Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill extends open season of antlered deer for archery and firearm equipment hunters in Game Zones 1 and 2 through January 15. Currently, open season of antlered deer for hunters using archery equipment and firearms in Game Zones 1 and 2 is October 11 through January 1.

This bill will have no expenditure impact on the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) since the provisions of the bill can be managed within the normal course of agency business.
