This bill will have no expenditure impact on the Other Funds of the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR) because it does not materially alter the regulatory or administrative duties of the agency or its boards.

Introduced on February 9, 2021

State Expenditure

This bill authorizes a mobile optometry unit to operate on the site of a Title I public school for the purposes of providing services for the students attending the school. Currently, the use of mobile optometry units is limited to visiting licensed health care facilities within the state. Mobile optometry units are registered by the Board of Examiners in Optometry, which is under the regulation of LLR. LLR indicates that this bill does not create any new license category or licensure requirement. Therefore, this bill will have no expenditure impact on LLR or the board.
