Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 12, 2017 State Expenditure

This bill requires the Director of the Division of Veterans' Affairs to be a veteran who served in the active military, naval, or air service, and was not dishonorably discharged or released from that service. This bill requires further that county veteran's affairs officers must be a qualified veteran, who served on active duty for a period of more than 24 months and was honorably discharged, or was discharged because of a service-connected disability, if they served less than 24 months.

Department of Administration. The department indicates this bill will not have any expenditure impact on the General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds, as the current Director of the Division of Veterans' Affairs is a veteran.
