AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The Public Service Commission of South Carolina (Commission or PSC) regulates the rates and services of investor-owned public utilities in the State of South Carolina and has limited jurisdiction related to the South Carolina Public Service Authority (Santee Cooper). With more than 100 years of service to the state of South Carolina, the PSC establishes just and reasonable standards for investor-owned public utilities' rates and services.

The mission of the Public Service Commission of South Carolina is to serve the public by providing open and effective regulation and adjudication of the state's public utilities through consistent administration of the law and regulatory process. The State Regulation of Public Utilities Review Committee serves as the joint legislative committee that oversees the operations of the Commission because of Act 175 of 2004 and is chaired by Senator Thomas Alexander.

For the Public Service Commission of South Carolina to carry out its mission, the Commission must be alert to and anticipate emerging issues in the industries it regulates, including federal regulatory developments. Maintaining effective communications with its stakeholders aided the Commission in achieving this goal.

Executive Summary of Achievements

Strategic Goal I: Optimize Our Processes, Systems, and Decisions

- The Commission's Docket Management System (DMS) was enhanced to improve its search functionality. DMS improvements and enhancements were made as follows: Google full text search capabilities of Commission Matters and Orders; keyword searches to search text within PDF documents on the system; and expanded search result limitations from 250 to 1,000 items returned during a search.
- The Commission also streamlined its filing process by adding the ability for stakeholders to file confidential documents on the DMS via SC File Drop.
- The Commission continued to review its regulations pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. Section 1-23-120(J). The final regulations for Articles 2 and 6 were published in the State Register, Vol. 49, Issue 5 in May.

Strategic Goal II: Maintain Our Commitment to the Judicial Process

- Commission Orders were issued within an average of 21.91 days (93 orders issued) from the date of a Commission Directive during the year. This represents a more than ten-day improvement in the time it took to issue Orders in fiscal year 2023-2024 of 32.83 days (101 orders issued).
- Commissioners and Staff participated in over 575 hours of professional education.
- Annual Ethics Training was conducted in accordance with S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-3-30(C).

Strategic Goal III: Improve Our Operations Continuously

- The PSC held six meetings with its Advisory Committee to discuss its processes and procedures. As a result of these meetings, the Commission improved/implemented the following action items: Order No. 2025-23 updating the E-Filing Guidelines to require the filing of searchable PDF documents; Order No. 2025-321 regarding filing confidential documents via SC File Drop; DMS search updates, as highlighted above; Directive Order No. 2025-286 regarding a procedure to close certain dockets; implementation of an Order Alert System; and search boxes and video link share buttons were added to the Commission's Livestream Archive page on ETV's website.
- The Commission held its first Regulatory Process Review Forum on June 13, 2025.

Strategic Goal IV: Manage Risk

- Quarterly simulated phishing emails were sent to employees to test their recognition of a malicious email.
- Staff and Commissioners completed annual cybersecurity training.

The Commission continued to improve its hearing procedures to provide the public with accessible, transparent, and effective regulation of public utilities and with clear information about the regulatory process and its decisions. To increase transparency and engagement with public utility consumers, the Commission continued the implementation of a more robust communications platform, including its SC Utility Consumer website, social media accounts, and advertising campaign.

An ongoing goal of the Commission is to improve its operations through technological advances. As opportunities are identified, the Commission will investigate both costs and benefits before taking the appropriate actions.

The Commission must regulate the electric utility industry effectively, safeguarding ratepayers without unduly burdening the industry or stifling competition. On May 12, 2025, Governor McMaster signed the South Carolina Energy Security Act (Act 41 of 2025). Act 41 includes issues such as electric rate stabilization, energy infrastructure projects, changes to the Commission's regulatory processes, updates to utility facility siting and environmental protection laws, agreements concerning qualifying and transformational customers, and the addition of competitive procurement for energy storage facilities.

