Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill exempts diabetes screening facilities from the Certificate of Need (CON) review process. The Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) administers the CON program and may charge application, filling, and issuance fees. The department reports that no CON applications have been received from diabetes screening facilities since 2019. Therefore, the agency expects no revenue impact from the bill.

The first \$750,000 in fee revenue is deposited into the General Fund, and any amount over \$750,000 is retained by DHEC to defer administrative costs of the CON program. The department reports that no CON applications have been received from diabetes screening facilities since 2019. Therefore, the agency expects no revenue impact from the bill.
