Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds. The bill clarifies language in the Pollution Control Act regarding the filing of legal action against alleged violators.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

This bill clarifies that, on or after June 6, 2012, the South Carolina Pollution Control Act (act) does not create rights allowing a private party to bring a lawsuit or administrative action based on a violation of the act, except as provided in Section 48-1-90(A)(4). Section 48-1-90(A)(4) allows a person to petition the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) for a declaratory ruling as to the applicability of a specific, existing regulatory program to an emission or proposed emission into the environment. The bill clarifies further that a person aggrieved by DHEC's declaratory ruling may not obtain judicial review if review of the decision could have been obtained pursuant to Section 48-1-90(A)(4) but was not. The bill also provides departments, agencies, boards, commissions, and political subdivisions of the state are not required to petition DHEC before undertaking an action for violation of the Pollution Control Act.

Department of Health and Environmental Control. The bill does not require additional activity or resources from the department. Therefore, the bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

Judicial Department. The department reports that as this bill represents a clarification of existing practice, it is anticipated that this bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

Administrative Law Court. The agency indicates that this bill would have no expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds. The bill clarifies who must first petition the Department of Health and Environmental Control before attempting to file a lawsuit under the Pollution Control Act.