The public relies on the Commission's online systems to access information related to its operations. The Commission must budget funds to support maintenance and development of the systems.

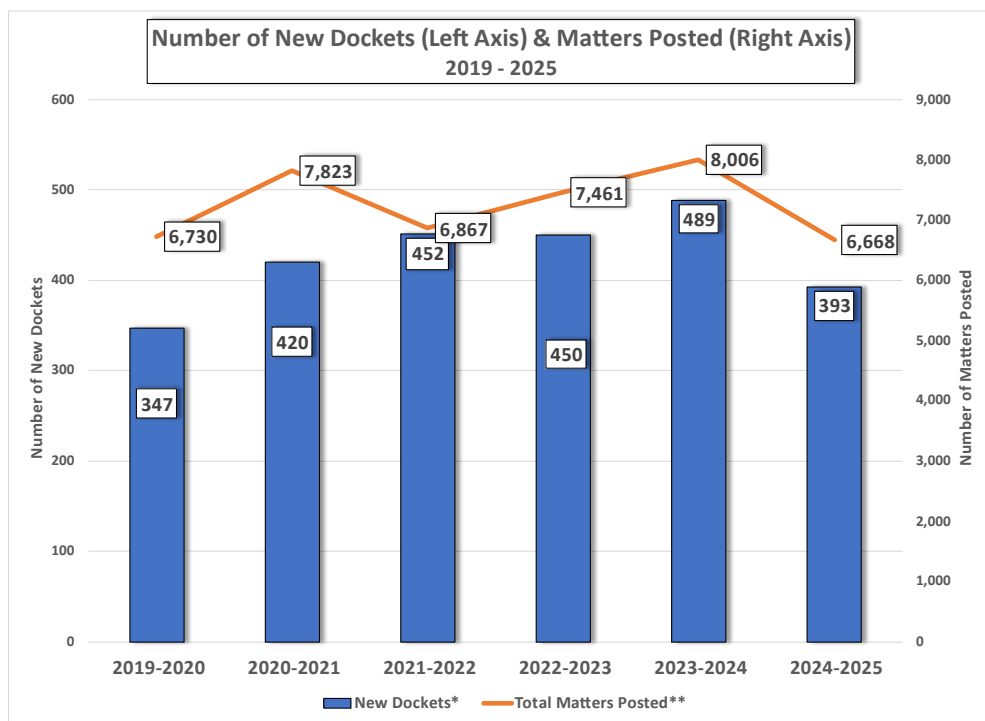
The Commission's primary duty is to adjudicate cases involving the state's investor-owned utilities. In the last fiscal year, the Commission opened 393 new dockets, including non-docketed items, held 41 hearings, issued 93 orders, and 672 directive orders. In 2023-2024, the PSC issued 101 orders and 781 directive orders. A total of 6,668 matters were posted on the Commission's Docket Management System (DMS). The Commission also held 44 Commission Business Meetings during the year.

