## **Fiscal Impact Summary**

This bill will have no expenditure impact on the Department of Transportation's or the Department of Natural Resources' General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds. The Department of Transportation and the Department of Natural Resources can absorb the administrative costs associated with transferring and receiving the funds within existing appropriations.

## **Explanation of Fiscal Impact**

## **Introduced on January 24, 2019 State Expenditure**

This bill stipulates that the Department of Transportation will transfer \$74,762.03 in remaining funds from the \$150,000 appropriation for the Sandy Island Boat Ramp in Georgetown County to the Department of Natural Resources. Once transferred, the Department of Natural Resources will credit the funds to Georgetown County's water recreational resource fund.

**Department of Transportation.** The Department of Transportation indicates that the activities required by this bill will be conducted in the normal course of agency business. As a result, this bill does not have an expenditure impact on the General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds.

**Department of Natural Resources.** The Department of Natural Resources can absorb the administrative costs associated with receiving the funds within existing appropriations. Therefore, the bill will not have an expenditure impact on the department's General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds.
