Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill requires a person who holds a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit, which allows the discharge of effluent into state waters, to post a conspicuous and legible sign containing certain information about the permit, permittee, facility, and specification between "Treated Wastewater" or "Cooling Water," as appropriate. Certain circumstances allow the permittee to apply to the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) for a waiver instead of posting the sign. The bill also requires DHEC to notify all NPDES permit holders registered with the department of the new requirement no later November 29, 2024. There is no expenditure impact to DHEC because the department expects that it can manage the requirements of the bill with existing staff and resources.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 25, 2024 State Expenditure

This bill requires a person who holds a NPDES permit, which allows the discharge of effluent into state waters, to post a conspicuous and legible sign containing certain information about the permit, permittee, facility, and specification between "Treated Wastewater" or "Cooling Water," as appropriate. Certain circumstances allow the permittee to apply to DHEC for a waiver instead of posting the sign. DHEC expects to be able to manage the requirements of the bill with existing staff and resources. Therefore, there is no expenditure impact to DHEC.
