State Expenditure

This bill shifts the residency requirement for one member of Renewable Water Resources (REWA) from Spartanburg County to Greenville County. Currently, REWA consists of ten members, one from Anderson, two from Spartanburg, and seven from Greenville. This bill changes the make-up to one member from Anderson, eight members from Greenville, and one member from Spartanburg. REWA does not operate using any state or local funds. Therefore, any potential change in cost due to the shift of the residency of membership will have no fiscal impact for state agencies or local governments.
