There will be minimal costs to Other Funds that can be absorbed by the Department of Motor Vehicles. There will be costs to the General Fund for the Judiciary Department to reprogram their system. There will be no costs to Federal Funds.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

This bill prohibits any state agency, board, commission, institution, department, or other state entity that hosts, supports or provides a link to a webpage from displaying the full birthday and home address of a person who has committed a traffic offense.

The Department of Motor Vehicles. The Department expects a minimal impact, some additional costs are expected, but can be absorbed. They expect Information Technology recoding costs to be between \$25,000 - \$50,000 dollars. This will be absorbed by their Other Funds.

The Judicial Department. The Judicial Department expects a cost to the General Fund for their technology staff to alter computer programs to conform to this bill, but the cost is currently unknown. Other and Federal Funds will not be impacted.
