Introduced on January 30, 2019 State Expenditure

This bill allows a pharmacist to exercise his professional judgment to dispense a limited quantity of a maintenance medication upon refill. The bill does not apply to any medications for which a report is required under the prescription monitoring program. LLR reports that this bill does not alter the duties of the Board of Pharmacy, LLR's regulatory body for pharmacists. Therefore, this bill will have no expenditure impact on LLR.
