## **Fiscal Impact Summary**

This bill will have no expenditure impact on the South Carolina Public Service Commission (PSC) nor on the South Carolina Office of Regulatory Staff (ORS), as both agencies anticipate that suspending any rate change proceedings due to a declaration of a state of emergency can be managed with existing staff and within existing appropriations.

### **Explanation of Fiscal Impact**

### Introduced on January 12, 2021 **State Expenditure**

This bill requires PSC to temporarily suspend the rate change process for any public utility during a state of emergency. If the process to change a public utility's rates was initiated prior to a state of emergency declaration and suspended pursuant to this bill, once the rate change is granted the new rates may not go into effect until one year after the expiration of the declared state of emergency.

PSC is responsible for hearings and rulings on proceedings brought by public utilities for changes to customers' rates. PSC indicates that the provisions of this bill will not have an expenditure impact on the agency, as it anticipates being able to manage any additional responsibilities with existing staff and within existing appropriations.

Additionally, ORS is an automatic party to all public utility rate change proceedings brought before PSC. ORS indicates that the provisions of this bill will not have an expenditure impact on the agency, as it anticipates being able to manage any additional responsibilities with existing staff and within existing appropriations.
