Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill allows private school students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs), 504 plans, or Individual Services Plans (ISPs) to participate in school district interscholastic activities. While the bill will allow more students the opportunity to participate in interscholastic activities, the State Department of Education (Department) anticipates that school districts can manage these activities within their existing budgets. Therefore, the bill does not have an expenditure impact on local governments or the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on April 26, 2017

State Expenditure

This bill allows private school students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs), 504 plans, or Individual Services Plan (ISPs) to participate in school district interscholastic activities, provided that student meets eligibility criteria. These students will be treated in a similar manner to charter school students, for whom school districts have already established procedures for participation.

State Department of Education. This bill expands upon previously established school district procedures. The Department will not be required to assist the local school districts with developing new procedures or implementing new systems. Therefore, the bill does not have an expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds of the Department.