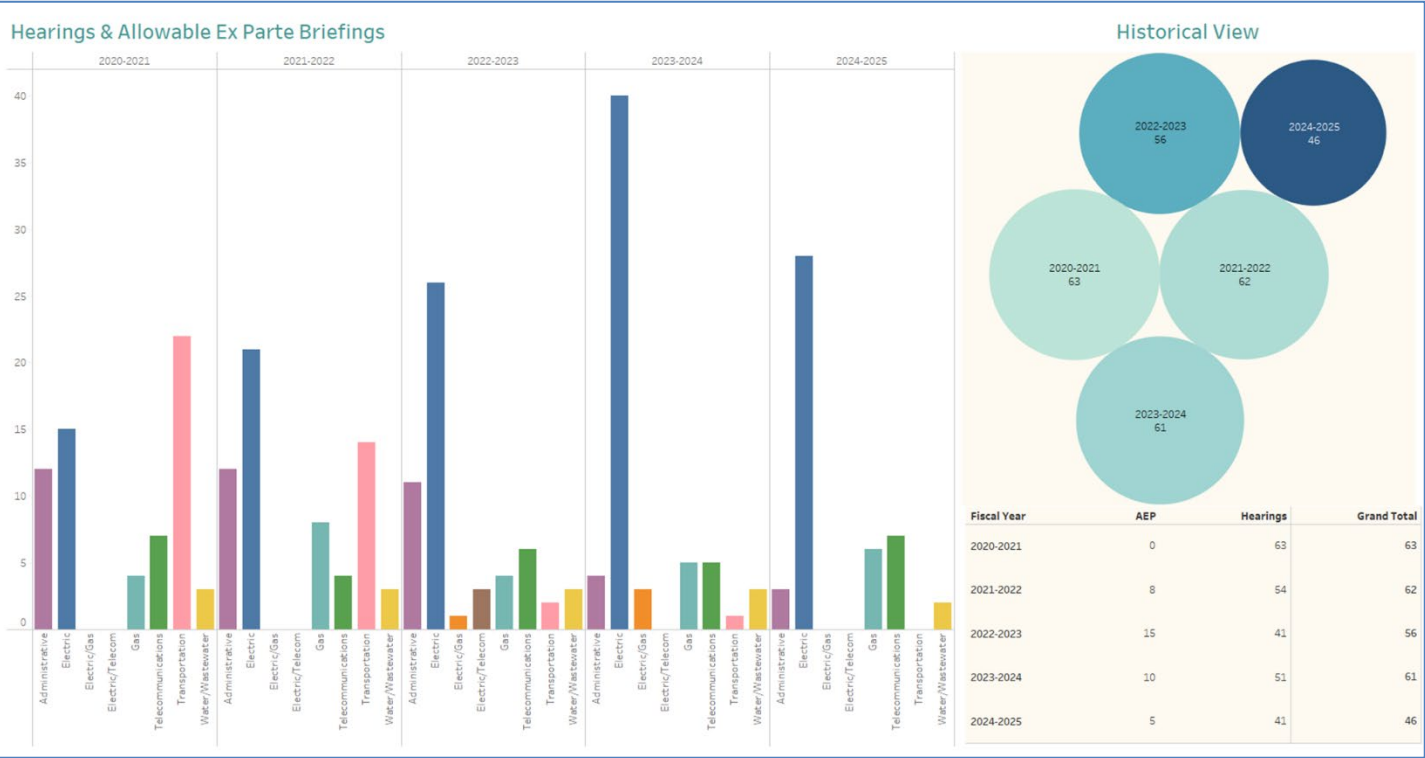

The Commission’s hearings encompass the electric, gas, telecommunications, transportation, water, and wastewater industries. There continues to be a steady number of filings and/or hearings within the electric utility industry due to the impact of ongoing issues that the Commission must address from a regulatory standpoint, including the SC Energy Freedom Act of 2019 and the South Carolina Energy Security Act of 2025. Some of these issues include demand-side management and energy efficiency programs, integrated resource plans, and major utility facility siting cases. The following charts provide a breakdown of the hearings and Allowable *Ex Parte* Communication Briefings held by industry.



**In May 2022, the Commission ceased hearing cases involving motor carrier applications for certificates due to Act 214 of 2022.*

During the fiscal year, the PSC disposed of 778 action items at the Commission’s Business Meetings, and the Commission was advised of 2,649 matters. Action items are matters where the Commission makes a decision during a Commission Business Meeting. The Commission decided numerous important matters that required significant time and resources, including those in the table on the next page:

