Fiscal Impact Summary

This amended bill would have no impact on the General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds as the bill requires any expenses to be paid from the funds appropriated to the Election Commision.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Amended by House Judiciary Special Laws Sub-Committee on April 25, 2018 State Expenditure

This amended bill requires the State Election Commission to perform a statewide advisory referendum at the same time as the 2018 general election. The referendum would address the question as to whether the state should no longer observe the current daylight savings model. Ballots must be provided that include two questions on whether a voter wishes for the state to maintain year round daylight savings times. The cost of the referendum must be paid from funds appropriated to the Election Commission and the results of the referendum are advisory only. The Election Commission anticipates a minimum impact to perform the statewide advisory referendum as creating ballots is a part of its normal business. Because the bill requires the costs to be paid from funds appropriated, there is no impact to the General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds.
