Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

Senate Bill 0303 amends Section 40-43-86(B)(4)(b) and Section 40-43-130(G)(1) relating to the oversight and certification training of pharmacy technicians. The bill deletes the sentence that allows uncertified pharmacy technicians to work under a pharmacist's supervision. The bill also allows the ten hours of continuing education coursework to be completed using a combination of lectures, seminars, workshops, and adds "online courses."

The Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation reports that this bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

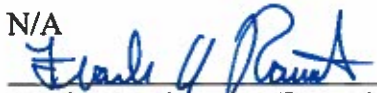
