Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill requires the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) to promulgate regulations that establish voluntary minimum standards for mold remediation companies that operate in the state. DHEC shall also approve preferred training courses and certifications for mold remediators and must publish a list of certified mold remediators on its website. Since DHEC is still reviewing the bill, the expenditure impact is pending.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 10, 2023 State Expenditure

This bill requires DHEC to promulgate regulations that establish voluntary minimum standards for mold remediation companies that operate in the state. DHEC shall also approve preferred training courses and certifications for mold remediators. Any mold remediator who passes a preferred course or receives a preferred certification is eligible to appear on DHEC's list of certified mold remediators, which must be published on the agency's website. Since DHEC is still reviewing the bill, the expenditure impact is pending.
