Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund or Federal Funds. There will be an expenditure impact on Other Funds; however, license, inspection, and examination fee revenues retained by the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation will offset any necessary expenditures.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

This bill authorizes the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR) to regulate the practice and teaching of electrology and creates a five member advisory Electrology Licensure Committee. The bill specifies licensing requirements, penalties for violations, and procedures for appeals. The bill authorizes the department to charge permit application, inspection, and examination fees.

LLR estimates that any expenditures associated with the additional regulatory requirements would be minimal and the fees authorized by the bill should be sufficient to offset the expenditures. The Electrology Licensure Committee is authorized to establish licensing, renewal, examination, and inspection fees for a period of eighteen months after the effective date of this act, during which time LLR must promulgate regulations to permanently provide for the fees. There would be no expenditure impact on the General Fund or Federal Funds.