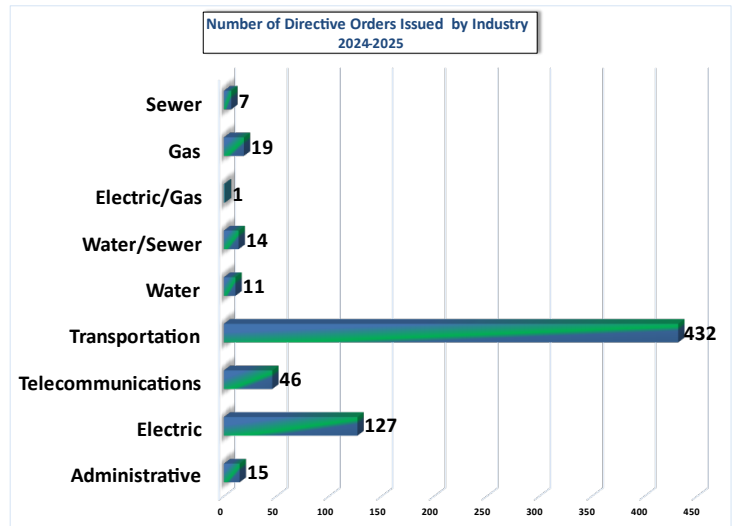
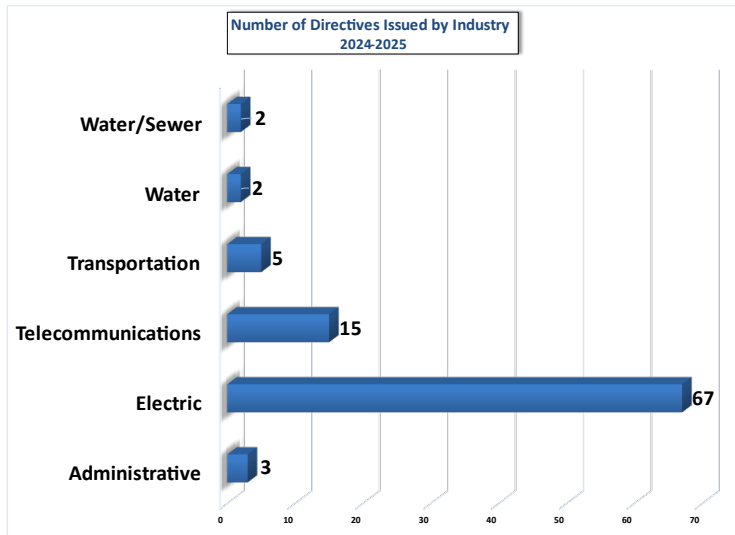
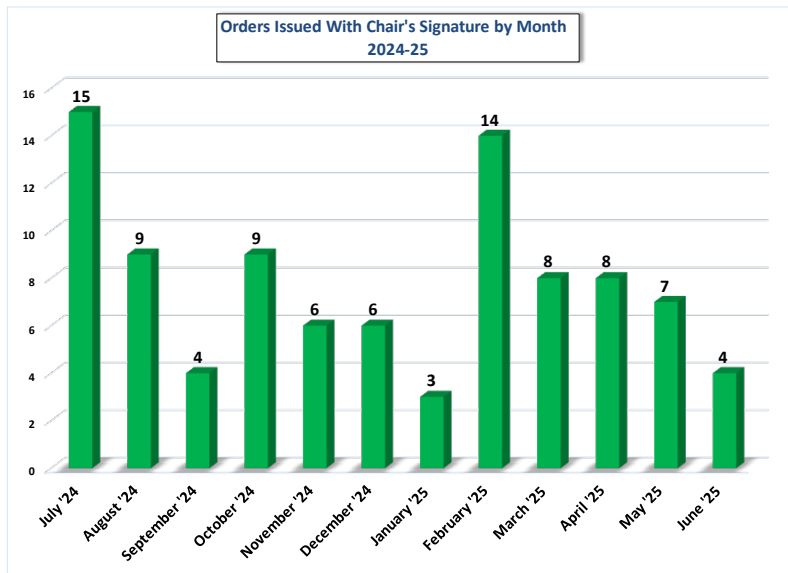

