maintenance staff, a security officer, a bus driver, Head Volleyball Coach, Assistant Bass Fishing Coach, Women's Assistant Soccer Coach, Cross Country Coach, Assistant Athletic Director, Men's Assistant Soccer Coach, and Rifle Team Coach. To support staff development and shared governance, the Palmetto College Campuses have established a Staff Senate this year.

Full-time faculty at USC Union carry a standard teaching load of 12 credit hours per semester. Faculty members may also request course reductions to engage in scholarly activities throughout the academic year, with support from both the campus and Palmetto College. USC Union offers financial assistance to faculty members for attending conferences, both nationally and internationally, thereby enhancing their expertise and enriching classroom experiences. These opportunities often involve collaborative research with students, frequently supported by grants such as the PURE Program. The Research Club plays a vital role in fostering collaboration between faculty and students, organizing events that showcase scholarly pursuits within the campus community. This year, events included students presenting their research at Discover USC, a cultural enrichment trip to Charleston, SC, lunch and learns, and an experiential learning opportunity at the show *Six*, the musical at the Koger Center for the Arts. These events promote intellectual engagement and encourage the exchange of ideas among members of the academic community. Faculty development at USC Union is further supported through a variety of workshops, webinars, and training sessions designed to enhance pedagogical skills and offer crucial support for faculty in their teaching endeavors. Faculty have access to grants from Palmetto College and USC Columbia, which provide funding for research, professional development, and the adoption of innovative teaching practices. Local initiatives, including a comprehensive faculty orientation and advisor training program, equip faculty with the tools and knowledge needed to excel in their roles. These initiatives ensure that faculty are well-prepared to effectively support student learning and engagement.

As mentioned, our faculty actively contribute to research excellence by maintaining a consistent level of productivity in their scholarly endeavors, even with substantial teaching and service responsibilities. We collect data on scholarly productivity for the calendar year. Regarding scholarly productivity, during the 2024 calendar year, the faculty at USC Union documented their scholarly achievements, which encompassed the following: 30 publications, 31 presentations, 23 creative works, 11 funded grants, 69 reviews of scholarly works, 10 scholarly editor roles, 10 professional consultations, and 1 media consultation. The Union campus will continue to allocate resources to facilitate faculty travel for presenting their research (\$40,000 budget for AY 2024-2025).

Strategic Priority 2: Deliver World-Class Experiences for Students, Internal Colleagues and External Partners. This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Optimize services and processes.
2. Promote organizational and financial health.

3. Enhance giving/fundraising efforts across PC campuses.

The balance for FY25 is \$1,032,632.97. This shortfall was primarily due to a combination of unanticipated revenue losses and higher-than-expected expenditures totaling over \$650,000. Contributing factors included internal budget reallocations, one-time planning costs, unexpected maintenance expenses, and program deficits. The campus will work towards a 3-month average expenses reserve fund over the next 3 budget years, with an estimated fund balance of \$1,250,000 at the end of FY26.

To improve accessibility for students enrolled in our degree programs, both locally and across Palmetto College, the Union campus has undertaken a series of significant infrastructure enhancements during the 2024–2025 academic year. At Rippy Courtyard, the wall dividing two patios has been removed to create a unified outdoor gathering space, complemented by new concrete pathways and shrub plantings. Truluck Gym has received extensive upgrades, including a new roof, exterior and interior painting, new LED lighting, a new locker room, storage room, new bathrooms featuring a separate ADA-compliant restroom, and new flooring. At the Jonesville Gym, improvements include a new roof and exterior panels, updated bathrooms with an ADA-compliant restroom, two new locker rooms for men’s and women’s soccer, and a new weight room. In the Main Building, the HVAC system has been replaced, and interior updates include new bathrooms, painting, carpeting, LED lighting, furniture, and the installation of a new elevator. At the Laurens location, new spaces have been created for a student success center, student lounge, faculty office cubicle area, and an esports gaming room, along with an upgraded HVAC system. Additionally, the campus has completed a full rebuild of the softball stadium to better support athletic programs and student engagement.

