Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill establishes a Transfer on Death (TOD) designation for titles or registrations related to vehicles, mobile homes, watercraft, outboard motors, and any similar personal property to allow individuals to specify a beneficiary in the event of their death. The bill will not have an expenditure impact on the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), as they are implementing a new titling and licensing system that will fulfill the requirements enumerated in this bill. There will also be no expenditure impact on the Department of Motor Vehicles because the agency will manage technological changes to its system within its existing resources.

The fee to establish, modify or revoke a TOD for a vehicle, mobile home, or other similar personal property titled by DMV is \$15. The fee to establish, modify or revoke a TOD for a watercraft, outboard motor, or other similar personal property titled by DNR is \$10. This bill may generate additional revenue from individuals opting to establish, modify, or revoke a TOD. However, due to the permissive nature of the bill, the revenue impact on the agencies is undetermined.

This impact has been updated to include a response from the Department of Natural Resources.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Updated for Additional Agency Response Introduced on February 23, 2021 State Expenditure

This bill permits an owner of a vehicle, mobile home, watercraft, outboard motor, or any similar personal property for which legal titles are issued and administered by DMV or DNR to establish a TOD designation upon any such title or registration.

Department of Motor Vehicles. DMV indicates that any expenditures related to technological changes to their system will be managed with the agency's existing resources. Therefore, there is no expenditure impact to DMV.

Department of Natural Resources. DNR is currently in the process of developing a new titling and licensing system and the department anticipates the TOD designation will be built into this system. The system is currently planned to be implemented March 2022. As DNR's new system will accommodate the requirements enumerated in this bill, there will be no expenditure impact to the agency.

State Revenue

Department of Motor Vehicles. This bill establishes a TOD designation for titles or registrations related to vehicles, mobile homes, and any similar personal property to allow individuals to specify a beneficiary in the event of their death. The fee to establish, modify or revoke a TOD for a vehicle or mobile home is \$15.