The Commission continued to execute its robust digital communications program during the year to increase the transparency of the Agency's operations. This program included digital newsletters, livestreaming of Commission hearings and meetings, the use of social media, and an increased public communications plan through the Commission's SC Utility Consumer website and blog. In the most recent fiscal year, the Public Service Commission's website (www.psc.sc.gov) underwent several changes to streamline public communications and increase the Commission's reach across the state. The pending Transportation Application page was integrated with the PSC's internal Smartsheet, allowing information to be instantly and automatically updated to the page as information is added to the Smartsheet. This streamlined process ensures the Commission's

continued compliance with Act 214 of 2022, which requires immediate posting of new transportation applications to the Commission’s website. The Agency also continued to use its new Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) portal, which allows the Commission to decrease the number of non-relevant FOIA requests it receives, reduce the response time to relevant requests, and direct FOIA requestors to the appropriate agency to assist with their inquiries.

The Commission continued to use its Facebook and LinkedIn profiles during the fiscal year. A pivot from social media marketing to website marketing and search engine optimization resulted in a predicted stall in growth for social media follower counts during the year. To address this gap and inform consumers on a broad platform base, the Commission launched the PSC’s Instagram account and signed up for Nextdoor’s State of South Carolina Government page, which has 1.6 million members across 1.03 million households. Data on the Commission’s Nextdoor performance will be included in future reports.

*The Commission deleted its PSC and SC Utility Consumer Twitter accounts in November 2023 due to fluctuations in the way data was gathered on the platform and algorithmic changes that made it a less useful tool than in previous years.

Over the course of the year, the PSC entered two separate contracts with *The Post & Courier* to provide digital marketing and search engine optimization (SEO) for the Agency. These campaigns ran from July 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024, and from January 1, 2025, through June 30, 2025. The campaigns produced the following results:

The Commission's search engine marketing exceeded expectations and industry averages, with an average click-through rate three times that of the industry standard of 6.67%, and a cost-per-click of \$1.50, compared to an industry average of \$5.26. These favorable comparisons illustrate the success of the campaigns.

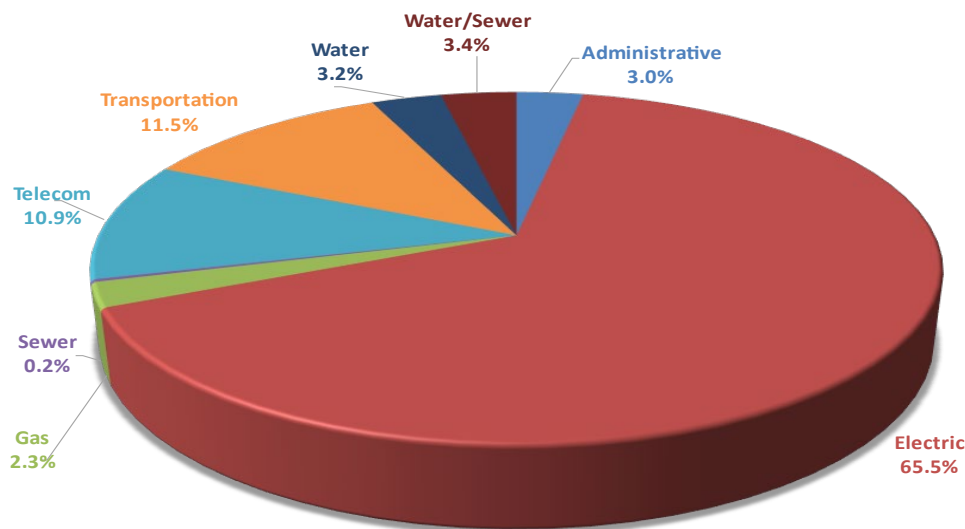
During the fiscal year, the Commission continued livestreaming its Commission Business Meetings, hearings, and training sessions. Statistics for the livestream are provided in the following table. 2024-2025 E-service System Statistics