This year, USC Union has engaged in a variety of fundraising efforts and events aimed at enhancing student support services, campus development, and institutional sustainability. Although the planned fundraising event for the softball program has been postponed until the field’s completion, a sponsorship package is currently in development. This package will offer opportunities for sponsor signage under the scoreboard, behind the bleachers, and in other prominent locations around the stadium. Additional fundraising initiatives include a \$15,000 grant awarded by the Lutz Foundation to establish a Career Closet, which has already received a remarkable number of clothing donations. Fundraising efforts for Give4Garnet Day were also successful, as were sponsorship sales for the front page of the student newspaper, *The Gazette*. Donations to the campus Food Pantry, both monetary and in-kind, remain ongoing, supported by advertisements placed across various media outlets that have produced strong results for both the Food Pantry and Career Closet. Efforts are also underway to secure funding for Phase II of the Dawkins House restoration project in collaboration with Preservation South Carolina. This phase includes final exterior stabilization, internal support walls and beams, and other critical renovations. Once complete, the property will be deeded to the Union/Laurens Commission for Higher Education, making current fundraising activities, such as outreach to state legislators, donation letters, and community engagement, especially vital. To date, \$300,000 has been secured from the state, along with a \$50,000 gift from a local philanthropist and pre-awarded grant funding from the Timken Family Foundation. In January 2025, the USC Union Alumni Association officially launched, with year-round fundraising efforts already producing results through alumni engagement and donations. Additionally, USC Union’s Legacy Society was established in April to honor distinguished donors whose generosity has made a lasting impact on campus. While not formally designated as a fundraising event, the Legacy Society celebration generated over \$40,000 in scholarship contributions.

Strategic Priority 3: Impact Education Attainment and Workforce Readiness. This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Impact our communities.
2. Increase transfer and pipeline partnerships.
3. Expand workforce-focused credentials.

During the 2024–2025 academic year, USC Union continued to demonstrate its strong commitment to expanding college access and academic opportunity for high school students across the state. By maintaining and growing its dual enrollment partnerships, the campus plays a vital role in helping students accelerate their educational journey and reduce the cost of earning a college degree.

In Fall 2024, USC Union partnered with 10 high schools to offer dual enrollment opportunities, serving 1,072 students. This number remained strong in Spring 2025, with partnerships expanding to 11 high schools and a total enrollment of 1,047 students. These figures reflect the institution’s sustained outreach and responsiveness to community needs.

Notably, three students earned their associate degrees from USC Union concurrently with their high school diplomas, a testament to the program’s rigor, accessibility, and effectiveness. These students are entering the next stage of their education with a two-year head start, saving time and money while gaining valuable academic experience.

USC Union also took a significant step forward in broadening Early College access by launching the development of a formal Early College Program in partnership with Clinton High School. This initiative began in Summer 2025 with a cohort of 18 students. At the same time, USC Union continues to actively promote its Early College Program at Union County High School, reinforcing its dedication to building long-term pipelines for student success. Students in these programs can earn a general Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree, or follow a specialized track in Education or Nursing.

These efforts not only benefit individual students but also support South Carolina’s broader goals for workforce development, college attainment, and educational equity. By offering high-quality, affordable college coursework to high school students, USC Union is preparing the next generation of leaders, professionals, and community contributors, strengthening both local communities and the state as a whole.

USC Union has also increased the number of students pursuing baccalaureate degrees through both the Palmetto College and our BSN partnership with USC Aiken. In Fall 2024, 45 students were enrolled in the Bachelor of Liberal Studies (BLS) and Bachelor of Organizational Leadership (BOL) programs via Palmetto College, reflecting growing interest in degree completion pathways that support workforce advancement. Additionally, 27 students were enrolled in the pre-nursing track as part of the BSN partnership with USC Aiken, which prepares students for high-demand roles in healthcare. These increases directly contribute to raising educational attainment in the region while equipping students with the skills and credentials needed for career readiness in key industries.

