## State Expenditure

This bill establishes the Division of Veterans Affairs within the executive branch of government, and stipulates that the Director of the Division must be appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the General Assembly. The bill enumerates the division's and division director's specific powers and duties. In addition, the bill revises the definition of veteran and adds qualifications for veteran county affairs officers.

Department of Administration. The Department of Administration can absorb the administrative costs associated with transferring the division within existing appropriations. Therefore, the bill will not have an expenditure impact on the department's General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds.

Governor's Office. This bill does not fiscally impact the Governor's Office, as the agency can absorb the administrative costs associated with transferring the division within existing appropriations. Therefore, the bill will not have an expenditure impact on the department's General Fund, Other Funds, or Federal Funds.
