Fiscal Impact Summary

Based on the responses to the Commission on Higher Education (CHE) survey, the legislation would impact Other Fund tuition and fee revenues by an undeterminable amount. The Other Fund revenue impact results from the loss of the in-state, out-of-state tuition differential for each eligible student.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

House Bill 3037 amends Section 59-112-50 to provide that veterans of the Armed Services of the United States and their dependents are eligible for in-state tuition without the requirement of one year of physical presence in this State. For undergraduate full-time students, the in-state, out-of-state student tuition differential per student for academic year 2014-2015 ranged from \$1,752 to \$19,608. For graduate students, (excluding law, medicine, and pharmacy) the differential per student ranges from \$5,206 to \$18,690. Also attached are the tuition and required fees for full-time students at public institutions and a summary of in-state and out-of-state student enrollment at public colleges and universities for the fall 2014 semester.

Currently, the Commission on Higher Education indicates data are not available to determine the number of students who might be eligible or seek eligibility for in-state tuition and fee rates under the proposed bill. As well, data are not readily available to aid in determining the amount of revenue that institutions would forgo, if the bill were enacted. Therefore, specific costs estimates could not be calculated.