USC Union has significantly expanded its partnerships with the community and local industry to enhance student support, workforce development, and regional engagement. The campus continues to support the community by making its facilities available for various events and activities. This includes

providing space for elections, hosting meetings for community organizations and local industries, and offering areas for trainings and workshops. A new relationship has been established with the Communications and Engagement Manager at Eaton Corporation, which plans to open a plant in the area within the next two years. Ongoing collaborations with the Union County Sheriff's Office, Union County Chamber of Commerce, Council on Aging, Union County Farmers Market, local churches, and other community organizations have played a vital role in supporting campus initiatives such as the Food Pantry and Career Closet and have encouraged campus participation in local events. At the Laurens location, faculty and staff are actively involved with city and county governments, the Rotary Club, and the Laurens County Chamber of Commerce, further deepening community ties. The Nursing Department has partnered with Union EMS to expand healthcare-related services and training opportunities. Additionally, USC Union has strengthened its long-standing relationship with the Lutz Foundation, which continues to award grants to the campus thanks to a strong connection with the foundation's founders. The campus also regularly provides access to its Community Room for use by City Public Safety, MycoWorks, and other local organizations, reinforcing its role as a hub for community collaboration and engagement.

Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies

Risk assessment is an integral part of our long- and short-term institutional planning process. It is crucial for us to continue providing our services as not doing so would have a negative impact on the statewide objective of enhancing the educational preparedness of South Carolinians. USC Union offers affordable opportunities for high-quality education, particularly benefiting those who are economically disadvantaged within our service area. Failing to achieve our goals would further disadvantage these individuals. Furthermore, our partnership with USC Aiken in delivering their Bachelor of Science in Nursing program at USC Union plays a vital role in providing high-quality nursing care for our region. By training nurses who choose to remain in the area, we contribute to the overall health and well-being of our service area. Failing to accomplish our goals in this regard would have adverse effects on the community's healthcare services. To mitigate the potential negative impacts, it may be necessary for our agency to seek state funding for the general operating funds budget. Additionally, increasing the allocation for dual enrollment tuition for high school students and enhancing the availability of state scholarship funds could help address these challenges. We propose that the General Assembly consider taking the following actions to address these potential issues:

1. Increase the allocation of funds to the general operating budget.
2. Enhance the revenue provided for dual credit students.
3. Increase the availability of state scholarship funds.

By implementing these measures, we can better ensure the continued success and positive impact of USC Union on our community.

