**Fiscal Impact Summary**

This bill, which modifies the procedures of the Administrative Law Court, will have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds, since the bill does not affect the number of hearings or materially impact the proceedings of the court.

**Explanation of Fiscal Impact**

**Introduced on January 10, 2017**

**State Expenditure**

This bill pertains to hearings and proceedings of the Administrative Law Court and allows that a request for a contested case hearing stay an agency order for thirty days. This bill also provides that once a contested case is initiated a party may request injunctive relief from the Administrative Law Judge, and further provides that any injunction ordered by the Court requires posting of sufficient bond or security to cover a good faith estimate of the cost and expense of the litigation and project delay.

**Administrative Law Court.** The Administrative Law Court indicates that there will be no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds, since the bill does not affect the number of hearings or materially impact the proceedings of the court.
