Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

This bill adds section 59-112-25 to require that a dependent child who is a United States citizen may not be denied in-state tuition, state-sponsored tuition assistance, and scholarships if the dependent meets the domicile requirements of Section 59-112-20. The bill proposes higher education institutions to strongly construe in favor of finding domicile status for the dependent.
