### **Fiscal Impact Summary**

This bill specifies that students who become eligible for the LIFE Scholarship may not subsequently become ineligible for retention of the scholarship based on a grade in a dual enrollment class.

This bill will have no expenditure impact on the Commission on Higher Education (CHE) or the State Board for Technical and Comprehensive Education (Tech Board), as compliance with this specification will be managed using existing resources.

This bill will have an undetermined impact on LIFE Scholarship disbursements, depending upon the frequency that currently eligible students become ineligible due to a grade in a dual enrollment class. According to CHE, there were 6,970 students taking dual enrollment courses at non-technical colleges in the Fall of 2022. We have requested dual enrollment information for state technical colleges from the Tech Board and will update this impact statement when the information is available.

### **Explanation of Fiscal Impact**

#### **Introduced on January 10, 2023**

##### **State Expenditure**

This bill specifies that students who become eligible for the LIFE Scholarship may not subsequently become ineligible for retention of the scholarship based on a grade in a dual enrollment class. CHE and the Tech Board indicate that this is not expected to have an expenditure impact on the agencies, as compliance with this specification will be managed using existing resources.

This bill may impact LIFE Scholarship disbursements, depending upon the frequency that currently eligible students become ineligible due to a grade in a dual enrollment class. According to CHE, there were 6,970 students taking dual enrollment courses at non-technical colleges in the Fall of 2022. It is unknown how many of these students that were previously eligible for the LIFE Scholarship would become ineligible due to a grade in a dual enrollment course, and therefore, the impact on LIFE Scholarship disbursements is unknown. We have

requested dual enrollment information for state technical colleges from the Tech Board and will update this impact statement when the information is available.
