Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill removes the requirement that an applicant for licensure as an anesthesiologist's assistant must appear with his or her sponsoring anesthesiologist before a member of the Board of Medical Examiners (board) or his designee and present evidence of academic credentials and knowledge. The bill additionally provides that an anesthesiologist may supervise up to four assistants instead of two at any one time. This bill will have no fiscal impact on the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR) as it does not materially impact the operations of the agency or the board.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on April 22, 2021 State Expenditure

This bill removes the requirement that an applicant for licensure as an anesthesiologist's assistant must appear with his or her sponsoring anesthesiologist before a member of the board or his designee and present evidence of academic credentials and knowledge.
