House Bill 3251 establishes the Maternal Morbidity and Mortality Review Committee under the Department of Health & Environmental Control. The mission of the committee is to gather and review available data, develop strategies to prevent (reduce) maternal deaths, and disseminate findings and recommendations. Committee members shall serve without compensation or reimbursement for expenses.


The Department of Health & Environmental Control indicates that a registered nurse and a program coordinator are required to support the committee in gathering, compiling and analyzing the data, and in determining a clinical cause of death. This cost is expected to be minimal and would be absorbed within the budget.
