## **Explanation of Fiscal Impact**

### Introduced February 22, 2017 State Expenditure

The Department of Health and Environmental Control is currently required to report any changes made to the schedules listing controlled substances to the Chairmen of the Medical Affairs Committee and the Judiciary Committee of the Senate, the Medical, Military, Public and Municipal Affairs Committee, and the Judiciary Committee of the House of Representatives, and to the Clerks of the Senate and House. This bill requires the department to also notify the Code Commissioner of any changes to these schedules.

**Department of Health and Environmental Control**. The department reports that this bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds, as the department already has procedures in place to notify the required State officials of any changes.