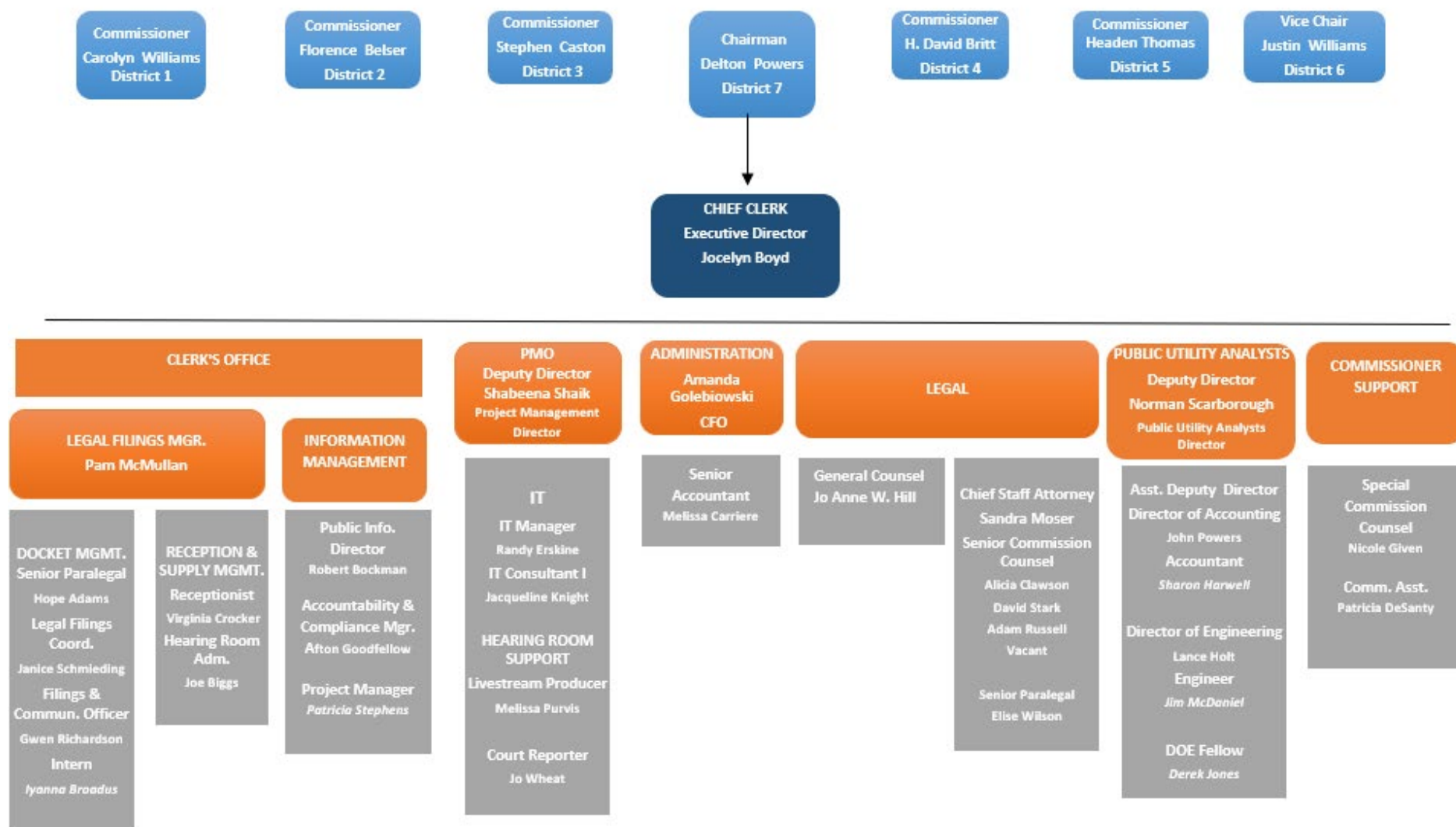