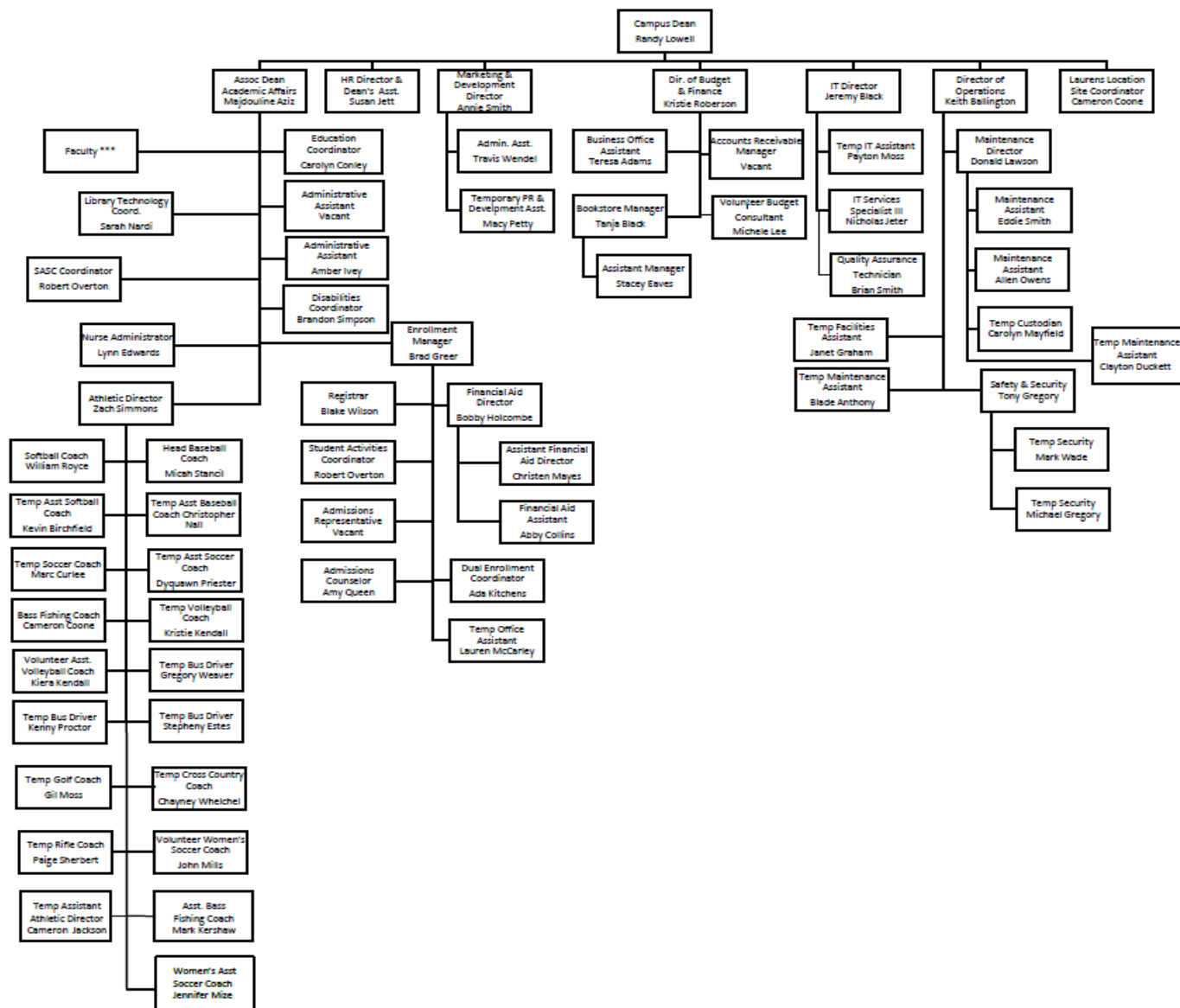

The Union regional Palmetto College campus is a branch campus of the University of South Carolina Columbia. Union has as its mission to provide higher education and intellectual leadership, contributing to the primary mission of the University of South Carolina System so stated as “outstanding education, research, creative activity, community engagement, and service that drives community and economic impact or the benefit of the state, nation, and world.” At the heart of this mission is a teaching faculty of high quality dedicated to excellence in instruction, scholarship, public and professional service, and creative endeavor which enrich the classroom experience. The Union regional Palmetto College campus offers a varied curriculum grounded in the liberal arts and focused on preparing students to continue their education in the University of South Carolina System and throughout life.

The Union regional Palmetto College campus recruits students prepared to succeed in completing a baccalaureate- level education. While the institution does not offer remedial instruction, it is nonetheless able to admit most students who apply due to the close working relationship between students and faculty. The original design of the institution incorporated a flexibility that has allowed changes in institutional capability with increasing educational demands of constituents.

Through classroom and laboratory instruction delivered in a variety of face-to-face and distance learning formats and modalities, the institution awards the Associate in Arts and Associate in Science degrees and provides for the completion of selected bachelor’s degrees on campus through cooperative agreements and delivery structures with other University of South Carolina System institutions. The Union regional Palmetto College campus also provides general education and upper division coursework applicable to baccalaureate degree programs offered through colleges and universities nationwide. In addition to academic coursework, the mission of the campus includes noncredit courses, seminars, and workshops made available to the community for cultural enrichment and professional development.

The traditions of cultural diversity and freedom of thought are valued at the Union regional Palmetto College campus. In a learning environment that develops respect for racial, geographical, intellectual, and economic diversity and an awareness of individual, societal, and global responsibilities, Union promotes courses, activities, and attitudes that instill in students a thirst to continue learning throughout life.

The Union regional Palmetto College campus emphasizes the development of the whole person and especially seeks to foster in students the disciplines essential to an educated citizenry. Core competencies, including the ability to communicate through effective writing and articulate speech; computational and quantitative mastery; creative and critical thinking; and the duties of citizenship are strategically integrated within the curriculum. Classroom experiences, student activities, and physical education programs also provide opportunities for cultural enrichment, leadership development, intellectual growth and interpersonal relationships, all contributing to a sense of self-reliance and a joy of learning.
