Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill reduces the number of board members on the Board of Trustees for the Veterans' Trust Fund (VTF) of South Carolina from nineteen to eleven voting members. Secondly, this bill adds that the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, shall appoint the board and outlines the requirements for those appointees. This bill also establishes a four-year term and conditions that no member may serve the greater of two consecutive terms or eight continuous years.

The Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) is responsible for administering assistance to the Board of Trustees for the VTF. Currently DVA's budget does not include any funding for the VTF. Therefore, there will be no expenditure impact to the DVA.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 10, 2023 State Expenditure

This bill reduces the number of board members on the Board of Trustees for the VTF of South Carolina from nineteen to eleven voting members. Secondly, this bill adds that the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, shall appoint the board and outlines the requirements for those appointees, to include that at least four members must be honorably discharged US Armed Forces veterans. This bill also establishes a four-year term and conditions that no member may serve the greater of two consecutive terms or eight continuous years.

The Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) is responsible for administering assistance to the Board of Trustees for the VTF. Currently DVA's budget does not include any funding for the VTF. Therefore, there will be no expenditure impact to the DVA.
