Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill removes the restriction that a qualified retired law enforcement officer may not carry a concealable weapon into a residence or dwelling place of another person unless the officer has express permission.

Revenue and Fiscal Affairs (RFA) surveyed state and local agencies that employ law enforcement officers, as well as the Municipal Association of South Carolina (MASC). All responding entities indicated this bill will have no fiscal impact.
